REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Laurel Glen Park Wall Mural – Outdoor Public Artwork

The City of Tustin Public Art Committee, in cooperation with the City of Tustin Parks and Recreation Department, seeks artists to submit proposals for an outdoor public art project at Laurel Glen Park, 13301 Myford Road, Tustin, California 92782. The specific project location is the wall on the North-East side of the restroom building facing the corner of Myford Road and Heritage Way. The project will be funded by the City of Tustin Public Art Committee. The Committee seeks to commission an experienced and competent artist to complete the work. However, new and aspiring artists are encouraged to submit proposals.

Project Summary: The current project being commissioned is a mural on an outside wall of the restroom building at Laurel Glen Park. The approximate area to be painted is 7' x 18.5'. The total cost of the completed wall mural is not to exceed \$7,500, including artist's materials. Photos of the project wall are attached as Exhibit A.

Project Description: The Laurel Glen Park Wall Mural Public Art Project medium is open. The use of color and imagery, literal and abstract, which enhances and inspires Laurel Glen Park as a destination experience, will be given preference. All proposals to be considered should be family friendly.

Artists must submit a resume, images of their previous work, and a color rendering of the proposed design and palette of the wall mural. The process to select and award an artist the project will include a review and evaluation of proposals by the City of Tustin Public Art Committee comprised of community members appointed by the City Council. Final approval will be made by the Tustin City Council. The selected artist will be required to sign a project agreement which will include a provision waiving the artist's rights to the Visual Artists Rights Act and California Artists Preservation Act. The completed project shall be the sole property of the City of Tustin.

Dimensions and Surface: The designated area to receive the artwork is a 8.5' x 18.5' rough stucco wall. The artist must clean, prepare, paint/tile, and seal approximately 130 square feet of the available wall space.

It is recommended that interested artists physically visit and view the site before submitting proposals.

Eligibility: The project is open to all Orange County and Southern California artists, age 16 and over, regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, gender, age, military status, sexual orientation, marital status, or physical or mental disability.

Timeline: Following the close of the submission deadline all proposals will be reviewed and evaluated by the Public Art Committee no later than Wednesday, April 15, 2020. The preferred artist will be notified by the Committee within 30 days following review. Upon final approval by the Tustin City Council on June 3, 2020, the artist will prepare and fully complete artwork no later than June 27, 2020. The project schedule is to be determined.

In addition to the color rendering of the proposed wall mural, interested artists must submit a resume of no more than two (2) pages and representations of five to ten images of previous works.

All materials submitted by the artist should be labeled with your last name, the date, and an arrow indicating the top of the work. Do not submit any original work or bulky binders or portfolios. Submissions should be emailed or submitted on a flash drive, disc, or similar. Submissions will not be returned.
