Synopsis:

While officers were investigating a subject disturbance, the suspect involved in the disturbance was seen driving in the immediate area. Officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but the suspect attempted to flee the scene subsequently resulting in an officer involved shooting. The suspect was arrested and later booked into Orange County Jail.

Narrative:

On 03-02-14 at approximately 1801 hours I responded to the intersection of Carfax Drive and Scherer Place in reference to an officer involved shooting.

Prior to my arrival several TPD Officers had the scene contained and the suspect (later identified as Nicolas Barraza Vizcarra) detained. Refer to CAD call printout for all responding officers.

At approximately 1819 hours, I arrived on scene with PSO Camacho #1250 and I observed Nicolas Vizcarra sitting upright in handcuffs being medically treated by Orange County Fire Authority.

Vizcarra was wearing a black pair of shorts, white tank top and a blue jacket (all of his clothing was later collected as evidence and booked into TPD). I did not hear Vizcarra make any pertinent comments about the incident.

Officers Wright and Ramirez assisted with the detention of Vizcarra. Both Officers completed supplemental reports regarding their involvement and statements made by Vizcarra, see their supplemental reports for more information.

I took initial photographs of the scene and Officer Gleason later uploaded them for me to the TPD server for preservation. Officer Gleason completed a supplemental report regarding his involvement with this case, see his report for more information.

Sergeant Taylor was the supervisor on scene and assigned me as the handling officer of the case.

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Officers contained the scene using yellow police barrier tape as Officers Cossack and Schaller maintained a Crime Scene Log at the scene.

I assigned PSO Camacho to take photographs of the scene and surrounding area. See Camacho's supplemental report for more information.

Nicolas Vizcarra was transported to Western Medical Center by Doctor's ambulance for a medical evaluation prior to formal booking. Due to the fact Vizcarra was under arrest, Officer Gleason rode inside the ambulance with Vizcarra.

Officer Gleason was later relieved by Detective Miali who transported Vizcarra back to TPD where Detective Nguyen took custody of Vizcarra. Refer to Detective Nguyen's report for further information.

At the conclusion of Detective Nguyen's investigation, Vizcarra was transported to OC Jail by Officers Stroud and Newton. Vizcarra was booked for the following charges:

- CPC 245(c) - Assault with a deadly weapon, Peace Officer
- CPC 2800.2(a) - Evading a Peace Officer
- CPC 273a(a) - Child Endangerment
- CPC 29815(a) - Access to Firearm - Probation Restriction

Sergeant Coe established a command post nearby as Sergeant Havourd notified the area commander.

At approximately 1930 hours, I canvassed the area and attempted to locate a witness.

At approximately 1930 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated he was inside his residence located at [REDACTED] and heard several gunshots, but did not see anything. He later walked outside and saw police officers beginning to block off the scene.

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At approximately 1940 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated he was inside his residence located at [REDACTED] and heard several gunshots, but did not see anything. He later walked outside and saw police officers beginning to block off the scene.

At approximately 1950 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated he was inside his residence located at [REDACTED] and heard several gunshots, but did not see anything. He later walked outside and saw police officers beginning to block off the scene.

At approximately 2000 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated she was inside her residence located at [REDACTED] and heard several gunshots, but did not see anything. She later walked outside and saw police officers beginning to block off the scene.

At approximately 2010 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated she was inside her residence located at [REDACTED] and heard several gunshots, but did not see anything. She later walked outside and saw police officers beginning to block off the scene.

At approximately 2020 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who told me she was walking from her car which was parked directly in front of 1192 Scherer Pl. She walked eastbound across Carfax Dr towards 14562 Carfax Dr. As she began walking northbound on the east sidewalk of Carfax Dr, she heard a vehicle's tire screeching and turned around. She saw a gold color SUV driving on the sidewalk and grass area on the southwest corner of Carfax Dr and Scherer Pl. She saw the vehicle turn westbound and stay on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl. She heard several gunshots and saw the gold colored SUV come to a stop in the middle of Scherer as she began to run eastbound into the nearby apartment homes. She stated she did not see anything else.

At approximately 2100 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated she was inside her daughter's vehicle about to drive southbound on Carfax Dr north of Scherer. She heard several gunshots and immediately saw police officers arriving at the scene. [REDACTED] stated she did not see anything.

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At approximately 2110 hours, I spoke with [REDACTED] who stated he was inside his residence located at [REDACTED] and heard several gunshots, but did not see anything. He later walked outside and saw police officers beginning to block off the scene.

The Orange County Crime Scene Lab later arrived on scene and began processing the scene for evidence.

PSO Supervisor Grover #991 and PSO Aguilar #1226 also collected evidence at the scene and later booked the evidence into TPD. See their supplemental reports for more details.

The 2004 gold Cadillac Escalade that Vizcarra was driving during the incident was later towed from the scene by Archie's Towing and transported to the Orange County Crime Lab to be held as evidence.

At approximately 0201 hours the initial investigation was complete and the scene was opened.

I request this report be forwarded to Investigations for review.

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SYNOPSIS

Responded to a call of shots fired within a residence. Arrived and the male suspect had fled the scene with the firearm. No subjects within the residence were harmed. While conducting the investigation the suspect returned to the scene. Ultimately an Officer Involved Shooting occurred.

NARRATIVE

On 03/02/14, at approximately 1624 hours, I was working uniformed patrol in a marked police vehicle (823). I was dispatched to 1142 Scherer Pl [REDACTED] Tustin. This was in response to shots fired within a residence. Dispatched advised a male subject entered the residence, pulled out a gun and fired the weapon. Sergeant Taylor #1062, Sergeant Havourd #710, Officer Gonzalez #1231, Officer Muro #1156, and Officer Gleason #1223 were dispatched to assist. I arrived on scene and contacted [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] told me she was inside the residence when the suspect fired the weapon. I spoke to her about what occurred.

[REDACTED] told me she was inside the kitchen of the residence with two children, and her sister in law when Nicolas Vizcarra (DOB [REDACTED]) entered the residence and walked into the kitchen. Vizcarra placed a "black box" on the kitchen counter and began talking to the two children. [REDACTED] told me Vizcarra was acting aggressive and talking loudly. He opened the box and revealed a "black gun". [REDACTED] did not know what kind of gun was inside the box. She could not tell me if it was a revolver, or a semi-automatic pistol.

Vizcarra removed the gun from the box and walked over to [REDACTED]. He told [REDACTED] "Now you're the man of the house". He pointed the gun out toward the rear patio of the residence and fired the gun. [REDACTED] began screaming and ran to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED], [REDACTED], the other child, and [REDACTED]' sister in law all huddled together in the kitchen.

Vizcarra walked to the box and placed the gun inside. He then exited the front door of the residence. [REDACTED] did not know if Vizcarra fled the residence on foot or in a vehicle. She stated he may have left in a Cadillac Escalade (CA LIC# [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] called TPD Dispatch to report the crime.

[REDACTED] gave me consent to search the residence. She advised me she saw a "bullet" fall out of the gun and land outside the kitchen door. Sergeant Taylor, Officer Muro, and I searched the residence for the firearm, the "bullet", and Vizcarra.

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During the search, I located a bullet shell casing outside the threshold of the rear sliding glass door. The rear patio of the residence was crowded with trash and tools. The concrete on the patio was wet from recent rain. It had leaves, trash, and mud covering it. There were cobwebs near the frame of the sliding glass door.

The bullet shell casing was a freshly discharged bullet shell casing. It was not wet from recent rain, nor did it have any mud or cobwebs covering it. There were no leaves, or trash surrounding the bullet shell casing. The bullet shell casing came from a .40 caliber bullet.

Approximately five feet from the location of the bullet shell casing, we located a hole in the wooden fence surrounding the patio. The fence is a dark weathered brown color. The fence was wet from recent rain. The hole in the wooden fence was a light tan color. The same color as freshly cut wood. The wood surrounding the hole in the fence was freshly splintered.

The other responding Officers continued to conduct an area check for Vizcarra.

Officer Gonzalez and Officer Muro took photos of the bullet shell casing and hole in the fence. They later uploaded the photos into the TPD system.

They then collected the bullet shell casing as evidence and later booked it into TPD property.

Officer Gonzalez made contact with [REDACTED]' sister in law and the children. They refused to speak with Officer Gonzalez. They told him they were too terrified after the shooting to speak.

As Officer Gonzalez finished his conversation, Officer Gleason advised, via radio, Vizcarra was driving northbound on Carfax Dr toward the residence in the Cadillac Escalade. We attempted to contact Vizcarra and ultimately an Officer Involved Shooting occurred.

NARRATIVE: On 3/2/14, at approximately 1624 hours, I was on routine patrol in a marked TPD black and white police unit (#817). I responded to 1142 Scherer Pl Apartment [REDACTED] in reference to a disturbance. The reporting party, [REDACTED] advised her son in law, Nicholas Vizcarra, discharged a handgun inside the residence and then left while still in possession of it. From a previous contact with Vizcarra, I knew he was on formal probation and he was also due to turn himself in to jail on an unrelated case in April. This was my second response to the residence on 3/2/14. During the first incident, which occurred about 0750 hours, Vizcarra's [REDACTED] called TPD and advised he was acting strangely. There was no crime alleged and Vizcarra left prior to our arrival. He was described during that call as a heavy set male Hispanic wearing a white "muscle shirt" and black shorts. I assisted in conducting an area check for Vizcarra but I was unable to locate him. It should be noted, after entering Vizcarra's room, I smelled the heavy smell of marijuana inside. I did not look for any marijuana or related paraphernalia. Additionally, I noticed Vizcarra had a surveillance system with a single exterior camera facing the street. The camera connected to a television in his room.

After arriving on scene shortly after the call was dispatched, I was directed to remain on Carfax Dr in case Vizcarra returned. Carfax Dr runs north to south from Sycamore Av to Scherer Pl. I positioned myself facing N/B on Carfax Dr south of Sycamore Av in order to see all traffic at the intersection. After TPD's initial response, it was determined Vizcarra had fled in a black Cadillac Escalade with a license plate of [REDACTED]. Additionally, Officer Del Merari advised over the radio he located a spent .40 caliber shell casing at the residence. It should be noted the vehicle Vizcarra was driving was described as black by his [REDACTED]. Later, it was found to be silver.

While waiting for Vizcarra to return, I was aware of the following factors:

- He was on formal probation, and a prior convicted felon.
- He most likely was in possession of a handgun which he previously discharged.
- He was driving a "black" Cadillac Escalade with a plate of [REDACTED] (registered to his [REDACTED]).

Later, at approximately 1801 hours, I saw a newer model silver Cadillac Escalade make a N/B turn onto Carfax Dr from Sycamore Ave. After it completed the N/B turn, I noticed the license plate matched the one provided by TPD dispatch [REDACTED]. I immediately began to follow the vehicle as I advised other TPD units of my activity. At this point, I had not initiated a stop of the vehicle. As the distance between my vehicle and the Escalade closed, I caught a glimpse of Vizcarra's face in the front driver side mirror. It appeared he was looking in my

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direction. I could not see what he was wearing and it appeared his window was up. Shortly after, the vehicle stopped in the middle of Carfax Dr, south of Scherer Pl. I immediately activated my overhead emergency lights, which include a solid red forward facing light, to initiate a felony car stop. I did this because I wanted to provide him with a visual identifier that the police wanted him to stop. I also feared Vizcarra could possibly engage me with gunfire or flee on foot, and the lights would hide my exact location. As I exited my vehicle, I noticed Vizcarra had turned on his left blinker and he slowly began to make a left hand turn into a driveway. At this time, there was another unknown vehicle driving S/B Carfax Dr. The vehicle was passing me as Vizcarra began making his left turn. I re-entered my vehicle and began to drive forward in order to block Vizcarra's exit if he backed up. I also wanted to close the gap between our vehicles since there would have been a significant distance between them if he parked in the driveway. After entering my vehicle, I was immediately unable to locate Vizcarra's vehicle and Vizcarra himself. I attribute this to his avenue of escape being partially obscured by the "A-Pillar" of my vehicle and other parked vehicles. I immediately drove in the only possible direction he could have gone, which was towards Scherer Pl.

As I was making the left (W/B) turn onto Scherer Pl, I heard what sounded like several gunshots. Initially, I did not know if they came from other TPD officers, or Vizcarra. I then observed Officers Del Merari and Gonzalez facing Vizcarra's car with their guns pointed in his (Vizcarra's) direction. Simultaneously, I heard the radio broadcast of "shots fired." Vizcarra's car was oriented in a N/W direction against a row of parked cars along the north curb line of Scherer Pl. A TPD police unit was oriented facing E/B against the driver side of Vizcarra's car. I immediately provided assistance to Officers Del Merari and Gonzalez.

After arriving at the scene, I saw Vizcarra sitting in the driver seat with his hands up. I noticed the rear driver side window was shattered, but upon initial observation it looked like Vizcarra was not injured. I did not see him verbally communicating with TPD officers. I looked in the rear of the car and I did not see any other passengers.

A short time later, Officers Wright and Ramirez assisted with removing Vizcarra from the vehicle. Due to the positioning of his vehicle, he had to exit through the front passenger side. After he exited the vehicle, he was placed in handcuffs. No further use of force occurred while taking him into custody. I immediately noticed a blue bandana wrapped around his right leg, just under his knee. I also noticed what appeared to be a piece of clear plastic tied around his leg, directly above the bandana. When asked, Vizcarra stated the bandana and plastic were a result of him being shot twice earlier in the day. Upon initial observation, it did not appear Vizcarra was injured as a result of TPD nor did it appear he was struck

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with any bullets from the prior officer involved shooting. OCFA was called to render medical aid to Vizcarra.

No custodial interrogation of Vizcarra regarding the incident took place at the scene by TPD officers. After the scene was rendered safe, I had Officer Carter take several preliminary photos with my camera. I also began recording using my digital audio recorder. It should be noted, for unknown reasons, my digital recorder stopped recording after approximately 15 minutes. I restarted it a short time later and kept recording until I left the hospital. The recording was later uploaded to a disc and booked as evidence. I later uploaded the photos to the TPD photo server under Officer Carter's name. I was designated by Sgt. Taylor to ride with Vizcarra in the ambulance to Western Medical Center. Prior to doing so, all his clothing was cut off and placed into two separate bags. I left his jacket and white tank top with Officer Carter. His shorts, underwear and shoes were retained by me since they were removed inside the ambulance. The bandana and plastic were left on his leg for the duration of the ambulance ride.

Once at the hospital, medical personnel asked Vizcarra what happened to his leg. He stated he was shot three times by TPD with a "9mm." He did not provide any further statements regarding the incident. The bandana and plastic were removed from his leg wound and placed into the bag with the rest of his clothing. I was relieved a short time later by Detective Miali. I retained the clothing, bandage and plastic and returned to the scene. At that time, I was directed by Sgt. Coe to turn over the items in my possession to PSO Camacho. I did not conduct any further investigation.

For further details, refer to Officer Carter's original report.

Officer A. Gleason #1223

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NARRATIVE: On Saturday, March 2, 2014, at approximately 1625 hours, I responded to 1142 Scherer PL ■■■ for a radio call of a Subject Disturbance. Ofcr. Gonzalez #1231 and Ofcr. Del Merari #1227 were primary on the call.

Suspect Nicolas Vizcarra, had fired one round from a pistol while inside his residence. Vizcarra then fled the scene with the firearm.

Upon arriving I was advised to take a position on the outer perimeter. I positioned myself at Sycamore/School with Ofcr. Wright #1183. Information was broadcasted that Vizcarra was possibly driving a black Cadillac Escalade.

At approximately 1800 hours, Ofcr. Gleason #1223, broadcasted that he was following Vizcarra N/B Carfax approaching Scherer. Ofcr. Gleason then requested units for a high risk traffic stop. Ofcr. Wright and I responded from the location we were staged at. While driving N/B Carfax approaching Scherer it was broadcasted that a shooting had occurred. As I turned on to Scherer, I observed Vizcarra's vehicle stopped in the middle of the street.

I approached the vehicle and observed Vizcarra in the driver seat, he was holding both of his hands up in the air. Officers were giving Vizcarra commands to exit the vehicle. I observed that a marked unit had collided with Vizcarra's vehicle which prevented him from opening his driver side door. I advised the other officers of this and told them we would have to remove Vizcarra from the passenger side of his vehicle.

Ofcr. Wright and I approached the passenger side of the vehicle and Ofcr. Wright reached in through the passenger window and unlocked the door. I told Vizcarra to crawl over the seat and exit the vehicle. Vizcarra looked at me and stated "I'm hurt. I'm hurt." Ofcr. Wright told Vizcarra to exit the vehicle and keep his hands where we could see them. Vizcarra began to crawl over the seat towards us. At this point, Ofcr. Wright grabbed Vizcarra's right arm and I grabbed his left arm. We pulled him from the vehicle and guided him to the ground.

While pulling out Vizcarra out of the vehicle I observed blood on his leg. His leg was bandaged with a blue piece of cloth and what appeared to be clear plastic. Vizcarra then stated he had shot himself earlier in the day.

Ofcr. Del Merari then came and handcuffed Vizcarra without further incident. First Aid was attempted and medics arrived shortly after. I did not notice any other injuries on Vizcarra.

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Narrative:

On Sunday March 03, 2014, at approximately 0749 hours, while working uniformed patrol, I was dispatched to 1142 Scherer regarding a family disturbance. When I arrived with TPD Officers Gleason and Nguyen I spoke to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told me her [REDACTED] Nicholas Vizcarro had been playing the music in their bedroom extremely loud, and she could smell the odor of burnt marijuana coming from the bedroom. [REDACTED] said she was concerned about his behavior because she had children in the house and she didn't think they should be around Nicholas when he was smoking marijuana. I asked [REDACTED] if Nicholas ever hit or struck her or her children and she said "No." I asked [REDACTED] if Nicholas ever threatened her or their children and she said "No."

[REDACTED] told Officers Nguyen and Gleason that Nicholas was in the master bedroom of the residence. Once Officers Nguyen and Gleason entered the master bedroom they shouted into the living room that Nicholas had left through the back sliding glass door of the residence. I heard as one of [REDACTED]'s children explained to Officers Nguyen and Gleason that Nicholas had watched us as we approached the residence via a surveillance camera he installed. This surveillance camera was positioned so it pointed towards the street and showed the approach of anyone walking toward the front of the residence. Officers Nguyen, Gleason and I conducted an area search for Nicholas both on foot and in our marked police units but we were unable to locate him.

I explained to [REDACTED] that because Nicholas didn't harm or threaten her or their children, no crime had been committed. [REDACTED] told me she had an uncle who lived near their residence, so I suggested she and children stay with her uncle if she didn't want to be at their residence when Nicholas returned. [REDACTED] agreed to stay at her uncle's residence with the children.

At approximately 1642 hours I heard TPD Dispatch, dispatch TPD Officers Gonzalez and Del Merari to 1142 Scherer [REDACTED] to a report of Nicholas displaying a semi-automatic handgun. I then informed TPD Dispatch I would be responding to the scene. As I was driving to the location TPD Dispatch advised Nicholas had discharged the handgun at the residence and fled on foot. I then took a perimeter position near the intersection of Sycamore Avenue and School Avenue with TPD Officer Ramirez. While maintaining the perimeter position it was determined Nicholas had fled the scene in a Cadillac Escalade (CA license [REDACTED])

At approximately 1801 hours Officer Gleason advised all units the Cadillac Escalade (CA license [REDACTED]) had driven by his unit. As Officer Gleason attempted to stop the vehicle as it traveled northbound on Carfax Avenue. Once Officer Gleason advised he was attempting to conduct a vehicle stop, Officer Ramirez and I responded to his location. As Officer Ramirez and I were

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approaching the intersection of Carfax Avenue and Scherer Avenue, Officer Gleason advised via his pacset that an officer involved shooting had just occurred. Do to vehicle damage on the driver side door of the Escalade officers were unable to remove Nicholas from the vehicle.

Officer Ramirez and I then opened the front passenger side door of the Escalade and order Nicholas out of the vehicle. As Nicholas was being placed on the ground and handcuffed I observed he had a blue piece of fabric tied around his right shin. As I was turning to ensure no one was in the back seat of the vehicle I heard Nicholas state he had shot himself in the leg.

I request this supplemental report be attached to Officer Carter's original report. Refer to Officer Carter's original report for further details regarding the crime.

I am currently employed as a sworn peace officer for the Tustin Police Department and am assigned to the Tustin Police Department's General Investigation - Major Crimes Unit. I am the assigned investigator for CR #14-01120.

INVESTIGATIVE NARRATIVE

On Sunday, 03/02/2014, at approximately 1810 hours, I received a telephone call from Investigations Sergeant R. Wright, #737, requesting I respond to the Tustin Police Department to assist with an officer involved shooting investigation. I arrived at the Tustin Police Department at approximately 1900 hours and proceeded to the area of the Bodega R Ranch Market (1112 Walnut Avenue, Tustin, CA 92780) where I attended a briefing of the incident.

During my investigation, I received a copy of suspect Nicolas Vizcarra's criminal history. I reviewed its contents and found Vizcarra had prior arrests for drug related violations, evading police officers, domestic violence, theft, brandishing an imitation firearm, and probation violations. Vizcarra also had convictions for the felony drug violations and was presently on probation with search and seizure. According to Vizcarra's terms of probation, he was prohibited from possessing any weapons.

During my investigation, I also learned the following:

On 03/02/2014, at approximately 0749 hours, Tustin Police Dispatch received a telephone call of a subject disturbance. The reporting party stated her [REDACTED], Nicolas Vizcarra was "acting strangely". The reporting party told Tustin PD Dispatch, "Please hurry", then disconnected. The dispatcher notations stated a male subject could be heard causing a disturbance in the background.

Officer S. Wright, Officer A. Gleason, and Officer D. Nguyen responded to 1142 Scherer and determined no crime had been committed and Vizcarra had already fled the scene prior to their arrival (**Incident #: 4TU0009458**). See attached Dispatch call log for further details.

On 03/02/2014, at approximately 1624 hours, Tustin Police Dispatch received a telephone call from "[REDACTED]". [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] Nicolas Vizcarra, gave his 8 year old child a loaded gun, fired the gun inside the residence, and possibly left the residence in a black Cadillac Escalade and in possession of the loaded gun (**Incident #: 4TU0009507**). Multiple officers responded to the scene to assist. See attached Dispatch call log and Officer R. Delmerari's narrative for further details.

Officers responded to the area and were initially unable to locate the subject. When Vizcarra returned to the area, Officer Gleason attempted to conduct a vehicle stop, but Vizcarra fled in his vehicle, across multiple residential sidewalk and lawns, northbound Carfax Avenue toward westbound Scherer Place (see Officer Gleason's report for further details). Vizcarra continued driving along the south sidewalk of Scherer Place

directly toward Officer Gonzalez, who was on foot, running eastbound Scherer Place along the south sidewalk.

According to a public safety statement Officer Gonzalez provided to Sergeant Taylor, Officer Gonzalez shot three times in an eastbound direction toward Vizcarra's oncoming vehicle. Officer Gonzalez's approximate position at the time of the shooting was on the side walk in front of 1182 Scherer Place. Officer Gonzalez feared he was in imminent danger of being struck by Vizcarra's vehicle due to the close proximity of the vehicle to Officer Gonzalez's location on the sidewalk and he discharged his duty firearm in an attempt to stop the oncoming threat.

After Vizcarra's vehicle veered off the sidewalk and came to a stop on Scherer Place, Officer R. DelMerari, Officer S. Wright, and Officer A. Ramirez assisted with contacting and removing the driver, Vizcarra, from the vehicle. Officers found Vizcarra with a blue cloth and a piece of plastic wrapped around a possible gunshot wound to his right leg. Orange County Fire Authority Paramedics responded to the scene to provide medical aid for Vizcarra. Officer Gleason accompanied the ambulance when it transported Vizcarra to the Western Medical Center, Santa Ana. I later assigned Detective Miali to respond to the Western Medical Center, Santa Ana, to relieve Officer Gleason and oversee Vizcarra's medical care and transport to the Tustin Police Department (see Detective Miali's report for further details).

On 03/02/2014, at approximately 2135 hours, members of the Tustin PD General Investigations Unit, Patrol Division, the Orange County District Attorney's Office, and the Orange County Crime Laboratory completed a walk-through of the crime scene. Tustin PD General Investigations Detectives and Investigators from the Orange County District Attorney's (OCDA) Office subsequently conducted joint interviews with Vizcarra, witnesses, and other associated subjects.

Suspect – Nicolas Vizcarra (AKA: Nicolas Vizcarra Barraza)

On 03/02/2014, at approximately 2326 hours, OCDA Investigator B. Hester and I proceeded to the Tustin Police Department's secure interview room to conduct an interview with Vizcarra. I read Vizcarra his Miranda Rights per my department issued Miranda Warning Card and Vizcarra answered, "Yes," to each part of the advisement indicating he understood his rights. Vizcarra then told me the following under implied waiver:

Vizcarra was currently employed as a "driver" and operated a "street sweeper" during his regular employment. On 03/02/2014 at approximately 0745 hours, Vizcarra came home from work and proceeded to wake his children up so they could go to church prior to going to [REDACTED] "ball game". [REDACTED] game was scheduled to take place at an indoor facility located in the area of Lyon Street and McFadden Avenue at approximately 0930 hours. Vizcarra took a shower and before he knew it, the police had arrived at his residence.

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Vizcarra explained he had surveillance camera(s) mounted on the exterior of his home to provide a view of the front porch/street area located in front of his residence. The surveillance images streamed onto a television monitor located in Vizcarra's bedroom, and allowed him to view anyone approaching his residence from the comfort of his own bed. Today, with the use of the surveillance cameras, Vizcarra saw two police vehicles pull in front of his residence and the officers started walking toward his residence. Vizcarra claimed he had "no idea" why someone had called the police on him.

Vizcarra told his children that someone had called the police on him then left the residence out the back door. Vizcarra said he fled the residence because he was on "probation" and did not want "no fucking contact with police whatsoever." Vizcarra crossed the walkway "for the Laundromat" and while jumping a fence which separated the residential properties from the Tustin Hospital, a police officer ordered Vizcarra to, "Freeze!" As Vizcarra jumped down from the fence, the police officer shot at him one time. Vizcarra told me the officer was parked in the Tustin Hospital parking lot and he described the officer as "a white guy" but "yellowish" and "short".

Vizcarra then "limped" to his uncle's/friend's house (located "on the corner" of Carfax Drive and Sycamore Avenue) and remained in the friend's garage while he operated on his leg. Vizcarra explained the "uncle" was actually his [REDACTED] uncle and both the uncle and his friend lived in the same residential building ([REDACTED]), and shared the same garage, but lived in different apartment units. Vizcarra told me he used "alcohol" and a "butter knife" to dig the "bullet" from his leg and his friend was present inside the garage working on "mechanics" during the operation.

Vizcarra described the bullet he removed from his leg as being a "9mm Berretta". Vizcarra said he left the bullet and napkins he used during the operation inside the friend's garage. It should be noted, "Beretta" is a gun manufacturer which does not manufacture ammunition. I spoke to Tustin PD Range Master/Armorer, Detective C. Kirwan, who was responsible for the record-keeping of all department-issued firearms. Detective Kirwan told me only 7 officers currently carried a Beretta firearm and only two officers carried a 9mm Glock. Out of those 9 officers, none were on duty on 03/02/2014 between the hours of 0600-1830 hours.

Vizcarra went on to tell me he remained in the garage until "things calmed down." He then got a ride from his [REDACTED] uncle and proceeded to his own residence to retrieve his vehicle, a "tan Escalade". At approximately 1300 hours, Vizcarra drove the "Escalade" to Riverside and visited his mother. Vizcarra remained at his mother's residence to relax and elevate his leg for a while. Vizcarra returned home at approximately 1800-1900 hours and was "receiv(ed) with bullets".

As Vizcarra provided me with the previous statements, he had a blanket covering his body, from the shoulders down, his eyes were closed, and his head was canted backwards toward the block wall behind him. During the remainder of the interview, he intermittently covered his mouth or his entire face as he spoke.

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Detective N. Nguyen #1123**

I told Vizcarra the Tustin Police Department received a phone call regarding him being in possession of a gun. Vizcarra replied, "No, no ma'am. I don't possess no guns." Vizcarra then told me he owned "a couple" of guns which he had secured in a Bank of America safe deposit box.

When I confronted Vizcarra with the fact that an officer did not shoot at him at the Tustin Hospital parking lot, he told me I could believe whatever I wanted. Vizcarra denied shooting himself in the leg or telling anyone he had shot himself in the leg. Vizcarra told me the "little contradiction" of when he got shot was something "we" needed to fight in court. When OCDA Investigator B. Hester asked Vizcarra if the officer who allegedly shot him chased him as he "limped" away toward his uncle's house, Vizcarra attempted to explain that he actually had only jumped over a fence separating his property from the hospital property and he did not jump the "8 or 9" foot wall leading into the Tustin Hospital parking lot. Vizcarra then abruptly stopped his explanation.

Vizcarra denied firing a weapon inside his residence and stated no member of his household fired a weapon inside the residence either. Vizcarra repeated the fact he wanted to go to court to dispute the allegations and told me the police shot at him 3-4 times today without any warning.

Vizcarra explained he was driving on "Carfax" when he saw a police vehicle following behind him. Vizcarra activated his "blinker" and waited for oncoming traffic to clear so he could make a turn into his friend's driveway. As the last oncoming vehicle passed Vizcarra, the police officer activated the "lights" on his police vehicle. Vizcarra questioned why the officer was pulling him over and said he was just intending on parking on his friend's driveway when the officer exited his patrol vehicle, pulled out his gun, and told Vizcarra to, "Freeze". Vizcarra said he drove on the sidewalk and the grass because the police officer blocked his exit and pulled a gun on him. Vizcarra said he felt "threatened" and "paranoid" so he fled in the only direction he could, on grass. Vizcarra did not know his friend's name, but claimed they were "outside" as Vizcarra was pulling into the driveway.

Vizcarra then invoked his Miranda rights and asked for his "lawyer". I concluded my interview and released Vizcarra to Officer Girgenti's custody. I recorded Vizcarra's statements using Tustin PD's audio/video recording system and uploaded the file into the Tustin PD server as evidence (**MAVS ID #: 76186**).

Detective T. Lomeli obtained a signed search warrant authorizing a blood draw from Vizcarra's person as well as a search of Vizcarra's Cadillac Escalade and his residence located at [REDACTED]. I requested a blood technician respond to the Tustin Police Department to withdraw a sample of Vizcarra's blood. Sergeant S. Nichols later notified me Vizcarra refused to cooperate with the blood draw and physically resisted causing the handcuffs to cut into his wrists, causing him to bleed (see Officer Girgenti's narrative for further details). Detective B. Miali photographed the

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injuries to Vizcarra's wrists at my request and he later uploaded the photographs into the Tustin PD server as evidence.

During a search of Vizcarra's vehicle, Detective Haug recovered a black plastic box containing a silver and black colored 40 caliber semi-automatic Ruger P94-model handgun, a magazine containing 10 rounds of ball ammunition, and a clear plastic bag filled with a green leafy substance, which Detective Haug recognized, based on his training and experience, to be marijuana. Tustin PD Crime Scene Investigators did not locate any additional evidence from Vizcarra's residence.

Tustin PD Dispatch received a probation hold for Vizcarra and Officer B. Stroud later transported Vizcarra to the Orange County Jail for booking. I request a copy of this report be forwarded to the Orange County District Attorney's Office for review and the following charges be filed against:

 - o HS 11357(b) – Possession of Marijuana

Case Status: Adult Arrest

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Investigative Follow-Up:

Due to the frequency of common last names in this investigation, all subjects will be referred to by their first names and last initial. The suspect was identified as being NICOLAS VIZCARRA and he will be referred to by his last name only. See the additional names pages for further details.

On 03-02-14 I assisted Detective Nguyen with conducting an investigation regarding an assault on a Tustin Police Officer. See Detective Nguyen's investigation narrative for further details.

NICOLAS VIZCARRA's family's statements

At approximately 0756 hours I went to 1142 Scherer Place and I saw a crowd of people had gathered. Officer Schaller was maintaining security of the crime scene and he advised that some family members wanted to speak with a detective. Officer Schaller pointed to three female subjects who I identified as being NICOLAS VIZCARRA's mother (██████████) and his two sisters (██████████ ██████████ ██████████).

As soon as I began speaking with VIZCARRA's family, ██████████ approached and identified herself as being VIZCARRA's ██████████. I obtained preliminary information from ██████████ who said she was not present when the original problem occurred. ██████████ said her mother (██████████), her son (Nicolas Vizcarra Jr.), her aunt (██████████) and uncle (██████████) were home at that time. ██████████ advised that her aunt and uncle had since left, however her mother (██████████) was still present at the scene. ██████████ agreed to voluntarily bring her mother and son to the Tustin Police Department to be interviewed. At my request, Detective Hardacre facilitated with getting the family to the Tustin Police Department for further investigation.

I continued speaking with VIZCARRA's mother and two sisters at the scene. ██████████ V.'s primary language was Spanish and ██████████ assisted with some translation. The following is a summary of their statements. It should be noted that I used a department issued PUMA audio recording device to record their statements. I later uploaded the recording onto the Tustin Police Department server.

██████████ advised they all live together in Riverside and they had just arrived at the location. ██████████ confirmed they were not present when anything occurred.

I asked if they had any information about what happened. ██████████ advised that she was here (1142 Scherer Pl.) this morning with VIZCARRA. At that time, VIZCARRA was "getting his stuff" to leave with her. ██████████ "took his stuff" and VIZCARRA was supposed to follow her back to Riverside, however he never arrived. ██████████ then called the house, looking for VIZCARRA.

I clarified that ██████████ was here this morning and she clarified it was at "one o'clock." ██████████ said when she got home, VIZCARRA did not arrive. After approximately 20-minutes she called the house and ██████████'s mother (██████████) answered. ██████████ said a Police Officer named "Gonzalez" was there and she spoke with him. ██████████ estimated this occurred at 1400 hours.

Officer Gonzalez informed ██████████ that the police were looking for her son, NICOLAS VIZCARRA, because he has a gun. ██████████ said she had just come from the house and VIZCARRA did not have a gun with him. Officer Gonzalez told ██████████ that he wants to speak with VIZCARRA if he arrives at her house.

██████████ said if her son had a gun, he must have purchased it today somewhere. She reiterated that he did not have a gun when she was with him earlier this morning.

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I asked if VIZCARRA had been drinking today. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she did not see him very well. She saw a bottle of "211" but she did not see VIZCARRA drink from it. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] noted "that's the one he drinks." I recalled the name of a beer called Steel 211. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said VIZCARRA took a shower and seemed normal when he was here. She did not think he was drunk at that time.

I asked if VIZCARRA was upset from fighting with his [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] noted that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was not there at the time, only his [REDACTED]).

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] added that her brother and [REDACTED] have been arguing in the past, and she described them as being "like cats and dogs." [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said there was an incident approximately 3-4 years ago when VIZCARRA was accused of having a gun. At that time it was discovered he only had a bb-gun, however that "got him those charges" for it. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said they do not get involved in the disputes between [REDACTED] A. and VIZCARRA. She knows they fight but she does not ask for details.

It should be noted, during my preliminary meeting with NICOLAS VIZCARRA's mother and sisters I was unaware of prior calls for service at 1142 Scherer. It was later discovered that [REDACTED] [REDACTED] had called the Tustin Police Department earlier that morning around 0749 hours regarding VIZCARRA drinking and smoking marijuana at the residence. At that time, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and her mother ([REDACTED] [REDACTED]) reached out to VIZCARRA's mother ([REDACTED] [REDACTED]) for help. I was originally unaware of this information and I did not discuss this with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at the scene.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s statements

[REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s mother, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], voluntarily came to the Tustin Police Department to provide a statement about what happened. Also present during the interview was Orange County District Attorney Investigator Anderson. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] predominant language was Spanish and I spoke with her in Spanish.

The following is a summary of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] statements. It should be noted that I used a department issued PUMA audio recording device to record the interview. I later uploaded the recording onto the Tustin Police Department server.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she lives at [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. She is the primary renter at the location, however her adult daughter, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], also lives there with her [REDACTED] (NICOLAS VIZCARRA) and their three children. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and VIZCARRA have an 8-year old son, a 6-year old daughter and a 10-year old daughter. The names of the children are confidential due to the nature of the crime and they will only be referred to as Victim.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she woke this morning at approximately 0900 hours and she was present when [REDACTED] [REDACTED] called the police. She said this occurred at approximately "nine-something" however she was not certain of the time. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] explained that VIZCARRA had been drinking and smoking marijuana inside of the apartment and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] wanted him to leave before the children woke up. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] called the police however VIZCARRA fled before the officers arrived. The officers did not speak with VIZCARRA at that time.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she went to church and she returned later that afternoon. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she was visiting with her brother [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at the apartment and she was offering him something to eat and drink. She said at approximately 1600 hours VIZCARRA came home and he entered the kitchen with a little box.

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██████████. said VIZCARRA placed the box on the counter. She described the box as being black in color and square shaped. VIZCARRA opened the box and there was a little gun inside. ██████████ said the gun was dark colored, possibly black, however she was unable to provide any further details. VIZCARRA said she had never seen the gun or the box before.

██████████ said VIZCARRA's 8-year old son (victim) was playing with his cars at the dining room table. VIZCARRA told him to stop playing and come over to him. ██████████ said VIZCARRA took his son outside to the backyard. VIZCARRA put the gun in his son's hands, and then held his own hands around his son's. VIZCARRA then shot the gun one time at a little lemon tree in the backyard. ██████████ saw this happened.

██████████ said VIZCARRA then left the apartment with the gun and the box. She said he was only there for less than 5-minutes. Once he was gone, ██████████ called the police and reported what had happened. ██████████ said she wanted to remain confidential and she did not want VIZCARRA to know that she called.

██████████ statement

During a Miranda interview, NICOLAS VIZCARRA indicated that he went to his uncle's house at some point this morning. VIZCARRA noted the uncle lived on the corner of Carfax and Sycamore. VIZCARRA said he was in the garage and he used a butter knife to remove a bullet from his leg.

After I completed my interview with ██████████, Detective Nguyen requested that I investigate further into VIZCARRA's claim. I reviewed the original call for service and I saw a notation that ██████████ brother "██████████" lives at ██████████ I noted this is on the corner of Carfax and Sycamore and it matched with VIZCARRA's statement.

Orange County District Attorney Investigator Anderson and I drove to the location to speak with "██████████".

Investigator Anderson and I contacted the residents and ██████████ answered the door. She woke up her father, ██████████, who also spoke with us at the door.

██████████ and ██████████ confirmed that VIZCARRA came over to their apartment this morning at approximately 0800 hours. They both noted that VIZCARRA did not go into their apartment. When asked if he went into their garage, they noted that their garage is locked so he could not get inside. ██████████ said VIZCARRA went into another garage that was open. That garage is shared by the tenants in apartments ██████████

When asked what he was doing in the garage, ██████████ said VIZCARRA was just sitting down and massaging his leg. When asked what was wrong with his leg, ██████████ noted that VIZCARRA had blood on his right leg. He said VIZCARRA had something, like clothing, wrapped around his leg. VIZCARRA claimed that the police had shot him.

██████████ said the neighbor from apartment ██████████ was working on the car in the garage at that time.

After speaking with ██████████, Investigator Anderson and I attempted to contact the neighbor in apartment ██████████ I knocked on the door and a male subject came to the window. The subject asked who we were looking for and then told us to "hold on." He did not return.

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We knocked on the door for apartment [REDACTED] and Investigator Anderson contacted the resident, who gave his permission to look inside his garage. Investigator Anderson and I looked for items described by VIZCARRA that included paper towels, a bullet and a bottle of rubbing alcohol. We did not find anything matching that description in the garage.

I forwarded the above information to be included with the original investigation.

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I am a Detective with the Tustin Police Department and assigned to General Investigations Property Crimes Team; Special Operations Division.

Case Summary:

On 03/02/2014 at approximately 1830 hours, I was notified via telephone by Detective Sergeant Wright there had been an officer involved shooting in the city of Tustin. I responded to TPD and tasked Detective Lomeli with writing a search warrant for the suspect, suspect residence, and suspect vehicle. I then responded to the command post (CP) located at 1112 Walnut Ave, Tustin. Upon arrival at the CP, I was briefed by TPD Sergeant Coe and provide the basic facts of the case.

I then walked to the area of Carfax Drive and Scherer Place and found a crime scene had been established. The perimeter was marked off with yellow crime scene tape and patrol officers were posted around the perimeter. I conducted a walk-thru of the scene with Sergeant Taylor who also briefed me on the known facts of the incident.

At 2046 hours, I attended a briefing at the CP along with other TPD Detectives and District Attorney's Office Investigators. I was assigned to investigate the actual scene along with DA Investigator Ed Wood.

I responded back to the scene and conducted another walk through of the scene. I located TPD patrol car #22 parked facing south in front of 1162 Scherer Place (Officer Gonzalez' vehicle). Upon walking east down the south sidewalk of Scherer Lane, I saw orange cones had been put in place to mark three expended shell casings. There was one additional shell casing in the gutter in front of 1182 Scherer Lane; for a total of four casings. This was explained to me to be the approximate area where Officer Gonzalez stood while firing his weapon.

In the center of the street in front of 1182 Scherer Place was TPD patrol car #23 (Officer DelMerari'S vehicle). Unit #23 was facing eastbound on Scherer Place. The patrol rifle of unit #23

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was removed from the rifle mount and lying across the front passenger seat. There was damage to the passenger rear view mirror consistent with being stuck by a bullet.

Directly in front of unit #23, facing in a northwestern direction, was a silver colored Cadillac Escalade (Cal Lic# [REDACTED]). This vehicle was identified to me as having been driven by suspect Vizcarra during the incident. Unit #23 was resting against the front driver's door of that vehicle; causing minor damage to the Cadillac. I noticed additional damage to the Cadillac which appeared to be bullet impact locations (reference OC Crime Lab report for exact impact locations).

On the other side (passenger side) of the Cadillac was unit #17 (Officer Gleason's vehicle). Unit #17 was facing westbound on Scherer Place.

A civilian vehicle (White colored Ford F150 / Cal Lic# [REDACTED]) parked along north curb line of Scherer lane, facing westbound, had a bullet impact mark in the center windshield area.

Another civilian vehicle (silver colored Honda Civic / Cal Lic# [REDACTED]) had apparently been parked in the south driveway of [REDACTED] when the incident occurred. This vehicle had a bullet impact hole in the right rear bumper area, under the right tail light. I was told the owner of the vehicle moved the vehicle prior to initial officer's responding on scene. I observed the vehicle parked in the north drive way of the same address location.

I noticed tire marks in the grass that led from the south side of 1192 Scherer Place to the southwest corner of Carfax Drive and Scherer Place. These tire marks continued westbound Scherer lane; heading directly towards where Officer Gonzalez was believed to be standing when he fired his weapon.

The Orange County Crime Lab arrived on scene and another walk through was conducted to orient them to the scene. I was accompanied by Forensic Scientist Jaime Miller and Forensic Specialist Grant Fry.

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Later in the evening while processing the scene, Fry took photographs of Unit #23, to include the patrol rifle I had originally found in the front passenger seat. After photographing, I inspected the rifle in the presence of Fry and Investigator Wood.

After inspecting the rifle, I determined the rifle was in a "patrol ready" configuration; which means the chamber was empty, bolt forward, trigger pulled. I concluded the rifle had not been fired and was likely in the passenger seat to be more easily deployed if needed.

Upon the search warrant being authorized, a search of the Cadillac Escalade was conducted. Upon opening the front right passenger door, I noticed a black plastic box with the word "Ruger" printed on the top. This box was located on the front passenger floor board. Upon opening the box, I located a silver and black colored 40 caliber semi-automatic Ruger P94 model pistol. There was also a loaded magazine in the same box.

Upon inspecting the firearm, I determined it was not loaded. Upon inspecting the magazine, I saw it was loaded with approximately ten (10) rounds of ball ammunition. The magazine was not unloaded at the scene; therefore the round count is only approximate and visually estimated.

I located a serial number on the lower receiver of the firearm (34049608) and conducted a records check through TPD Dispatch. The record returned as "not on file". The OC Crime Lab collected the firearm and magazine as evidence.

On the floor next to the firearm was a clear plastic bag filled with a green leafy substance. Based on my training and experience, I recognized the substance to be marijuana. TPD PSO Grover was on scene and collected the marijuana as evidence. PSO Grover also collected Vizcarra's cellphone and miscellaneous money that had been removed from Vicarra's pockets upon initially being searched by officers.

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The Cadillac Escalade was later impounded with an evidence hold and transported to the OC Crime Lab for further examination.

I then responded to [REDACTED] to serve the search warrant on Vicarra's residence. The residence had originally been secured by Officer Roque and Officer Fetterling pending the search warrant. A search of the residence was conducted using TPD detectives. Unable to access the garage due to a combination lock in place securing the door; I used bolt cutters to gain access. No evidence was collected from the garage.

I left the residence while TPD CSI continued their investigation.

Investigative Follow Up:

On 3-2-14 I created a search warrant to search the residence of [REDACTED] the suspect vehicle, a silver Cadillac Escalade California License Plate [REDACTED] and a sample of the Suspect-Nicolas Vizcarra Barraza's blood to be taken in a medically approved manner.

After the search warrant was reviewed and signed by the Honorable Judge Griffin, Tustin PD Detectives along with Tustin Police Services Officers and the OCDA's Office executed the search warrant. Officer Girgenti was present with Barraza at Tustin PD during the time of the blood draw (see Officer Girgenti's supplemental report for further).

I am assigned to the Tustin Police Department's Special Enforcement Detail (SED). The SED team is assigned to southwest Tustin, as part of the area command to provide saturation patrol resources in high crime areas. Southwest Tustin is a high-crime area prone to murders, robberies, sexual assaults, assaults with deadly weapons, burglaries, stolen vehicles, gang activity, and drug activity.

On 030214 at approximately 0035 hours, I was working uniformed patrol in a marked TPD police unit. I responded to the TPD Sallyport to assist Detective Nguyen with the execution of a search warrant for obtaining suspect Nicolas Vizcarra's blood. Refer to Detective Nguyen's report for further details.

Sergeant Nichols and Officers Muro, Stroud and Newton arrived on scene to assist.

Prior to Vizcarra's blood being drawn, I informed Vizcarra a search warrant had been obtained for a sample of his blood to be obtained. Vizcarra informed me he would not submit to the blood draw and would resist.

CPT-2 Verion Payne arrived on scene to attempt to draw Vizcarra's blood sample.

CPT-2 Payne attempted three times to obtain a blood sample from Vizcarra's right arm and hand but was unsuccessful on all three attempts. During the attempts, Vizcarra continually moved his right arm back and forth, leaned away from TPD personnel, thrust his body weight back and forth on the Sallyport bench and attempted kicking his legs around in an attempt to try and avoid his blood sample from being taken.

Because of Vizcarra's constant movements and attempts to deny his blood from being drawn, he cut his left wrist on the handcuff that secured his left wrist to the Sallyport bench. Refer to Detective Nguyen's report for further details.

While trying to hold Vizcarra down so the blood could be drawn, I observed Vizcarra's blood was on my left wrist area. The blood was later removed from my left wrist area.

After three unsuccessful attempts of drawing Vizcarra's blood by CPT-2 Payne, CPT-1 Donald Drake arrived on scene to attempt to draw Vizcarra's blood. Upon seeing CPT-1 Drake arrive on scene, Vizcarra agreed to not resist giving a blood sample.

I observed CPT-1 Drake remove a sample of Vizcarra's blood from his left arm.

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INVESTIGATIVE NARRATIVE:

I am a Detective with the Tustin Police Department assigned to the Major Crimes Unit within the General Investigations Detail. This case involves the assault with a deadly weapon on a Police Officer. On 03/02/14 at approx. 1815 hours, I was called at home by Sgt. Wright who advised me there had been an officer involved shooting. Sgt. Wright advised me he was still gathering information and would call me back with additional details on if he needed me to respond to the station. Approx. 7 minutes later, Sgt. Wright called me back and requested I respond to the station to assist with this investigation.

At the station, I was requested to interview [REDACTED] and Victim, the [REDACTED] and son of suspect Nicolas Vizcarra. The interview was conducted with the assistance of DA Investigator Loren Dawson. The interviews were conducted in the downstairs traffic office. Both interviews were recorded on my Puma digital recorder and later uploaded to our server. Below is a synopsis of the interviews.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] told us she lives at the apartment with her 3 children, her mom, her aunt and Vizcarra and they have lived there about 5 years. Inv. Dawson told [REDACTED] the police had been called out to the house about 4pm today and asked if the police had been called out anytime today prior to that and he said yes. [REDACTED] said the police had come out about 7am this morning because he was "smoking in one of the rooms". [REDACTED] said Vizcarra didn't do anything to her or anybody else in the house and when she called; he left when he saw the Officers coming.

[REDACTED] said the Officers came inside and could smell that he had been smoking Marijuana. [REDACTED] said the Officer was asking her about Vizcarra's Probation Officer but she told him she didn't know what his name was. [REDACTED] said "Officer Scott" (later identified as Officer Scott Wright) was going to look around but that they weren't going to arrest him because he (Vizcarra) didn't do anything to her.

[REDACTED] said the Officers didn't find Vizcarra so she called her uncle and went over to his house until approx. 0930 hours. [REDACTED] said she then took [REDACTED] to his indoor soccer game near Lyon and McFadden. [REDACTED] saw that Vizcarra was there at the game so she left the area and drove back to her uncle's house.

[REDACTED] said she called her mom and asked her to call Vizcarra's mom to see if she would come over to their apartment to talk to him. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra's mom ([REDACTED]) did come over to their apartment about 1200 noon but said she and her kids weren't there and were at her uncle's house. [REDACTED] said she did drive back to the apartment while Vizcarra was still packing up his belongings and she thought he was supposed to be going to Riverside with his mom. [REDACTED] said her children were not at the apartment and were at church with her aunt.

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About 1400 hours, ██████ said her aunt and the kids returned to the apartment after going to church. ██████ said they left to go rent movies from "Red box" and when they returned, Vizcarra was back at the apartment. ██████ said Vizcarra came in and took something from the refrigerator and left again but she didn't know what he had taken with him. ██████ said Vizcarra didn't say anything to any of them while he was there. After Vizcarra left, ██████ called his mom (██████████) and told her she thought he was supposed to be with them heading back to Riverside. ██████ told ██████ they had "lost him" and said they were getting gas when he disappeared from them.

Vizcarra returned again about 1430 hours and told their daughter (██████████) that he needed his phone charger from the van and asked her to get him the keys. ██████ said ██████ got him the charger and he gave her some money (unk. how much). ██████ said Vizcarra told ██████ he was going to a hotel room because he had been shot in his shin area. ██████ pointed to the area below the knee and above the foot when describing the area.

██████████ said her daughter came back in after Vizcarra left and told her what he had said. ██████ told ██████ they could drive around the local hotels to look for him and then they would call his mom (██████████) and let her know where he was. ██████ said the victim decided to stay home so she took ██████ and her other daughter, ██████ with her. ██████ drove around to some parks where they take their kids to thinking maybe he was there but didn't find him.

██████████ returned home and was told Vizcarra returned while she was gone and had shot a gun outside. ██████ took the victim with her and they all left to go to her friend's house. ██████ thought she was there about an hour when her friend received a phone call from her aunt asking her to come back home to speak to the Officers. ██████ said about 1735-1745 hours; she returned home and was speaking to an Officer. ██████ said all of a sudden she thought the Officer heard something over his radio and then she heard gun shots. Inv. Dawson asked her how many shots she heard and she thought it was 3 shots. ██████ described the area where the shooting occurred as the area where she heard the shots.

██████████ denied seeing any Police Officer or Vizcarra shooting a gun. ██████ denied seeing the police arrest Vizcarra or if there was any force used to arrest him. Inv. Dawson said he had not been to the scene and wasn't familiar with ██████'s apartment or driveway. I explained to him that the apartments sit off the roadway and the parking lot is big, allowing 6-8 cars to park there. ██████ explained she thought she would have to walk 15-20 steps to get to the sidewalk area. ██████ said she never heard the Police Officers say anything nor did she ever hear Vizcarra say anything. ██████ said the only thing she heard was when she was talking to the Officer at her house, he told her, "I have to go".

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████████ said she has been married to Vizcarra since about 2003 and all 3 of her children are with Vizcarra. ██████████ didn't know what Vizcarra was on probation for and initially said he's been on probation "forever". ██████████ said it goes back and forth from formal probation to informal probation but said he wasn't on probation in 2003 when they married. ██████████ thought Vizcarra was put on probation in 2008 or 2009.

Inv. Dawson asked ██████████ if she has called the police out to her apartment any time before today and she said yes. Inv. Dawson asked her what the reason was for her calling the police out prior to today and she said it was because he had hit her before. ██████████ thought she had called the police 3-4 times in the past on Vizcarra. ██████████ then clarified and said she had called the police twice in the past because he had hit her and the other time was today. ██████████ said the 2 prior incidents were not recent and occurred several years ago.

Inv. Dawson asked ██████████ if she called today because of him smoking what she thought was marijuana in the bedroom and she said yes. ██████████ said she didn't think it was right for him to be doing that there at their house. Inv. Dawson told ██████████ it seemed he was coming back and forth to the house and that ultimately he said he was going to a hotel and they went looking for him at a hotel and she said yes.

Inv. Dawson asked ██████████ if she had any communication with Vizcarra today other than him smoking Marijuana and she said they just weren't getting along. ██████████ said Vizcarra doesn't understand her point of view and she doesn't understand his point of view. ██████████ said she was mostly speaking to his mom who told her they weren't getting along and weren't behaving. ██████████ said his mom told her they needed to "chill" for now.

Inv. Dawson asked ██████████ if Vizcarra had any guns and she said, "Not that I knew of". ██████████ said she knew for certain there were no guns in their house though. ██████████ denied being at the house today when any guns were fired or being present today with anything involving guns. ██████████ denied that Vizcarra has ever spoken to her about having a gun. ██████████ denied that Vizcarra has ever spoken in the past about committing suicide or attempting it.

I spoke to ██████████ about the names of her 3 children and about Vizcarra asking ██████████ to get him the iphone charger. ██████████ said she knew Vizcarra had been inside the apartment earlier when he got something from the refrigerator but didn't know if he stayed in the area or that he was still outside. ██████████ heard Vizcarra yell to ██████████ from outside the apartment that he needed the van keys to get the iphone charger. ██████████ said she heard him outside but never actually saw him.

I asked ██████████ if Vizcarra was bleeding and she said no and said that ██████████ never said he was bleeding. I asked ██████████ if she knew whether Vizcarra showed ██████████ his leg and she said he didn't. ██████████ told me that ██████████ had said that her dad had been

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shot but [REDACTED] didn't know how it had happened. [REDACTED] thought this occurred about 1430 hours in the afternoon.

Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she ever saw Vizcarra today other than early this morning when he was smoking Marijuana and she said yes. [REDACTED] said she saw Vizcarra about 1200 noon today when he was finishing up packing up his belongings. Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if Vizcarra had anything on his leg such as a wound or bullet hole and she said yes. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra had something wrapped on his leg and pointed to his shin area. Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if it was a handkerchief or bandana and she thought it was something similar to that and it was tied. [REDACTED] described it as blue in color and denied seeing any blood on it. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra didn't have the bandana on his leg prior to today. I asked [REDACTED] if it was there at 0700 hours this morning when she called the Police and she said no.

[REDACTED] told us she left the apartment after she had spoken to the Officers earlier in the morning and didn't return back home until after 1200 noon sometime. [REDACTED] said she didn't come back to the apartment until after Vizcarra's mom was there. [REDACTED] told us when she had been to the soccer place at McFadden and Lyon where the victim was supposed to play soccer, Vizcarra had on long shorts so she couldn't see anything.

[REDACTED] denied ever hearing Vizcarra say anything about not going back to jail or that he would fight the Police. Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if there was any reason for Vizcarra to have any incident with the Police today and she said no. [REDACTED] said, "They weren't going to arrest him, they were just gonna see why was he acting dumb, he didn't do anything but I don't know why he left".

We spoke to [REDACTED] about where her kids were when she heard the gun shots and she said they were with their Godmother who lives off of Mitchell Ave. Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if any of the kids were present during the time when the gun was possibly fired and she said yes, that the victim was. [REDACTED] said the victim told her, "Mom, my dad came and said lets shoot a gun". [REDACTED] said Vizcarra shot the gun and then after and was supposed to go to Riverside. [REDACTED] denied that the victim had shot the gun. [REDACTED] said this occurred about 1630 hours while she was out driving around looking for him.

[REDACTED] said when she got home, the Police were not at her apartment but her son, the victim, was. [REDACTED] denied finding any bullets, casings or shells in the street on around the house. [REDACTED] said she went outside and her mom told her that was the area where Vizcarra had shot. Vizcarra described "ashes" as being on the ground when it happened. [REDACTED] said this occurred about 1630 and she then took the victim over to her Godmother's house off Mitchell where the other 2 daughters were.

I asked [REDACTED] if she knew how the Police got called back at 1730-1800 and she said she didn't know. [REDACTED] said when she returned home from taking the victim to her

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Godmother's house, the Police were already at her house. [REDACTED] said she was there about 5-7 minutes when the other shooting occurred. At that point, no further questions were asked of [REDACTED] and she left the traffic office. We next interviewed the victim in the traffic office along with his mom, [REDACTED] Vizcarra. Below is a synopsis of that interview.

INTERVIEW WITH VICTIM:

In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim if he was at their house today when Vizcarra was there and he said yes. The victim remembered the Police being out to his house at about 0700 today and In [REDACTED] Dawson asked him if he knew what had happened. The victim said his dad, Vizcarra, had been looking through all of his mom's stuff and took out all of her clothes and put it outside in the backyard.

In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim if the Police came back out later in the day. The victim first said no then said the Police were there and said there was a lot of Police guarding the house. In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim if Vizcarra ever talked about having a gun or showed him a gun and he said yes. The victim said Vizcarra told him he keeps his gun in Riverside and said he showed him the gun today. The victim described the gun as being silver with a black grip. The victim wasn't sure if it had a silver cylinder but stated the bullets were kept in the black grip.

The victim first said he had seen Vizcarra previously with the gun then said he had only seen him with it today and had never seen him holding it prior. The victim said earlier today he was playing with his toy cars inside his apartment and said Vizcarra grabbed him and told him, "Come, come shoot the gun". The victim said they went outside and Vizcarra grabbed his arms and made him shoot the gun. The victim said his dad had him put his hands around the gun and his finger on the trigger. The victim said his dad put his hands on top of his and put his finger on his on the trigger and pulled it back, causing the gun to fire. The victim then said, "But I didn't want to shoot it". The victim said he had told Vizcarra he didn't want to go outside but Vizcarra told him, "Come on, just right here in the back, shoot it". The victim said they only shot the gun once.

The victim said they were pointing the gun at "the plants on the floor", stating there was a lot of mud there. The victim didn't see anything happen when they shot the plants. The victim didn't know if it hit the plants nor did he see a hole in the plants. In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim what happened after they fired the gun. The victim said Vizcarra then told her he was going to go to Riverside and left the residence.

In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim what happened to the gun and he said Vizcarra had a case where he kept the gun and said there were "gadgets" also inside the case. The victim thought the other "gadgets" were black and were used to upgrade the gun. The victim said the case for the gun was black. The victim denied ever seeing the case or gun prior to today. The victim denied his dad had told him anything about the gun or how big the

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bullets were and he didn't know how many bullets were inside the gun. The victim said after they fired the shot, there was a "shell" on the ground in their backyard. The victim wasn't sure about the time but thought it might have happened about 1500 hours. The victim said his grandmother and aunt and uncle were home with him at the time this occurred. The victim said none of them were outside when it occurred and said none of them came outside after it happened.

In ■ Dawson asked the victim if Vizcarra had something on his leg like a handkerchief or bandana and he said yes. The victim thought it was similar to a bandana and that he had ripped it into little pieces and had put it on his leg. The victim pointed to his knee area, the middle of his shin and the bottom of his leg and said those were where the 3 pieces of bandana were. The victim said the pieces were blue in color and they were on his right leg.

The victim then told ■, "You saw it, you remember" and she said, "Ya, but I don't remember". In ■ Dawson asked the victim if he asked Vizcarra why he had them on his leg and he said no. The victim said when his dad was going to go to a hotel; his sister (■) asked him if he wanted to go to the Dr. The victim said Vizcarra told ■ that they would "chop off my leg" if he went to the Dr. The victim said he didn't hear Vizcarra say that and was told that by his sister.

In ■ Dawson asked the victim if he saw the bandana on his dad's leg about the same time as he shot the gun and he said no. The victim said he had been shot at about 0700 hours this morning. The victim said he didn't see a bandana on his dad's leg when he shot the gun and only saw a "little dot" on his dad's leg. The victim said it wasn't covered with a band aid or any medicine but was similar to when you fall and you create "black skin". The victim denied that Vizcarra told him what had happened and said it was ■ who told him, "They shot him in the leg, for reals". The victim said, "We thought that he fell down and slipped".

I asked the victim if Vizcarra had been shot at 0700 hours when he was at the apartment and he said yes. The victim said Vizcarra came into the apartment saying, "ow, ow, ow". ■ confirmed that Vizcarra was at the apartment last night and had slept there. ■ said Vizcarra got up and left for work about 0600 hours and came back about 0630 hours. ■ said when she started smelling what Vizcarra was doing, she didn't see him and didn't know if he already had that or not. ■ said she never physically saw Vizcarra in the morning and only heard him say he was leaving when he saw that the Police were coming. ■ said she didn't know where Vizcarra went when he left the apartment at 0600 hours this morning.

I told the victim I had heard something about Vizcarra telling him he was the man of the house and he said yes. The victim said Vizcarra told him, "Now you're the man of the house and take care of your mom". The victim said Vizcarra told him this after he had

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shot the gun and said Vizcarra then left the apartment. In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim if he knew what Vizcarra meant by that and he said no.

In [REDACTED] Dawson spoke to the victim again about when they fired the gun. In [REDACTED] Dawson asked the victim if he told Vizcarra he didn't want to shoot it and he said no but that Vizcarra grabbed him. The victim then said Vizcarra told him to go outside so he did and then he grabbed him by the hands. The victim confirmed that was when Vizcarra put his hands (the victim's) around the gun and put his hand (Vizcarra's) on top of them. The victim confirmed he did put his finger on the trigger and that Vizcarra put his finger on top and pulled the trigger. The victim denied that Vizcarra shot the gun by himself while he was at the apartment.

The victim first stated Vizcarra had another all black gun at his mom's house out in Riverside and that he (the victim) has been out to the Riverside house. The victim then said he has never seen a gun out there or seen Vizcarra with a gun at the Riverside house. At that point, we concluded our interview with the victim and he and [REDACTED] left the traffic office.

Awhile later, I was contacted by DA In [REDACTED] Dawson who advised me we needed to speak to Sgt. Havourd who was on duty at the time and had responded to the scene. We interviewed him in an upstairs interview room. The interview was digitally recorded on my Puma recorder and later uploaded to our server.

INTERVIEW WITH SGT. DUANE HAVOURD:

In [REDACTED] Dawson asked Sgt. Havourd if his tape recorder was going during the incident and he said no. Sgt. Havourd said the units are equipped with MAVS (mobile audio/visual system) and said the units that responded had their MAVS on.

In [REDACTED] Dawson asked Sgt. Havourd if he had responded out to [REDACTED] today and he said he had. Sgt. Havourd said they had responded to the residence earlier in the afternoon reference a "shots fired and domestic situation". Sgt. Havourd said he assisted with searching backyards to make sure the suspect wasn't hiding in the area. Sgt. Havourd said it was alleged that the suspect (later identified as Vizcarra) had fired a handgun inside the residence in front of an 8 year old (later identified as the victim) and his mother in law ([REDACTED] [REDACTED]).

Sgt. Havourd said he saw an expended shell casing on the back patio along with a hole in the bottom of the fence. Sgt. Havourd said there was also a small hole at the bottom of either a small orange tree or lime tree. Sgt. Havourd said he and officer Muro cleared all of the laundry rooms on the west side of the street on Carfax.

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Sgt. Havourd said they then learned he might be driving an Escalade and put out a county wide red channel broadcast. Sgt. Havourd said he stayed in the area because he thought Vizcarra might return and it was getting close to shift change.

Sgt. Havourd said he then had to leave the area as a different domestic violence call came out and Officers were asking for code 3 follows (lights and sirens). Sgt. Havourd said that call was about ¾-1 mile away and he drove to that call. Sgt. Havourd then said he thought it was Officer Scott Wright who then called out that he had Vizcarra's vehicle (an Escalade) going northbound on Del Amo. (It should be noted that it was Officer Gleason who reported he had the Escalade and that they were headed northbound on Carfax).

Sgt. Havourd heard him say he would be initiating a "960X" (felony car stop) on the vehicle so he (Sgt. Havourd) began to respond code 3. About 30 seconds later, Sgt. Havourd heard Officer Gonzalez put out "998" (Officer involved in a gun battle). Sgt. Havourd said he thought he was about the 3rd unit to arrive.

Sgt. Havourd saw that Vizcarra was coming out the passenger side of the vehicle and was on the pavement. Sgt. Havourd said Officers were in the process of cuffing him when he arrived. Sgt. Havourd said he could see a wound to his right leg and said it was bandaged with a blue bandana and some type of cellophane or plastic. Sgt. Havourd saw a 1 ½" diameter blood spot under the bandana. Sgt. Havourd said directly below that he saw an un-bandaged wound that looked like an exit wound. Sgt. Havourd said it was directly in line with the initial wound and said it was about his shin area.

Sgt. Havourd saw his wound and Vizcarra's vehicle and knew there had been an Officer involved shooting and asked Vizcarra what had happened. Vizcarra told Sgt. Havourd, "You guys shot me" and he asked him when he was shot. Vizcarra told Sgt. Havourd, "You guys shot me earlier". Sgt. Havourd told Vizcarra we hadn't been here earlier and asked him if he was shot by Santa Ana Police Department since he had been gone for an hour and a half and thought maybe he had gone to Santa Ana. Vizcarra denied he had been shot by SAPD and again told Sgt. Havourd, "You guys shot me".

Sgt. Havourd said he saw the way it appeared Vizcarra's gun shot was straight down and knew it wasn't consistent with the bullet holes in his vehicle. Sgt. Havourd said he stopped asking Vizcarra any questions because he felt he would just continue to say that we had shot him. Sgt. Havourd said he then took Officer Gonzalez, Officer Del Merari and Dispatcher Cornell to the station.

Sgt. Havourd said when he arrived at the scene, he saw "track marks" on the grass in between the parked cars that were parked on the street. Sgt. Havourd said there is a walk way and grass and he could see where the Escalade had gone through and then had gone down the apron of another driveway.

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Sgt. Havourd couldn't remember the male's name that was at the scene but knew part of it was "Baraza". Sgt. Havourd stated the name he heard at the scene was the same name we had been looking for but said he just couldn't remember what the name was.

Sgt. Havourd said there was no force used in taking Vizcarra into custody and as soon as he was cuffed up, he called for paramedics to come to the scene. Sgt. Havourd knew OCFA responded but didn't know what engine number it was. Sgt. Havourd denied searching through Vizcarra's vehicle at the scene.

Sgt. Havourd said he couldn't see underneath the blue bandana on the upper wound but saw a perfectly circular blood spot that had bled through the bandana. Sgt. Havourd said the circular spot was about 3"-4" below the bandana. Sgt. Havourd said he didn't see what was under the blue bandana and saw that it wasn't bleeding badly so he told the Officer's to just leave it on until medics arrived. Sgt. Havourd said just below the blue bandana, he saw that he had some type of plastic wrap tied around his leg. Sgt. Havourd said Vizcarra was wearing shorts at the time and said they were baggy and down to about his knees. Sgt. Havourd didn't see any holes in Vizcarra's shorts. Sgt. Havourd didn't notice any other wounds on his body while he stood there.

Sgt. Havourd said he has been out to the house before but didn't know if it was for the same suspect as it has been quite a while since he had been there. In [REDACTED] Dawson spoke to Sgt. Havourd about the casing being on the back patio at the residence and asked him if he knew who had recovered it. Sgt. Havourd said he directed Officer Gonzalez to recover the casing as part of his investigation.

I asked Sgt. Havourd if he remembered about what time it was when they were doing the searches in the backyards and he said he didn't. Sgt. Havourd said he and Officer Muro called into dispatch that they were going to start searching and thought it should be in CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch).

At that point, we concluded our interview with Sgt. Havourd and he left the interview room. I request this supplemental report be included into the original report. I have an interview set up with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for 03/04/14 at approx. 1430 hours. I will write a supplemental report after that interview and submit it to the DA's office at a later date.

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I am a Detective assigned to the General Investigations Division of the Tustin Police Department.

Investigative follow up:

Western Medical Emergency Room:

On Sunday, March 2, 2014, I was notified of an Officer Involved Shooting and I responded from my residence to assist in the investigation. Upon my arrival at Tustin PD I was assigned to Western Medical Center in Santa Ana to guard the suspect, Nicolas Vizcarra. I was instructed not to question Vizcarra, but to activate my PUMA digital recorder so in the event Vizcarra makes any spontaneous statements they are captured. I activated my recorder and stood with Vizcarra while he was at the hospital.

Observations:

Upon my arrival at Western Medical Center I contacted Vizcarra. I did not speak with him, but I did notice his wound to his right leg. It was an apparent gunshot wound to his right leg just below his knee. The wound was approximately the size of a fingertip and was not bleeding when I arrived. There were also two abrasions approximately four to six inches below the gunshot wound. I did not see an exit wound. I later saw the x-ray to Vizcarra's leg when PA [REDACTED] reviewed it. I did not see any fractures to the bone, nor did I see a projectile in his leg.

I was told the nurse in charge was initially [REDACTED] and was transferred to [REDACTED] at shift change. I did not interview either of the RNs and did not notice them treating Vizcarra. It appeared Physician's Assistant [REDACTED] did most of the care for Vizcarra.

Vizcarra did not make any statements to me during this time, but he did make several statements to the medical staff which I was present for. The Physician's Assistant [REDACTED], informed Vizcarra that she reviewed his x-rays and did not see a projectile, which is commonly present in an x-ray when treating a gunshot wound. Vizcarra told PA [REDACTED] that he took the projectile out with a "Butter knife" earlier in the day. Vizcarra told PA [REDACTED] the gunshot wound happened in the morning at approximately 0800 hours. Vizcarra did not say how he obtained this gunshot wound.

Vizcarra made several comments to PA [REDACTED] which I was not able to hear because he was speaking softly and there was background noise in the emergency room of Western Medical Center. I later interviewed PA [REDACTED] for more information.

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Statements of [REDACTED] Vizcarra:

While I was standing by at Western Medical Center I was notified by security that Vizcarra's family was in the waiting room and they wanted to see him. Security requested I speak with them to avoid any disturbances.

I contacted [REDACTED] [REDACTED] which is Nicolas Vizcarra's mother and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Nicolas Vizcarra's sister, in the waiting room of the hospital. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] said they were not present during the incident this evening. [REDACTED] only spoke Spanish, so [REDACTED] translated Spanish to English for me.

The only information [REDACTED] wanted to convey was that she had contact with Nicolas earlier the same day, approximately 1230 hours. [REDACTED] said she went to Nicolas' residence because he needed to leave, which she thought was because of a domestic problem. [REDACTED] said she saw Nicolas had a bandana around an injury on his right leg below his knee. It did not seem clear where [REDACTED] believed the injury came from.

[REDACTED] told me she just wanted to make sure Nicolas was not injured more than the leg injury she already knew about. I informed her that I was not able to provide too much information, but confirmed he did not have any other injuries I was aware of.

[REDACTED] expressed her disappointment with Nicolas because he is supposed to be taking care of the family business and he keeps getting in trouble. When I asked about other trouble she was referring to, [REDACTED] explained how Nicolas had a court date for April, 2014, where he was going to be arrested for a domestic abuse case he already had. [REDACTED] didn't have any further details on this case.

This interview was digitally recorded with my Tustin PD issued PUMA recorder and later downloaded to the PUMA system at Tustin PD as evidence.

Statements of Physicians Assistant [REDACTED] [REDACTED]:

District Attorney Investigator Ryan Smith and I interviewed PA [REDACTED] once she completed care for Vizcarra. Physician Assistant [REDACTED] said she is contracted as a part time PA at Western Medical center. PA [REDACTED] said she has over twenty years of experience in the medical field.

PA [REDACTED] treated Vizcarra and is under the supervision of Dr. [REDACTED] M.D. PA [REDACTED] said Dr. [REDACTED] did not see Vizcarra, only was available in the event PA [REDACTED] needed a consult.

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PA [REDACTED] said Vizcarra entered the ER with a gunshot wound to his right leg, below the knee. PA [REDACTED] said there were also two small lacerations just below the gunshot wound. They gave Vizcarra a tetanus shot, a shot of Ancef, which is an antibiotic, x-rayed the leg, cleaned and dressed the wound.

PA [REDACTED] said the x-ray did not show a projectile, so she asked Vizcarra where the bullet was. Vizcarra told her he took it out shortly after 0800 hours at a friend's house. Vizcarra said he used a butter knife to remove the bullet. PA [REDACTED] said she recalled Vizcarra telling her it was a 9mm bullet.

PA [REDACTED] said she felt Vizcarra's feet and noticed one was considerably colder than the other. This is a concern of a vascular injury. PA [REDACTED] ordered a CT scan where she needed to inject dye into Vizcarra to be able to see the veins in his leg to make sure he did not have any vascular injuries. PA [REDACTED] needed to take a blood sample to make sure Vizcarra's body could accept this form of treatment. This is when Vizcarra refused further medical treatment. Vizcarra said he did not want to lose any more blood. Several medical staff members attempted to convince Vizcarra to allow the treatment, but he was adamant with his decision.

PA [REDACTED] said there were no other medications given to Vizcarra and no blood was draw. Vizcarra signed a refusal to medical treatment form at which point he was released from Western Medical Center.

Orange County Sheriff Crime Lab technician:

Prior to Vizcarra's release from the hospital, L. Camacho from the Orange County Crime Lab responded to take photographs of Vizcarra. Camacho took several photographs of Vizcarra, including numerous photographs with measurements of the wound to his right leg.

Once Camacho completed her photographs, Officer Girgenti and I transported Vizcarra to Tustin PD for further questioning by Detective Nguyen.

Statements of Tustin Communications Officer Trainee Alysia Cornell:

I contacted Cornell at Tustin PD. DA Investigator Smith and I interviewed her at Tustin PD in the briefing room. Cornell was on a civilian ride along with Officer Gonzalez on Sunday, March 2, 2014. Cornell said she was standing with Officer Gonzalez while he spoke with the family of Vizcarra from a call of a family disturbance.

Cornell said Officer Gonzalez was speaking with Vizcarra's mother in law and Vizcarra's [REDACTED] at the 1142 Scherer PI apartment A address. Cornell said they

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had been at the residence since approximately 1630 hours. Cornell said Officer Gonzalez had an earpiece for his radio and at some point during his interview with Vizcarra's family said with urgency that he had to go and ran out of the residence.

Cornell said she followed Officer Gonzalez out the front door and ran toward their marked Tustin police unit. Officer Gonzalez did not run to the police vehicle however, and continued to run eastbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl. Cornell did not know what was happening because she was not able to hear the police radio, so she stopped at Officer Gonzalez' police vehicle.

Cornell said, as she stood at the police vehicle she saw a SUV type of vehicle turn from northbound Carfax Dr. to westbound Scherer Pl. Cornell described the vehicle's speed as fast, but was not able to articulate why she thought it was fast. She did not recall hearing engine noise or the sound of screeching tires as the SUV turned the corner, only that it appeared to be moving fast.

Cornell said the SUV turned the corner and once it made the turn it went up onto the sidewalk. Cornell said there were no vehicles in the street blocking the SUV's path, so she didn't know what the purpose of going on the sidewalk was. This was the same sidewalk Officer Gonzalez was on running in the direction of the SU■

Cornel said Officer Gonzalez was in full Tustin PD uniform with patches and his badge on with no obstructions. Cornel said Officer Gonzalez was wearing long a long sleeve uniform shirt. Cornel said based on her view of Officer Gonzalez, his police uniform made clear that he was a uniformed police officer. Cornell said the SUV was much closer to Officer Gonzalez then she was and believed the driver of the SUV would have a better view of the police uniform.

Cornell said she saw the SUV approximately one parcel property from Officer Gonzalez when it turned north off the sidewalk onto Scherer Pl. Cornell said she did not hear anything, such as Officer Gonzalez' verbal commands, the noise from the SUV's engine, or anything else that might have been audible in the area. Cornel said she thought the SUV turned away from Officer Gonzalez' direction right before she heard gunshots. Cornell said she heard two to three gunshots. Cornell took cover behind the police vehicle when she heard the gunshots and did not see where the gunfire came from, nor did she see anything that happened for the next several minutes. When Cornell surfaced from her cover position, Vizcarra was in handcuffs.

During this interview, Cornell used a piece of paper to draw the direction of travel and vehicle positioning to help explain her recollection of the incident. I later

Cornell did not have any further information at this time. This interview was digitally recorded with my PUMA digital recorder and was later downloaded to the PUMA system at Tustin PD as evidence.

NARRATIVE

On 03-02-14 at approx. 1900 hours, I received a telephone call from Sergeant S. Nichols #1047 regarding an ongoing felony assault investigation that was taking place on Scherer Pl., in Tustin. Sergeant Nichols requested additional CSI personnel to assist with the collection of evidence at the crime scene and asked me to make the appropriate notifications. I contacted PSO T. Aguilar #1226 by telephone and asked him to respond to Tustin PD to assist with the investigation. I responded from home and arrived at the police department at approx. 2010 hours. I received a preliminary briefing of the incident from Sergeant J. Cartwright #718, who informed me that a command post had been established near the intersection of Walnut Ave. and Del Amo Ave. I sent PSO Aguilar to the command post to take temporary possession of physical evidence (clothing belonging to suspect Nicolas Vizcarra) that had previously been collected by PSO J. Camacho #1250 (please refer to PSO Aguilar's report for more information regarding the clothing collected from PSO Camacho). I responded to the Santa Ana Western Medical Center with a paper jumpsuit and slippers for Vizcarra who was preparing to be discharged from the emergency room.

When I arrived at Western Medical Center, I met with Officer B. Girgenti #1194 inside of the emergency room. While there, I learned that Crime Scene Investigators from the OC Sheriff's Department would be handling the officer involved shooting and processing Vizcarra for injuries/evidence. I left the paper jumpsuit with Girgenti and drove to the command post on Walnut Ave.

When I arrived at the command post, I received an additional briefing with OC Sheriff's Crime Lab personnel. After that briefing, PSO Aguilar handed the paper evidence bag containing Vizcarra's clothing to an OCSD Forensic Specialist who was handling the shooting investigation (see PSO Aguilar's report for details). I spoke with Sergeant Wright and he explained that Tustin PD Detectives would be serving a search warrant on the vehicle Vizcarra was driving, and at Vizcarra's residence at [REDACTED] later that same evening. PSO Aguilar and I stood by while the search warrant was being prepared/signed.

On 03-03-14 at approx. 0030 hours, PSO Aguilar and I assisted Detective E. Haug #1124 during the execution of the search warrant on Vizcarra's vehicle. We were signed-in at the crime scene log checkpoint and once we were inside the tape line, I began photographing the vehicle for documentation purposes. I took photographs depicting the interior and exterior of the vehicle as it appeared at the time of the search warrant service. OCSD Forensic Specialists had already placed transparent tape over the vehicle's rear windows (the window glass in

the rear left and right side doors) to hold the shattered glass in place. The photographs depict the vehicle's rear cargo compartment, and the relative position of the vehicle as it came to rest on Scherer Pl. It should be noted that the suspect vehicle is a gold, 2004 Cadillac Escalade with California license plates ending in #838.

Detective Haug and T. Lomeli #1206 searched the vehicle at the crime scene. PSO Aguilar and I collected the following items as evidence at their request:

Item #3: An Apple I-Phone from the rear bumper of the Cadillac Escalade

Item #4: An open envelope with the name, "Nicolas Vizcarra" in handwriting from the rear seats

Item #5: US Currency totaling \$21.83 from the asphalt along the passenger's side of the vehicle

Item #6: A plastic baggy containing approx. 25 grams of suspected marijuana

I photographed each of the aforementioned items prior to collection, for documentation purposes. I packaged all of the items for transport to Tustin PD.

While Detective Lomeli and Haug were conducting their search of the suspect vehicle, they found a black and silver semi-automatic handgun in the front passenger compartment. The firearm, which was housed in a black plastic carrying case at the time of its discovery, was collected by OCSF Forensic Specialists for evidentiary purposes. The firearm was temporarily displayed on the passenger's side front seat and subsequently appears in some of the photographs I took during the service of the search warrant. However, I did not collect any firearms/ballistics evidence at the Scherer Pl. crime scene.

After we completed our search of the Cadillac Escalade (suspect vehicle), PSO Aguilar and I followed Detectives Haug, Lomeli and P. Hardacre #692 to [REDACTED] to collect additional evidence related to the search warrant. I photographed the apartment building and its surroundings for documentation purposes. I photographed the front driveway and parking areas, the attached garage, the wooden gate at the east side of the property, the walkways and alleyways, and the front doors and windows of apartment [REDACTED]. Once inside, I photographed the living room, the interior hallways(s), the kitchen, the dining area and the master bedroom (east bedroom). I also photographed the fenced-in rear patio area that runs along the east side of apartment [REDACTED].

During the search, Detective Hardacre explained that Vizcarra discharged a handgun in the rear patio area on 03-02-14. The bullet struck the base of a small tree that is growing along the southern-most fence line, near the glass slider that separates the rear patio from the interior dining room. Detective Hardacre showed me the initial bullet strike; a portion of the thin tree trunk that had been blown apart by the projectile. She then directed me to a small hole located at the bottom edge of a wooden fence plank, directly behind the damaged tree trunk (on the southern-most fence line). That secondary strike mark, or bullet hole in the fence, is closer to the ground than the first point of impact (the tree trunk) which might indicate that the bullet was traveling on a downward trajectory. The high-to-low bullet strikes seem to suggest the shooter was firing downward in a southerly direction from the rear patio area of apartment [REDACTED].

I photographed the bullet strikes/holes found in the rear patio. I placed forensic markers at the following locations to aid with the identification of the bullet strikes/holes:

Marker #1: Damage near the base of the tree trunk

Marker #2: Suspected bullet hole at the bottom edge of the affected wooden fence plank

I searched the dirt planters located on either side of the south fence for the spent round (believed to be a .40 caliber round), but met with negative results.

At Detective Lomeli's request, I photographed several images that were being displayed on the flat-screen television in the master bedroom. The live images were being fed to the television by a fixed surveillance camera that is mounted over the garage door at Vizcarra's apartment. At Sergeant Wright's request, I photographed the interior of the garage for documentation purposes. I later downloaded all my digital photographs, along with the photographs PSO Aguilar took in this case, onto a CD-R disc for secure storage. I booked the CD-R disc into the Tustin PD Evidence Room.

I booked Items #3-6 into the Tustin PD Evidence Room, as evidence in the PC 245c investigation (please refer to the attached Property Reports fo further details).

I request that a copy of this supplemental report be forwarded to the OC District Attorney's office for review.

NARRATIVE

On 03-02-14 at approximately 1815 hours, I responded to the area of Scherer Place and Carfax Drive in the City of Tustin at the request of Sgt. J. TAYLOR #1062 to photograph and process evidence in this case. Sgt. TAYLOR told me the following.

Sgt. TAYLOR said a Cadillac Escalade was going northbound on Carfax Drive toward Scherer Place. The vehicle made a left onto westbound Scherer and drove across the sidewalk and lawns. There was an officer involved shooting in front of 1182 Scherer Place and a collision between an officer's vehicle and the suspect's vehicle in the middle of the street at the same location. The suspect was driving a silver Cadillac Escalade. Sgt. TAYLOR said there was damage to the silver Cadillac Escalade, a white Ford F-150 pickup truck and a silver Honda Civic. All vehicles involved were still on scene. Sgt. TAYLOR requested I take overall photographs of the scene, vehicles involved and shell casings.

I began by taking overall photographs of the scene from Carfax Drive. I could see tire tracks on the sidewalk and in the grass along the eastside of 1192 Scherer Place. I continued photographing Scherer Place as I walked westbound toward Del Amo Avenue. I then walked to the intersection of Del Amo Avenue and Walnut Avenue and began photographing southbound on Del Amo Avenue. I photographed the intersection of Del Amo Avenue and Scherer Place by panning from right to left. I continued taking overall photographs of the scene as I walked eastbound on Scherer Place. I took

overall photographs of the collision between the front of Tustin Police Department unit #23 and the front driver side door of the Cadillac Escalade.

I proceeded to the eastside of 1192 Scherer Place and took overall photographs of the tire tracks on the sidewalk and grass. I then took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of four shell casings located on the sidewalk in front of 1182 Scherer Place. I took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of a notepad and Field Interview card which were located on the ground near the front passenger side door of TPD unit #23.

I took overall photographs of the exterior of the Cadillac Escalade as I found it. I took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of the front driver side door, damage to the rear driver side window and damage to the rear passenger side window. I photographed a \$20.00 bill and loose change on the ground near the front passenger door of the vehicle.

I located the white Ford F-150 pickup truck parked along the NCL of Scherer Place, along the south side of 14561 Carfax Drive. I took overall photographs of the exterior of the Ford F-150 pickup truck as I found it. I took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of the damage to the front windshield of the Ford F-150 pickup truck.

I located the silver Honda Civic parked in the north driveway of [REDACTED] Officer M. CARTER #1249 told me the Honda Civic was parked along the ECL in front of [REDACTED] at the time of the incident, however the owner moved the vehicle into the driveway. I photographed the front of [REDACTED] I then took overall photographs of the exterior of the Honda Civic as I found it. I took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of the damage on the right side of the rear bumper.

Sgt. TAYLOR told me he located additional damage to the passenger side mirror of TPD unit #23. I took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of the passenger side mirror. I also took overall, intermediate and close-up photographs of three pieces of what appeared to be fragments from the mirror located on the ground near the front passenger door of TPD unit #23.

At approximately 2015 hours, I responded to the Incident Command Post located in the parking lot at 1112 Walnut Avenue. Upon arrival I met with Officer A. GLEASON #1223 and he told me the following.

Officer GLEASON said he had a white plastic bag that contained the suspect's clothing which was cut off of the suspect while he was in the ambulance. Officer GLEASON gave me the white plastic bag and I placed it in a large brown paper bag. I secured the bag in Tustin Police Department unit #846. At approximately 2055 hours, PSO T. AGUILAR #1226 responded to the Incident Command Post and took possession of the bag which contained the suspect's clothing.

All photographs were downloaded onto a disc. The disc was booked into Property as evidence.







Cephalexin (brand: Keflex, Keftab) is a cephalosporin type of antibiotic.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

This medicine may be taken with or without food. If you find that it upsets your stomach, take it with food. Take the medicine at regular intervals. If the label says "every 6 hours," this means 4 times per day. Doses do not have to be exactly 6 hours apart, but you should take 4 doses a day. If the label says "every 8 hours," this means 3 times a day.

Take all of the medicine until it is gone, even if you are feeling better. This will ensure that the infection is fully treated.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR:

**VACCINE INFORMATION: TETANUS, DIPHTHERIA, PERTUSSIS - Td and Tdap
(Adult)**

ABOUT THE DISEASES

Tetanus (lockjaw), diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough) are serious diseases. Tetanus is caused by bacteria that enter the body through a cut or wound. Diphtheria and pertussis occur when bacteria pass from an infected person to the nose or throat of another person.

Tetanus can cause:

- Stiffness ("locking") of the jaw so that you cannot swallow or open your mouth
- Painful spasms of the muscles all over the body
- Death

Diphtheria can cause:

- Sore throat, thick coating in the nose, throat, or air passages
- Breathing problems, heart failure
- Paralysis, death

Pertussis can cause:

- Cold or flu-like symptoms, including sneezing, runny nose, fever, and a mild cough
- Severe coughing spells that can last for several weeks and cause choking and vomiting
- Pneumonia
- Seizures (jerking and staring spells)
- Brain damage, death

ABOUT THE VACCINES

Getting vaccinated is the best way to protect against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis. You have received one of the following vaccines:

These vaccines are given to persons in the following situations:

- As a catch-up, if they didn't get all the doses of the vaccine when they were children
- As a booster shot every 10 years
- To protect against tetanus infection after getting a cut or wound

Before getting the Td or Tdap vaccine, tell the healthcare provider about any of the following:

- An allergic reaction or other problem after getting any tetanus, diphtheria, or pertussis vaccine
- You now have a moderate or severe illness (if you have a minor illness, such as a cold, you may be vaccinated)
- You had a seizure or nervous system problem such as Guillain Barré syndrome

- As with any medicine, there is a very small risk that a serious problem could occur after getting a vaccine.

GUNSHOT WOUND

Your exam today did not show injury to any deep organs or tissues. Sometimes a deeper injury may not be found during the first exam; so, watch for the signs below. If bullet fragments are left in place, it is because removing them may cause more injury to the nearby tissues. If a fragment is left in place, scar tissue will form around it. Once healing is complete, fragments usually do not cause any symptoms.

HOME CARE:

- Keep the wound clean and dry. If a **bandage** was applied and it becomes wet or dirty, replace it. Otherwise, leave it in place for the first 24 hours.
- If the wound was left **open** or if **sutures** were used, clean the wound daily: -- After removing the bandage, wash the area with soap and water.
- After cleaning, apply a thin layer of Neosporin or Bacitracin ointment. This will keep the wound moist and make it easier to remove the stitches. Reapply the bandage.
- You may shower as usual after the first 24 hours, but do not soak the area in water (no tub baths or swimming) until the sutures are removed.

- If a **Steri-Strips tape closure** was used, keep the area clean and dry. If it becomes wet, blot it dry with a towel. After the Steri-Strips have been removed it is safe to resume your usual activities.
- If **bleeding** occurs from the wound, cover with a gauze or towel and apply firm direct pressure without letting go for 5 full minutes by the clock. This gives time for a clot to form. If this does not stop bleeding, return to the hospital promptly.
- You may use acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil) to control pain, unless another pain medicine was prescribed. [NOTE: If you have chronic liver or kidney disease or ever had a stomach ulcer or GI bleeding, talk with your doctor before using these medicines.]
- After a gunshot wound, it is normal to have many strong and unexpected feelings. Shock, fear, depression, blame and anger are all very common and normal feelings. There may also be: -- General sense of anxiety and fear about your safety
 - Recurring thoughts or nightmares about the event
 - Trouble sleeping or changes in appetite
 - Feeling depressed, sad or low in energy
 - Irritable or easily upset
 - Feeling the need to avoid activities, places or people that remind you of the event

FOLLOW UP: Most skin wounds heal within ten days. However, even with proper treatment, a wound infection may occur. Check the wound daily for signs of infection listed below. Stitches should be removed from the face within five days; stitches should be removed from other parts of the body within 7-14 days. If Steri-Strips were used, remove them yourself after seven days unless told otherwise.

If emotional or mental symptoms last more than 3 weeks, you may have a more serious traumatic stress reaction. Follow up with your doctor or a counselor or psychotherapist. There are treatments that can help.

[NOTE: A radiologist will review any X-rays taken. We will notify you of any new findings that may affect your care.]

After clearing the residence to ensure no one was hurt inside, I observed what appeared to be a shell casing on the ground, in the back patio. The casing was in front of the rear glass slider and the glass slider was opened.

As I looked closer at the casing, I noticed it appeared new. It had a high shine and was free of dirt and debris. Therefore, it did not appear as though it had been there for long. I looked at the back of the casing and saw that it may have been a .40 caliber round casing.

I advised Officer Gonzalez of my finding and I immediately began taking photographs of the scene.




While taking photographs, Officer Gonzalez and I saw what appeared to be a fresh piece of wood, missing from the bottom of the wooden fence. 
Officer Gonzalez and I checked the area for signs of the bullet and its possible direction of travel, however, we could not locate it.





I checked the neighboring apartments to check for possible injuries and I did not encounter anyone injured. Officer Gonzalez took possession of the .40 Cal casing at the scene.



On 03/05/2014 at approximately 0800 hours, I responded to the OCCL along with Officer Newton. I met with DA Investigator Wood and Senior Forensic Specialist Lazo in order to process the vehicle. While processing the vehicle, three (3) one hundred dollar bills (\$300.00) were located in the center console. This money was later released to Vizcarra's wife, [REDACTED], by Officer Newton. I also retained a SIM card with adaptor and three photographs as evidence. Those items were booked at TPD as evidence.

After the vehicle was processed, Investigator Wood authorized the release of the vehicle. I requested Metro Pro Towing respond to OCCL in order to tow the vehicle to their yard (see attached Vehicle Report).

Upon arrival back to TPD, I completed a request to the Department of Justice / ATF in order to have a record check conducted on the firearm that was collected from Vizcarra's vehicle on 03/03/2014. This request was submitted due to a TPD record check revealing no information on the weapon (see attached National Tracing Center Trace Request).

I also completed an OCCL evidence examination to facilitate the processing of Vizcarra's firearm. This request was for a function check, and to see if the 40 caliber casing found in Vizcarra's residence matched to the 40 caliber gun located in Vizcarra's vehicle (see attached OCCL work request).



I am currently employed as a sworn peace officer for the Tustin Police Department and am assigned to the Tustin Police Department's General Investigation - Major Crimes Unit. I am the assigned Investigator for CR #14-01120.

INVESTIGATIVE FOLLOW-UP

On Tuesday, 03/04/2014, at approximately 0853 hours, Detective C. Kirwan and I proceeded to the area of 1142 Scherer Place and conducted a walk-through of the area. I stood in the front parking area and observed a small surveillance camera mounted on the eaves above the north-facing garage door. I walked toward the north side of the residential building and noticed an opening in the wooden fence line which allowed for pedestrian access to the rear of the building. The opening was not secured and allowed open access from the front of the residence toward the rear.

As I followed the pathway and reached the northwest corner of the residential building, I noticed the path split to the right (north) and to the left (south). The pathway which lead to the north continued passed the rear of several other residential buildings on Del Amo Avenue. The pathway which lead to the south provided access to an open grassy area containing a trampoline and two unsecured laundry rooms. Just passed the trampoline was a metal gate and a wooden fence which separated 1142 Scherer Place from separate residential buildings located just south of the location. On the west side, an approximately 5 ½ - 6 foot block wall separated the grassy area of 1142 Scherer Place from the Tustin Hospital parking lot.

At the base of the block wall were two metal chairs which were stacked on top of each other. There was a muddy foot print on the seat of the top chair which indicated someone had possibly used the chairs as leverage to climb the wall into the Tustin Hospital parking lot. On the east side, the pathway continued toward the rear patio of 1142 Scherer Place, [REDACTED] Unit [REDACTED] rear patio was secured with an approximately 5 ½ - 6 foot brown, wooden fence. Along the lower edge of the wooden fence was a fresh hole and break mark.

Detective Kirwan and I walked the area in search of any additional evidence; however, we did not find any. I photographed the area and later copied the images to a compact disk which I booked into Tustin PD Property as evidence.

Detective Kirwan and I then proceeded to 1192 Scherer Place to conduct a walk-through of the area of the east driveway which PSO Camacho photographed on 03/02/2014. I stood in the driveway and saw tire tracks leading northbound along the west side walk of Carfax Drive toward the south sidewalk of Scherer Place. I noted the address so I could later attempt to contact any possible witnesses who may have been standing in the driveway or near the garage at the time Officer Gleason attempted to conduct a high risk vehicle stop of Vizcarra's Escalade.

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Detective Kirwan and I then proceeded to the area of the Tustin Hospital (14642 Newport Avenue, Tustin, CA 92780) and conducted a walk-through of the area. I walked toward the northeast corner of the hospital parking lot and found a wooden pallet propped up against the block wall which separated the east side of the hospital property from the residences off of Scherer Place and Del Amo Avenue. Detective Kirwan and I walked the east and south perimeters of the hospital property and did not locate any additional evidence. I photographed the northeast area of the hospital parking lot and later copied the images to a compact disk which I booked into Tustin PD Property as evidence.

On Tuesday, 03/04/2014, at approximately 1137 hours, OCDA Investigator B. Hester and I conducted a secondary walk-through of 1142 Scherer Place and 14642 Newport Avenue in the City of Tustin).

On Thursday, 03/06/2014, at approximately 1116 hours, OCDA Investigator B. Hester and I proceeded to [REDACTED], in the City of Aliso Viejo, in an attempt to speak to witness [REDACTED]. There was no answer at the door; however, OCDA Investigator Hester left his business card for further follow up.

On 03/06/2014, at approximately 1146 hours, OCDA Investigator Hester and I proceeded to 1192 Scherer Place and attempted to contact the residents at unit [REDACTED]. The front window was open and I heard movement coming from inside the unit, however, there was no answer at the door. OCDA Investigator Hester left his business card at the door for further follow up.

We then proceeded to 1142 Scherer Place, unit [REDACTED] in the City of Tustin and although the front window was open and although I had seen a small child walking around inside the unit just moments prior, the interior of the apartment was now quiet and there was no answer at the front door. OCDA Investigator Hester left a business card at the door for further follow up.

Subject Statements - [REDACTED]

We then proceeded to 1142 Scherer Place, unit [REDACTED] in the City of Tustin and a female resident answered the door and identified herself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she returned home on 03/02/2014 at approximately 2100 hours and no one else was home except her brother who had come to visit her and was waiting outside her residence. When [REDACTED] returned home, she did see police cars out front but she did not know what had happened. When [REDACTED] spoke to her brother, [REDACTED] he told her he saw what happened.

[REDACTED] did not know if [REDACTED] spoke to the police on 03/02/2014. [REDACTED] knew [REDACTED] lived in the City of Santa Ana, but she did not know his home address. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] also did not have a cellphone or home telephone number and the only way she knew to get a hold of him was when he visited her at her home. [REDACTED] felt the

residents in unit [REDACTED] saw what happened since they were already sitting outside in the front of the residential building when she returned home.

[REDACTED] said she was familiar with "Nick" because she was acquaintances with Nick's wife, [REDACTED] and she has spoken to Nick's mother in law in the past. [REDACTED] has known Nick for approximately 4 years and they live near each other. [REDACTED] stated Nick has gotten in trouble with the police before and although she has not seen him commit any violent acts drives his truck "fast" regardless of the fact that there are "kids" outside all the time. OCDA Investigator Hester left his business card with [REDACTED] and asked her to have [REDACTED] call and speak to Detective C. Kirwan.

OCDA Investigator Hester and I proceeded to 1142 Scherer Place, unit [REDACTED] in the City of Tustin and there was no answer. OCDA Investigator Hester left a business card at the door for further follow up. I recorded the canvass using my department-issued digital audio recorder and uploaded the audio file into the Tustin PD server as evidence. For [REDACTED] full statements, see *PUMA Job #1926*.

Witness Statements – Officer Royce DelMerari

On Monday, 03/10/2014, at approximately 1453 hours, OCDA Investigator B. Hester, Attorney S. Welch, and I proceeded to the Tustin Police Department upstairs interview room and completed an interview with Officer R. DelMerari, #1227. The following is a summary of Officer DelMerari's voluntary statements:

Officer DelMerari has been employed with the Tustin Police Department as a Police Officer for approximately two years and is currently assigned to the south area Patrol Division. His assigned shift included Saturdays, Sundays, and Mondays from 0600-1830 hours. On 03/02/2014, Officer DelMerari was working his assigned shift, in uniform, with the call sign designator of "221" and personnel number of "1227".

On the morning of 03/02/2014, Officer DelMerari heard Tustin PD Communications dispatch officers to 1142 Scherer Place, [REDACTED] because a male subject, identified as Nicolas Vizcarra, was acting strangely, aggressive, combative with family members, and had been possibly making threats. When officers arrived at this call, Vizcarra had already fled and officers did not locate him in the area. Officer DelMerari advised he did not respond to this original call for service.

Later the same day, at approximately 1630 hours, Officer DelMerari was dispatched to (1142 Scherer Place [REDACTED] for a second response to a domestic violence/family disturbance call. Tustin PD Communications advised Vizcarra had returned to the residence, removed a handgun from a box, and fired the weapon within the residence while in the presence of other family members and children. While in route to the residence, Tustin PD Communications Officers advised Vizcarra had left the residence, however, the reporting party did not know if Vizcarra left in a vehicle or by foot and whether or not the handgun was still in Vizcarra's possession.

Officer DelMerari was familiar with Vizcarra due to a previous contact with him. Approximately one to one and a half years ago, Officer DelMerari assisted in serving an arrest warrant for Vizcarra and multiple other officers assisted in the operation because Vizcarra was known to be combative and resistive. Due to the nature of today's call for service, Officer Muro, Officer Gonzalez, and Sergeant Taylor also responded to 1142 Scherer Place [REDACTED]

When Officer DelMerari arrived on scene, he, Officer Muro, and Sergeant Taylor conducted a protective sweep of the residence and did not locate Vizcarra. Officer DelMerari spoke with the reporting party and identified her as Vizcarra's mother in law [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] appeared scared and panicked and told Officer Delmerari she was fearful Vizcarra would return to the residence and she did not know what he would do. The reporting party allowed Officer DelMerari and responding officers to search the residence for Vizcarra as well as the handgun. During the search, Officer DelMerari located a .40 caliber shell casing in the residence's rear patio area. The shell casing was found near a hole in the patio fence.

Fearing Vizcarra would return to the residence at any moment with a firearm, Officer DelMerari proceeded out to the front of the residence to provide security while Officer Gonzalez photographed and collected the shell casing from the rear patio. At approximately 1800 hours, Officer Gleason broadcast that Vizcarra had returned to the area in a Cadillac Escalade. Officer Gleason advised the vehicle was northbound Carfax Drive from Sycamore Avenue, and was headed back toward the residence. Officer Del Merari started his patrol vehicle, pulled his patrol vehicle out of the residence's driveway onto Scherer Place, and began driving eastbound toward Officer Gleason's last know location on Carfax Drive.

As Officer DelMerari was pulling his patrol vehicle out of the driveway, he saw Officer Gonzalez running eastbound along the south sidewalk of Scherer Place. After driving approximately 100 feet eastbound onto Scherer Place, Officer DelMerari saw headlights shining on the south sidewalk of Scherer Place. Approximately half a second later, Officer DelMerari heard the sound of gunshots, but did not know where the gun was being fired from or who was being fired at.

Approximately half a second later, an Escalade exited off the south sidewalk of Scherer Place onto the street and in front of Officer DelMerari's patrol vehicle. The vehicle had been traveling westbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer Place at a speed of approximately 20-25 miles per hour. Officer DelMerari slammed on his brakes and came to a stop, blocking the Escalade from continuing westbound on Scherer Place. The Escalade also came to a stop and Officer DelMerari allowed his patrol vehicle to roll forward at an idle speed to make contact with the Escalade's driver's door. Officer DelMerari pinned the Escalade's driver's door shut with the front bumper of his patrol vehicle because he wanted to prevent the suspect from exiting through the door, it would give Officer DelMerari the opportunity to exit his own vehicle, create distance, and move to cover, which at that point he had none of.

Due to Officer DelMerari's prior contact with Vizcarra coupled with the photograph he received of Vizcarra from earlier in the day, Officer DelMerari recognized the driver of the Escalade to be Vizcarra. Officer DelMerari drew his firearm and gave Vizcarra multiple orders to show his hands. Vizcarra complied and showed his hands. Officer DelMerari, Officer Gleason, Officer Nguyen, Officer Wright, Officer Ramierz, and Officer Gonzalez all assisted in removing Vizcarra from the vehicle through the right front passenger door. Vizcarra was wearing dark colored shorts and a dark colored top.

Officer DelMerari handcuffed Vizcarra and searched him for weapons. During the search, Officer DelMerari found a bloody bandana and a piece of plastic wrapped around Vizcarra's right shin. Officer DelMerari asked Vizcarra why he was bleeding and Vizcarra told Officer DelMerari he "got shot". Officer DelMerari asked Vizcarra when he got shot and Vizcarra answered, "earlier". Vizcarra then told Officer DelMerari, "I got shot at twice today."

Officer Delmerari sat Vizcarra up and asked him if he was shot anywhere else and he said, "No." Officer DelMerari asked Vizcarra if he was hurt, if he could breathe, and checked Vizcarra again to see if there were any other visible injuries or gunshot wounds, but there were none. Vizcarra was unresponsive and "out of it". Officer DelMerari released Vizcarra to Officer Nguyen's custody and was transported to the Tustin Police Department.

I recorded Officer DelMerari's statements using my department-issued digital audio recorder and uploaded the audio file into the Tustin PD server as evidence. For Officer DelMerari's full statements, refer to **PUMA Job #1941**.

INVESTIGATIVE NARRATIVE:

I am a Detective with the Tustin Police Department assigned to the Major Crimes Unit within the General Investigations Detail. This case involves the assault with a deadly weapon on a Police Officer. The original report was taken on 03/02/14 and this is a supplemental interview that was conducted after my original report was turned in.

On 03/03/14, I phoned [REDACTED] and asked her if she could bring her daughter, [REDACTED] into the Police Department so that we could speak to her. [REDACTED] agreed and said she would bring her on 03/04/14 after [REDACTED] was out of school. I contacted Loren Dawson who responded to TPD on 03/04/14 and assisted with the interview. Below is a synopsis of the interview that was recorded on my Puma recorder and later uploaded to our server. [REDACTED] mom, [REDACTED] requested to be present during the interview with [REDACTED] and was in the room with us.

INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] confirmed that on 03/02/14, she was home part of the day and that part of the day she was gone from the apartment. DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she was home during the day when a gun might have been fired and she said no.

[REDACTED] said she did talk to her dad that day and that he had told her to go get the keys for her mom's van so he could get his phone charger out. [REDACTED] said her dad, Nicolas Vizcarra, told her he was going to go rent a Hotel room. [REDACTED] asked him why he was doing that and said he told her he was "lonely" and that he had been shot and then left. [REDACTED] estimated this occurred about 1530-1600 hours. DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if her dad told her anything else about how he got shot and she said no.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she saw any injuries on him and she said, "He showed me". [REDACTED] said her dad, Vizcarra, showed her the "hole in the leg". DA Inv. Dawson asked her where the hole was and she said it was right below the knee. [REDACTED] said the hole was on Vizcarra's right leg and pointed to the area below her knee cap. [REDACTED] said it was on his shin area and she could see a little bit of blood around it. [REDACTED] said he had a blue and white bandana around it covering it. DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she could see his bone in the hole and she said she couldn't. [REDACTED] denied seeing any blood coming out of the hole and denied seeing a "bullet" in the hole. [REDACTED] estimated that the hole was the size of a nickel. [REDACTED] didn't notice any other injuries on Vizcarra and said he didn't talk about it or where he had gotten shot.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she remembered what time she woke up on Sunday and she said Vizcarra woke them up about 0630 hours. [REDACTED] first said he had woken them up to go to church then corrected herself and said they didn't go to church until the afternoon but confirmed he woke her up about 0630 in the morning.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she had a chance to look at his leg then and she said, "No, he didn't have it". [REDACTED] said Vizcarra didn't have the bandana around his leg at that time and said she didn't look at his leg at that time. I asked [REDACTED] if Vizcarra was wearing pant or shorts and she said pants. [REDACTED] said in the afternoon, Vizcarra had on shorts. [REDACTED] said in the morning, Vizcarra had on pants. When he saw the police cars, he changed into shorts. [REDACTED] estimated this occurred about 0650 hours. DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she knew why the Police had come to her house and she said it was because he had loud music on and he smelled like Marijuana. [REDACTED] confirmed that it was her mom who had called TPD in the morning.

[REDACTED] said Vizcarra had on a "muscle shirt" (tank top), black shorts and sandals when he left the apartment. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra told her that he "had to go" but she didn't know where he went. [REDACTED] said she saw Vizcarra leave and said he left through his bedroom slider. [REDACTED] didn't see Vizcarra with any guns or weapons when he left the apartment. [REDACTED] said when she saw Vizcarra switch from his pants to his shorts, she didn't see him have anything on his leg or see a bandana on his leg.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she knew when he came back home and she said she did but wasn't home at the time. DA Inv. Dawson asked her where she had gone and she said she had left to go look for him to see if he was at a hotel.

[REDACTED] explained that the kids had returned home from church about 1400 hours from their uncle's house and then left to go rent movies. [REDACTED] explained that after they returned, Vizcarra showed up to the apartment and that was when he asked [REDACTED] to get the keys to the van so he could get his phone charger. [REDACTED] explained that Vizcarra also returned after they had gone to get movies and was when he went to get something from the refrigerator.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if Vizcarra was wearing the same clothes in the morning that he was wearing when he returned in the afternoon for the phone charger and she said he was.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she ever heard any incident with the Police and Vizcarra during the day either on the streets or outside the apartment and she said no. [REDACTED] denied ever seeing Vizcarra arrested by the Police or seeing anyone firing any guns on the street when Vizcarra was around. [REDACTED] also denied she ever heard any gunshots.

I told [REDACTED] I had been told that when she was at the van with Vizcarra he had given her some money and she said he gave her \$200.00. [REDACTED] explained that her brother plays soccer and made 3 goals so Vizcarra told him he would give him \$125.00. [REDACTED] said she made 1 goal so Vizcarra gave her \$50.00 and the rest of the money was for her mom [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said it had already been decided prior to her getting the charger out of the car for Vizcarra. [REDACTED] said that was the first time she had played

soccer so she hadn't gotten any money from him before. [REDACTED] said her brother has gotten money from Vizcarra before for scoring goals but said not that much. [REDACTED] said he got that much because his goals "looked good and he shot it".

[REDACTED] said all of her interaction with Vizcarra was outside and said that was where he showed her his wounds. [REDACTED] said her mom ([REDACTED]) had taken her and her siblings over to her uncle's house early in the morning and thought it was about 0730-0800 in the morning. [REDACTED] said her mom took them over there after the Police had been at their apartment early in the morning. [REDACTED] said she didn't really talk to the Police in the morning when they were there but saw them inside their apartment. [REDACTED] confirmed that she stayed away from the apartment from about 0800 hours until about 1400 hours, when she returned home after church. [REDACTED] said they were gone about 30 minutes when they left to go look for Vizcarra at local hotels.

After they went looking for Vizcarra, [REDACTED] said they returned to their apartment. [REDACTED] denied she was there for the rest of the night and said they went over to her sister's Godmother's house about 1700 hours. [REDACTED] said her mom and brother and sister all went over there.

I asked [REDACTED] if the victim had said anything to her when they returned home from looking for him. [REDACTED] then said her brother did tell her that Vizcarra had been at the apartment. [REDACTED] said her grandmother, an aunt, an uncle and the victim were the only ones inside the apartment while they were gone. [REDACTED] said her aunt's name is [REDACTED] and she lives with them. [REDACTED] said her uncle's name is [REDACTED] and he lives in Santa Ana. [REDACTED] was contacted by Officer Gonzalez after Vizcarra had shot the gun and she refused to speak to him. [REDACTED] has not been contacted yet as [REDACTED] did not have his address and phone number available to us. I later contacted [REDACTED] and asked her to speak to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to see if they would be willing to speak with us.

[REDACTED] said earlier in the morning, they were at her other uncle's house who lives near Carfax and Sycamore. [REDACTED] said his name is [REDACTED] and he was previously interviewed by Det. Kirwan. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] is the one who went with her to take the victim to his soccer game.

DA Inv. Dawson asked [REDACTED] if she had ever seen Vizcarra around the house with any guns and she said no. I asked [REDACTED] if Vizcarra works and she said yes. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra works for "Midnight Sweeping" which is a company owned by his mom. [REDACTED] said it's the kind of company where he drives the trucks in large parking lots and sweeps them. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra works all over the place and works during the day time. I told [REDACTED] that in her original interview, she had told us that Vizcarra had left early in the morning to go to work and then had come back. I asked her if that was the work he would have been going to and she said yes.

RESULTS and INTERPRETATIONS:

The cartridge case was determined to have been fired in the Ruger pistol, S/N 340-49608.
The Ruger pistol fired without malfunction in both single and double actions.
No associations were found to the pistol in the OCBULL3T computerized 3D database system.

EXAMINATION:

OCDA Item# DA14-005.1:

The double action Ruger pistol was received unloaded with its magazine removed. Packaged along with the pistol was its 11 cartridge capacity magazine containing 10 Federal brand .40 S&W caliber cartridges, each loaded with a full metal jacketed bullet. A cloth patch for collecting residue was pulled through the barrel and retained. The pistol is equipped with a functional disconnect and manual ambidextrous decocking safety lever. Trigger pull was measured to be 5 3/4 to 6 pounds in single action and approximately 10 pounds in double action. The pistol was impact tested. At no time did the cocked hammer release without direct trigger pressure.

Using ammunition from the laboratory collection and the submitted magazine, the pistol was test fired. The barrel of the pistol has six lands and grooves of rifling with a right twist. Land impression widths on the test fired bullets measure .082 to .084 inch and groove impression widths measure .120 to .121 inch. Both a test fired bullet and cartridge case from the pistol were entered into the OCBULL3T computerized 3D database system.

RESULTS and INTERPRETATIONS:

The semiautomatic Glock pistol fired without malfunction.

All four fired cartridge cases (EM 1-4) were determined to have been fired in the Glock pistol, S/N HNP 519

EXAMINATION:

The Glock pistol was received unloaded with its empty Glock brand 13 cartridge capacity magazine removed. A single cartridge and 9 other cartridges submitted with the pistol are Winchester brand .45 Auto caliber each loaded with either an SXT® or T-Series® jacketed hollow point bullet. A cloth patch for collecting residue was pulled through the barrel. The pistol is equipped with a functional disconnect and trigger safety. Trigger pull was measured to be 7 to 7 1/4 pounds.

Two fully loaded Glock brand 13 cartridge capacity spare magazines were packaged separately. All 26 cartridges from the two spare magazines are Winchester brand .45 Auto caliber, each loaded with either an SXT® or T-Series® jacketed hollow point bullet.

Using the magazine submitted with the pistol and four cartridges packaged with the spare magazines, the pistol was test fired. The barrel of the pistol has eight-sided polygonal rifling with a right twist. Twenty-two cartridges from the spare magazines and ten cartridges packaged with the pistol were repackaged and submitted as two new sub-items.

The four fired cartridge cases (EM 1-4) are .45 Auto caliber Winchester brand. All four were microscopically compared to a test fired cartridge case from the Glock pistol.










I observed the scene was located on Scherer Place between Del Amo Ave and Carfax Drive. It was a residential neighborhood that consisted mainly of townhomes. Scherer Place ran east to west, and Carfax Drive and Del Amo Ave ran north to south. There was a Tustin PD unit #22 parked in the drive way entrance to 1162 Scherer Place, near the cross of Del Amo Ave. Headed east on Scherer Place, there were four silver cartridge cases. Three cartridge cases were on the south sidewalk/edge of grass near 1182 Scherer Place. One cartridge case was in the gutter at the driveway entrance to 1182.

TPD unit #23 was in the middle of Scherer Place facing east, across from 1182 - 1192 Scherer Place. There was a rifle on the front passenger seat. There was apparent bullet damage to the passenger side view mirror. A note book and black pieces of plastic were on the ground near the passenger side of the unit. The front end of the unit was touching the driver side of a silver Cadillac Escalade (6EB5838). The Escalade was facing north-west on Scherer Place. There was body damage on the driver side of the Escalade. The left rear passenger door had an apparent strike mark in it. There was an apparent bullet hole in the left rear passenger window, as well as one in the right rear passenger window.

A \$20 bill and coins were scattered on the ground outside the right rear passenger door, and an iPhone was on the right rear bumper of the Escalade. Keys were in the ignition.

Located just east of the Escalade, on the north side of Scherer Place, was a white Ford F-150 truck (7Y09215). It was parked facing west. There was an orange first aid kit on the ground near its front left tire. An apparent strike mark was on the windshield.

TPD unit #17 was in the middle of Scherer Place facing west, just east of the Escalade. The flood lights were on.

There was a duplex located at 14582 Carfax Drive, at the east end of Scherer Place. A silver Honda Civic (7AOX353) was parked partially in the driveway blocking the sidewalk. It was located in the north side of the double driveway and facing east. An apparent bullet hole was in the right rear bumper of the Honda. It appeared to penetrate the exterior bumper, the interior grey felt trunk liner, and lodge into the interior right rear wheel well. No bullet was recovered.

There were tire marks in the grass strip on the west side of Carfax Drive, just south of the corner at Scherer Place. The tire marks traveled around the corner westward onto the sidewalk of Scherer, and exited into the street at 1192 Scherer. The tracks appeared to stop near the silver Cadillac Escalade in the street.

During a search, a DA Investigator Ed Wood found a Ruger handgun on the front passenger floor of the Cadillac Escalade. It was inside a Ruger plastic gun box with the magazine removed, but also in the gun box. There was apparent Marijuana in a plastic bag on the front passenger floor.

A rough scene sketch with measurements was made. A computer assisted drawing (CAD) will be made upon a request.

On 03/02/14 at approximately 0749 hours the Tustin Police Department received a radio call at 1142 Scherer #A for a family disturbance. The calling party [REDACTED] reported her husband (later identified Nicolas Barraza Vizcarra) was in her child's room and believed he might be smoking something. A short while later the caller said "can you hurry" and the phone disconnected.

Officers responded and determined there was no crime involved. Vizcarra left the residence prior to being contacted by the police. The wife was instructed to call back when Vizcarra came home. Officers cleared the call 0816 hours.

On 03/02/14 at approximately 1624 hours the Tustin Police Department received a 911 call from 1142 Scherer #A for a disturbance. With the help of a Spanish translator, the calling party [REDACTED] said her daughter's husband (Vizcarra) gave his eight year old son a loaded handgun, telling him "he (child) was the man of the house" and had the child shoot the gun. She said the gun was fired, however nobody was injured.

The TPD dispatcher (Becker) asked [REDACTED] where the gun was, she said Vizcarra took it with him when he left. She said she did not know where [REDACTED] went after he left the residence. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra has a vehicle, however she didn't know if he had it with him. She described it as a gray truck. I attached a copy of the call to this investigation (attachment 1).

The call was dispatched at approximately 1625 hours. Sgt. Taylor and Officer Gonzalez were the first to arrive at approximately 1626 hours.

I reviewed the green 1 radio traffic. The following is a synopsis of the events from the audio. I attached the green 1 radio traffic to this investigation (attachment 2).

Officer Gonzalez made contact with [REDACTED] outside the residence. He eventually confirmed a gun was fired inside the residence and Vizcarra was still in possession of the gun.

At approximately 1707 hours, Officer DelMerari broadcasted Vizcarra was possibly in a black Cadillac Escalade, however the RP did not know if he was currently with the vehicle. Comm. Officer Becker broadcasted the license plate as 6EBS838 (California).

Officers were staged in the area while the investigation was being conducted and at approximately 1801 hours, Officer Gleason advised the Cadillac was northbound on Carfax approaching Scherer. Shortly thereafter he advised "960X."

At approximately 1801 hours, Officer Gonzalez broadcasted, "220, shots fired." Officer S. Wright then broadcasted, "213, 998, we have one at gunpoint."

At approximately 1802 hours, Officer Gleason requested OCFA paramedics respond to the scene.

At approximately 1803 hours, Sgt. Havourd broadcasted one subject was in custody.

Because Vizcarra made allegations of being shot by the police earlier in the day and had a fresh bullet wound to his right leg, the Orange County District Attorney's Office was contacted and they responded to the scene to conduct a separate investigation.

All the supplemental reports written by the involved TPD personnel are contained in the original police report (attachment 3).

OFFICER S. WRIGHT'S OBSERVATIONS

Officer S. Wright handled the first call in the morning at Vizcarra's residence. After determining there was no crime, he cleared the call.

Officer S. Wright said at approximately 1642 hours he heard officers dispatched to 1142 Scherer #A and there was a handgun involved in the call. He notified dispatch he was also responding to the call. Officer S. Wright said he understood a gun was fired at the residence and the suspect (Vizcarra) had fled the scene.

Officer S. Wright took a perimeter position near the intersection of Sycamore and School with Officer Ramirez. While maintaining the perimeter position, Officer S. Wright heard over the police radio that Vizcarra was possibly driving a Cadillac Escalade (CA license 6EBS838).

Officer S. Wright said at approximately 1801 hours, he heard Officer Gleason broadcast he was attempting to stop Vizcarra's vehicle. He and Officer Ramirez responded to Officer Gleason's location.

As they were approaching the scene, Officer S. Wright heard over the police radio an officer involved shooting occurred.

Officer Ramirez and Officer S. Wright arrived to assist and noticed they were unable to open Vizcarra's driver's door. They therefore opened the front passenger side door and ordered Vizcarra out of the vehicle. As Vizcarra was being placed on the ground and handcuffed, Officer S. Wright saw Vizcarra had a blue piece of fabric tied around his right shin. He heard Vizcarra say he shot himself.

Officer S. Wright completed a supplemental report which is included in the original case investigation report.

OFFICER GLEASON'S OBSERVATIONS

Gleason responded to assist at the scene of the second call. After arriving, Officer Gleason was directed to remain on Carfax Dr. in case Vizcarra returned. He positioned himself facing northbound on Carfax Dr. south of Sycamore Av. in order to see all traffic at the intersection.

At approximately 1801 hours, Officer Gleason saw a newer model silver Cadillac Escalade make a northbound turn onto Carfax Dr. from Sycamore Av. After it completed the turn, he noticed the license plate matched the one provided by TPD dispatch. He immediately began to follow the vehicle and advised other TPD units of his activity. At this point, he had not initiated a stop of the vehicle. As the distance between his vehicle and the Escalade closed, he caught a glimpse of Vizcarra's face in the driver side mirror of the Escalade. It appeared Vizcarra was looking in Officer Gleason's direction. He could not see what Vizcarra was wearing and it appeared his window was up.

Shortly after, the vehicle stopped in the middle of Carfax Dr. south of Scherer Pl. Officer Gleason immediately turned on his overhead emergency lights, which include a solid red forward facing light, to initiate a felony car stop. As he exited his police vehicle, he noticed Vizcarra turned on his left blinker and he slowly began to make a left hand turn into a driveway. At this time, there was another unknown vehicle driving southbound Carfax. The vehicle was passing him as Vizcarra began making his left turn. Officer Gleason re-entered his vehicle and began to drive forward in order to block

Vizcarra's exit if he backed up. After entering his vehicle, he was unable to locate Vizcarra's vehicle. He attributed this to Vizcarra's avenue of escape being partially obscured by the "A-Pillar" of his police vehicle and other parked vehicles. Officer Gleason drove northbound toward Scherer Pl.

As Officer Gleason was making a westbound turn onto Scherer Pl., he heard what sounded like several gunshots. Initially, he did not know if they came from other TPD officers or Vizcarra. He observed Officers Del Merari and Gonzalez facing Vizcarra's car with their guns pointed in Vizcarra's direction.

Simultaneously, he heard the radio broadcast of "shots fired." Vizcarra's car was oriented in a northwest direction against a row of parked cars along the north curb line of Scherer Pl. A TPD police unit was oriented facing eastbound against the driver's side of Vizcarra's car. He immediately provided assistance to Officers Del Merari and Gonzalez.

After arriving at the scene, he saw Vizcarra sitting in the driver seat with his hands up. He noticed the rear driver's side window was shattered, but upon initial observation it looked like Vizcarra was not injured.

Officer Gleason said Officers S. Wright and Ramirez assisted with removing Vizcarra from the vehicle. Due to the positioning of Vizcarra's vehicle, Vizcarra had to exit through the front passenger side door. After Vizcarra exited the vehicle, he was placed in handcuffs. Officer Gleason said no further use of force occurred while taking Vizcarra into custody.

When Vizcarra was out of the vehicle, Officer Gleason noticed a blue bandana wrapped around Vizcarra's right leg, just under his knee. He also noticed what appeared to be a piece of clear plastic tied around Vizcarra's leg, directly above the bandana. When asked about the bandana, Vizcarra stated the bandana and plastic were a result of him being shot twice earlier in the day. Upon initial observation, it did not appear Vizcarra was shot by Officer Gonzalez. OCFA was called to render medical aid to Vizcarra.

Officer Gleason was assigned to ride with Vizcarra in the ambulance to Western Medical Center. Once at the hospital, medical personnel asked Vizcarra what happened to his leg. He stated he was shot three times by TPD with a "9mm." He did not provide any further statements regarding the incident. The bandana and plastic were removed from his leg wound and placed into the bag with the rest of his clothing. Officer Gleason was relieved at Western Medical Center by Detective Miali.

Officer Gleason completed a supplemental report which is included in the original case investigation report.

OFFICER RAMIREZ' OBSERVATIONS

Officer Ramirez assisted at the scene. Upon arriving to the area he was advised to take a position on the outer perimeter and positioned himself at Sycamore Av and School Ln. He heard information broadcasted over the police radio that Vizcarra was possibly driving a black Cadillac Escalade.

Officer Ramirez said at approximately 1800 hours, Officer Gleason broadcasted he was following Vizcarra northbound Carfax Dr. approaching Scherer Pl. Officer Gleason requested additional officers for a high risk traffic stop and Officer Ramirez responded to assist. While Officer Ramirez was driving northbound Carfax Dr. he heard, via the police radio, a shooting had occurred. As Officer Ramirez turned onto Scherer Pl. he observed Vizcarra's vehicle stopped in the middle of the street.

Officer Ramirez approached the vehicle and observed Vizcarra in the driver's seat. Vizcarra was holding both of his hands up in the air. Officers were giving Vizcarra verbal commands to exit the vehicle. Officer Ramirez observed a marked TPD unit had been against the driver's door of Vizcarra's vehicle which prevented Vizcarra from opening his driver's side door. Officer Ramirez told the other officers of this and told them they would have to remove Vizcarra from the passenger side of his vehicle.

Officer Ramirez said he and Officer S. Wright approached the passenger side of Vizcarra's vehicle and Officer S. Wright reached in through the passenger window and unlocked the door. Officer Ramirez told Vizcarra to crawl over the seat and exit the vehicle. Vizcarra looked at him and stated "I'm hurt. I'm hurt." Officer S. Wright told Vizcarra to exit the vehicle and keep his hands where they could see them. Vizcarra began to crawl toward them. Officer Ramirez said Officer S. Wright grabbed Vizcarra's right arm and he (Ramirez) grabbed his left arm. They pulled Vizcarra from the vehicle and guided him to the ground.

While pulling Vizcarra out of the vehicle Officer Ramirez observed blood on Vizcarra's leg. His leg was bandaged with a blue piece of cloth and what appeared to be clear plastic. Vizcarra stated he shot himself earlier in the day.

Officer Ramirez said Officer DelMerari handcuffed Vizcarra without further incident. First-aid was rendered and medics arrived shortly after. Officer Ramirez did not notice any other injuries to Vizcarra.

Officer Ramirez completed a supplemental report which is included in the original case investigation report.

GONZALEZ PUBLIC SAFETY STATEMENT

After the scene was rendered safe, Sgt. Taylor obtained a public safety statement from Officer Gonzalez. Officer Gonzalez told Sgt. Taylor he was running eastbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer toward Carfax Dr. to assist another officer with a felony traffic

stop. Officer Gonzalez said he observed the Escalade driving westbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl. directly toward him. Officer Gonzalez said he feared for his life and thought the suspect driving the vehicle was going to "run him down." Officer Gonzalez remembers firing three rounds from his duty weapon at the vehicle in an easterly direction.

Sgt. Taylor completed a supplemental report which is included in the original case investigation report.

OFFICER CARTER'S OBSERVATIONS

Officer Carter canvassed the area in an attempt to locate witnesses to the incident. He spoke to [REDACTED] who said she was walking from her car which was parked directly in front of 1192 Scherer Pl. She walked eastbound across Carfax Dr. toward 14562 Carfax Dr. As she began walking northbound on the east sidewalk of Carfax Dr., she heard the sound of vehicle's tire screeching. She saw a gold color SUV driving on the sidewalk and grass area on the southwest corner of Carfax Dr. and Scherer Pl. She saw the vehicle turn westbound and continued driving on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl. [REDACTED] heard several gunshots and saw the SUV come to a stop in the middle of Scherer Pl. She quickly left the area and did not see anything else.

Officer Carter spoke to several other residents in the area who said they heard gunshots but did not witness the incident.

Officer Carter completed a supplemental report which is included in the original case investigation report.

VIZCARRA'S INTERVIEW WITH DETECTIVE NGUYEN

On 03/02/14, at approximately 2326 hours, OCDA Investigator Hester and Detective N. Nguyen interviewed Vizcarra in the Tustin Police Department's secured interview room. Detective N. Nguyen read Vizcarra his Miranda Rights, using her department issued Miranda Warning Card. Vizcarra answered "yes" to each part of the advisement indicating he understood his rights. Detective N. Nguyen recorded Vizcarra's statements using Tustin PD's audio/video recording system and uploaded the file into the Tustin PD server as evidence (attachment 4). Vizcarra told Detective N. Nguyen the following under an implied waiver.

Vizcarra was currently employed as a "driver" and operated a "street sweeper" during his regular employment. On 03/02/14 at approximately 0745 hours, Vizcarra came home from work and proceeded to wake his children up so they could go to church prior to going to [REDACTED] "ball game." [REDACTED] game was scheduled to take place at an indoor facility located in the area of Lyon Street and McFadden Avenue at approximately 0930 hours. Vizcarra took a shower and before he knew it, the police arrived at his residence.

Vizcarra told his children that someone called the police on him and he left the residence via the back door. Vizcarra said he fled the residence because he was on "probation" and did not want "fucking contact with police whatsoever." Vizcarra crossed the walkway for the laundromat and while jumping a fence, which separated the residential properties from the Tustin Hospital, a police officer ordered Vizcarra to "freeze." As Vizcarra jumped down from the fence, the police officer shot at him one time. Vizcarra told me the officer was parked in the Tustin Hospital parking lot and he described the officer as "a white guy but yellowish and short."

Vizcarra then "limped" to his uncle's/friend's house (located on the corner of Carfax Drive and Sycamore Avenue) and remained in the friend's garage while Vizcarra operated on his own leg. Vizcarra explained the "uncle" was actually his wife's uncle and both the uncle and his friend lived in the same residential building (14731 Carfax Drive). They shared the same garage, but lived in different apartment units. Vizcarra told Detective N. Nguyen he used alcohol and a butter knife to dig the bullet from his leg and stated his friend was present inside the garage during this time.

Vizcarra described the bullet he removed from his leg as being a "9mm Berretta." Vizcarra said he left the bullet and napkins he used during the operation inside the friend's garage. Vizcarra went on to say he remained in the garage until "things calmed down." He then got a ride from his wife's uncle and proceeded to his own residence to retrieve his vehicle. At approximately 1300 hours, Vizcarra drove his Escalade to Riverside and visited his mother. Vizcarra remained at his mother's residence to relax and elevate his leg. Vizcarra returned home at approximately 1800-1900 hours and was "received with bullets."

Detective N. Nguyen told Vizcarra the Tustin Police Department received a phone call regarding him being in possession of a gun. Vizcarra replied, "No, no ma'am. I don't possess no guns." Vizcarra said he owns a couple of guns which he has secured in a Bank of America safe deposit box.

Vizcarra denied firing a weapon inside his residence and stated no members of his household fired a weapon inside the residence either. Vizcarra repeated the fact he wanted to go to court to dispute the allegations and told Detective Nguyen the police shot at him 3-4 times today without any warning.

Vizcarra said he was driving on Carfax Dr. when he saw a police vehicle following behind him. Vizcarra activated his "blinker" and waited for oncoming traffic to clear so he could make a turn into his friend's driveway. As the last oncoming vehicle passed Vizcarra, the police officer activated the "lights" on his police vehicle. Vizcarra said he was intending on parking on his friend's driveway but saw the officer exited his patrol vehicle, pulled out his gun, and told him to "freeze." Vizcarra said he drove away, driving on the sidewalk and the grass because the police officer blocked his exit and pulled a gun on him. Vizcarra said he felt "threatened" and "paranoid" so he fled in the only direction he could.

Vizcarra invoked his Miranda rights and asked for his lawyer. Detective N. Nguyen concluded her interview and released Vizcarra to Officer Girgenti's custody.

Detective N. Nguyen later spoke to Tustin PD Range Master/Armorer, Detective Kirwan, who is responsible for the record-keeping of all department-issued firearms. Detective Kirwan told her seven officers currently carry a 9mm Beretta firearm and only two officers carry a 9mm Glock. Out of those nine officers, none were on-duty on 03/02/14 between the hours of 0600 - 1830 hours.

DETECTIVE KIRWAN'S INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] is Vizcarra's mother-in-law. She was present at the residence when Vizcarra had the gun and fired a round. She voluntarily came to the Tustin Police Department to provide a statement to Detective Kirwan and Orange County District Attorney Investigator B. Andersen about what happened. [REDACTED] predominant language is Spanish and Detective Kirwan spoke with her in Spanish.

Detective Kirwan used his department issued PUMA audio recording device to record the interview and later uploaded the recording onto the Tustin Police Department server (attachment 5).

[REDACTED] told Detective Kirwan she lives at 1142 Scherer Place #A with the rest of family. [REDACTED] said she woke up on 03/02/14 at approximately 0900 hours and was present when [REDACTED] called the police. She said this occurred at approximately "nine-something" however she was not certain of the time. [REDACTED] explained Vizcarra had been drinking and smoking marijuana inside of the apartment, and [REDACTED] wanted him to leave before the children woke up. [REDACTED] called the police, however Vizcarra fled before the officers arrived. The officers did not speak with Vizcarra at that time.

[REDACTED] said she went to church and returned later that afternoon. [REDACTED] said she was visiting with her brother [REDACTED] at the apartment. She said at approximately 1600 hours Vizcarra came home and entered the kitchen with a little box.

[REDACTED] said Vizcarra placed the box on the counter. She described the box as black in color and square shaped. Vizcarra opened the box and she noticed there was a handgun inside. [REDACTED] said the gun was dark colored, possibly black, however she was unable to provide any further details. Vizcarra said she never saw the gun or the box before this incident.

[REDACTED] said Vizcarra's 8-year old son [REDACTED] was playing with his toy cars at the dining room table. Vizcarra told [REDACTED] to stop playing and come over to him.

[REDACTED] said Vizcarra took [REDACTED] outside to the backyard. While in the backyard, Vizcarra put the gun in [REDACTED] hands and held his own hands around [REDACTED]. Vizcarra then fired the gun one time at a lemon tree in the backyard.

██████████ said Vizcarra left the apartment with the gun and the box. She said Vizcarra was only there for less than five minutes. Once he was gone, ██████████ called the police and reported what had happened.

DETECTIVE KIRWAN'S INTERVIEW WITH ██████████

During the Miranda interview, Vizcarra indicated he went to his uncle's house ██████████ at some point in the morning. Vizcarra said he was in the garage and had removed a bullet from his leg using a butter knife.

On 03/02/14 Investigator Andersen and Detective Kirwan spoke with ██████████ at his residence. Detective Kirwan used his department issued PUMA audio recording device to record the interview and he later uploaded the recording onto the Tustin Police Department server (attachment 6). The following is synopsis of the interview.

██████████ confirmed Vizcarra came over to his apartment at approximately 0800 hours. ██████████ said Vizcarra did not go into his apartment. When asked if he went into ██████████ garage, he said the garage is locked so he could not get inside. ██████████ said Vizcarra went into another garage that was open. That opened garage is shared by the tenants in ██████████

When asked what he was doing in the garage, ██████████ said Vizcarra was sitting down and massaging his leg. ██████████ said Vizcarra had blood on his right leg. He said Vizcarra had something similar to clothing wrapped around his leg. Vizcarra claimed the police shot him.

After speaking with ██████████ Investigator Anderson and Detective Kirwan attempted to contact the neighbor in ██████████ They knocked on the door and a male subject came to the window. The subject asked who they were looking for and then told them to "hold on." The subject did not return to the window or the door and Detective Kirwan and Inv. Anderson left this residence.

They knocked on the door for ██████████ and Investigator Anderson contacted the resident, who gave them permission to look inside his garage. Investigator Anderson and Detective Kirwan looked for items described by Vizcarra that included paper towels, a bullet and a bottle of rubbing alcohol. They did not find anything matching that description in the garage.

DETECTIVE HARDACRE'S INTERVIEW WITH ██████████

On 03/02/14 Detective Hardacre and Orange County District Attorney Investigator Dawson interviewed ██████████ (Nicolas Vizcarra's wife) at TPD. The interview was recorded on Detective Hardacre's PUMA device and later uploaded to the TPD server (attachment 7). The following is a synopsis of the interview.

██████████ told Detective Hardacre she lives at the apartment with her three children, her mom, her aunt, and Vizcarra. ██████████ said Vizcarra came to the residence at about 1430 hours. He told their daughter ██████████ he needed his phone charger from the van and asked her to get him the keys. ██████████ said ██████████ got him the charger and he gave her money. ██████████ said Vizcarra told ██████████ he was going to a hotel room because he had been shot in his shin area. ██████████ pointed to the area below the knee and above the foot when describing the area.

Investigator Dawson asked ██████████ if she saw Vizcarra after he left in the morning. She said she saw Vizcarra about 1200 hours when he was finishing up packing up his belongings. Investigator Dawson asked ██████████ if Vizcarra had anything on his leg such as a wound or bullet hole and she said he did. ██████████ said Vizcarra had something wrapped on his leg and pointed to his shin area. ██████████ said Vizcarra did not have the bandana on his leg prior to today. Detective Hardacre asked ██████████ if it was there at 0700 hours this morning when she called the police and she said it was not.

DETECTIVE HARDACRE'S INTERVIEW WITH ██████████

On 03/02/14 at approximately 2234 hours Detective Hardacre and Investigator Dawson interviewed ██████████ at TPD. ██████████ was also present during the interview. Detective Hardacre digitally recorded the interview (attachment 8). The following is a synopsis of the interview.

██████████ said he was playing with his toy cars inside his apartment at approximately 1500 hours when Vizcarra grabbed him and told him, "Come shoot the gun." ██████████ said he told Vizcarra he didn't want to go outside but Vizcarra told him, "Come on, just right here in the back, shoot it." ██████████ said they went outside and Vizcarra grabbed his arms and made him shoot the gun. ██████████ said his dad had ██████████ put his hands around the gun and his finger on the trigger, causing the gun to fire. ██████████ said, "But I didn't want to shoot it." ██████████ said they only shot the gun once.

Investigator Dawson asked ██████████ if Vizcarra had a handkerchief or bandana on his leg and he said he did. ██████████ thought it was similar to a bandana.

DETECTIVE HARDACRE'S INTERVIEW WITH ██████████

On 03/04/14 at approximately 1440 hours, Detective Hardacre and DA Investigator Dawson interviewed ██████████ (██████████ daughter) at the Tustin Police Department. Below is a synopsis of the interview that was recorded on Detective Hardacre's Puma recorder and later uploaded to the TPD server (attachment 9). ██████████ requested to be present during the interview with ██████████, the request was granted and she remained in the room during the interview.

████████ confirmed she was home part of the day on 03/02/14. DA Investigator Dawson asked ██████████ if she was home during the day when a gun might have been fired and she said no.

████████ said she talked to her dad (Vizcarra) that day and he told her to go get the keys for her mom's van so he could get his phone charger out. ██████████ said her dad told her he was going to go rent a hotel room. ██████████ asked him why and he told her he was "lonely" and that he had been shot. ██████████ estimated this occurred about 1530-1600 hours. DA Inv. Dawson asked ██████████ if her dad told her anything else about how he got shot and she said he didn't.

DETECTIVE HARDACRE'S INTERVIEW WITH SGT. HAVOURD

On 03/02/14 Detective Hardacre and Investigator Dawson interviewed Sgt. Havourd at TPD. The interview was recorded on Detective Hardacre's PUMA device and later uploaded to the TPD server (attachment 10). The following is a synopsis of the interview.

Sgt. Havourd said he responded to the scene of the officer involved shooting after hearing the vehicle was spotted and a high risk car stop was initiated. Sgt. Havourd said he thought he was about the 3rd unit to arrive.

Sgt. Havourd saw Vizcarra coming out the passenger side of the vehicle when he arrived. Sgt. Havourd saw officers handcuffing Vizcarra and said he noticed Vizcarra's right leg was bandaged with a blue bandana and some type of cellophane or plastic. Sgt. Havourd saw a 1 ½" diameter blood spot under the bandana. Sgt. Havourd said directly below that he saw an un-bandaged wound that looked like an exit wound. Sgt. Havourd said it was directly in line with the initial wound and said it was about his shin area.

Sgt. Havourd asked Vizcarra what happened. Vizcarra told Sgt. Havourd, "You guys shot me" and Sgt. Havourd asked him when he was shot. Vizcarra told Sgt. Havourd, "You guys shot me earlier." Sgt. Havourd told Vizcarra TPD wasn't there earlier and asked him if he was shot by the Santa Ana Police Department. Vizcarra denied he had been shot by SAPD and again told Sgt. Havourd, "You guys shot me."

Sgt. Havourd stopped asking Vizcarra any questions because he felt he would just continue to say that we had shot him. Sgt. Havourd then took Officer Gonzalez, Officer Del Merari and Dispatcher Cornell (on a ride-along with Officer Gonzalez) to the station.

DETECTIVE MIALI AT WMSA

Detective Miali was assigned to standby with Vizcarra at Western Medical Center in Santa Ana. The following is a synopsis of his observations at the hospital. For complete details, refer to his supplemental report contained in the police report.

Upon his arrival, Detective Miali contacted Vizcarra at Western Medical Center. He did not speak with Vizcarra but noticed a wound to his right leg. It appeared to be a gunshot wound just below his knee. The wound was approximately the size of a fingertip and was not bleeding. There were also two abrasions approximately four to six inches below the gunshot wound. Detective Miali did not notice an exit wound.

Vizcarra did not make any statements to Detective Miali during this time, but he did make several statements to the medical staff in his presence. The Physician's Assistant Nancy Westbrook, informed Vizcarra she reviewed his x-rays and did not see a projectile, which is commonly present in an x-ray when treating a gunshot wound. Vizcarra told PA Westbrook he took the projectile out with a "butter knife" earlier in the day. Vizcarra told PA Westbrook the gunshot wound happened at approximately 0800 hours that same day. Vizcarra did not say how he obtained this gunshot wound.

Detective Miali completed a supplemental report which is included in the original crime report.

DETECTIVE MIALI'S INTERVIEW WITH PA WESTBROOK

On 03/02/14 Detective Miali and Orange County District Attorney Investigator Ryan Smith interviewed Western Medical Center Physician Assistant (PA) Westbrook. Detective Miali digitally recorded the interview and I attached it to this investigation (attachment 11).

PA Westbrook said Vizcarra entered the Emergency Room with a gunshot wound to his right leg, below the knee. PA Westbrook said there were also two small lacerations just below the gunshot wound.

PA Westbrook said the x-ray did not show a projectile, so she asked Vizcarra where the bullet was. Vizcarra told her he took it out shortly after 0800 hours at a friend's house. Vizcarra said he used a butter knife to remove the bullet. PA Westbrook said she recalled Vizcarra telling her it was a 9mm bullet.

Vizcarra signed a refusal to medical treatment form at which point he was released from Western Medical Center.

Detective Miali completed a supplemental report which is included in the original crime report.

DETECTIVE MIALI'S INTERVIEW WITH ALYSIA CORNELL

On 03/02/14 Detective Miali and Orange County District Attorney Investigator Smith interviewed Communications Officer Alysia Cornell at TPD. The interview was recorded on Detective Miali's PUMA device and I attached a copy of the recording to this investigation (attachment 12). The following is a synopsis of the interview.

Cornell was on a civilian ride along with Officer Gonzalez on 03/02/14. Cornell said she was standing with Officer Gonzalez while he spoke with Vizcarra's family.

Cornell said Officer Gonzalez was speaking with Vizcarra's mother-in-law and Vizcarra's wife at their residence. Cornell said they had been at the residence since approximately 1630 hours. Cornell said Officer Gonzalez had an earpiece for his radio and at some point during his interview with Vizcarra's family, he said with urgency he had to go and ran out of the residence.

Cornell followed Officer Gonzalez out the front door and ran toward their marked Tustin Police unit. Officer Gonzalez did not run to the police vehicle. He continued to run eastbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl. Cornell did not know what was happening because she was not able to hear the police radio, so she stopped at Officer Gonzalez' police vehicle.

As Cornell stood at the police vehicle she saw a SUV type vehicle turn from northbound Carfax Dr. to westbound Scherer Pl. Cornell described the vehicle's speed as fast, but was not able to articulate why she thought it was fast. She did not recall hearing engine noise or the sound of screeching tires as the SUV turned the corner, only that it appeared to be moving fast.

Cornell said the SUV turned the corner and once it made the turn it went up onto the sidewalk. Cornell said there were no vehicles in the street blocking the SUV's path, so she didn't know the purpose of the vehicle going on the sidewalk. This was the same sidewalk Officer Gonzalez was on.

Cornell said Officer Gonzalez was in a full Tustin Police Department uniform with patches and a badge. Cornell said Officer Gonzalez was wearing a long sleeve uniform shirt. Cornell said based on her view of Officer Gonzalez, his police uniform made clear he was a uniformed Tustin Police Officer. Cornell said the SUV was much closer to Officer Gonzalez then she was, and believed the driver of the SUV would have a better view of his police uniform.

Cornell saw the SUV approximately "one parcel property" from Officer Gonzalez when it turned north off the sidewalk onto Scherer Pl. Cornell did not hear anything, such as Officer Gonzalez' verbal commands, the noise from the SUV's engine, or anything else that might have been audible in the area. Cornell thought the SUV turned away from Officer Gonzalez' direction right before she heard gunshots. Cornell heard two to three gunshots. Cornell took a position of cover behind the police vehicle when she heard the gunshots and did not see where the gunfire came from, nor did she see anything that happened for the next several minutes. When Cornell surfaced from her cover position, Vizcarra was in handcuffs.

During this interview, Cornell used a piece of paper to draw the direction of travel and vehicle positioning to help explain her recollection of the incident. Detective Miali later booked the original drawing into evidence at Tustin PD (attachment 13).

Detective Miali completed a supplemental report which is included in the original crime report.

DETECTIVE HAUG OBSERVATIONS

Detective Haug assisted at the scene and he observed the following:

He noticed a TPD patrol car (822) parked facing south in front of 1162 Scherer Pl. (Officer Gonzalez' vehicle). Upon walking east on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl., he saw orange traffic cones had been put in place to mark three expended handgun shell casings. He noticed one additional shell casing in the gutter in front of 1182 Scherer Pl.; for a total of four casings. He was told this was the approximate area where Officer Gonzalez stood while firing his weapon.

Detective Haug noticed TPD unit (823) in the center of the street in front of 1182 Scherer Pl. (Officer DelMerari's vehicle). Unit 823 was facing eastbound on Scherer Pl. The patrol rifle of unit 823 had been removed from the rifle mount and was lying across the front passenger seat. There was damage to the passenger side rear view mirror, consistent with being stuck by a bullet.

Directly in front of unit 823, facing in a northwestern direction, Detective Haug noticed a silver colored Cadillac Escalade (Cal Lic# 6EBS838). Unit 823 was resting against the front driver's door of that vehicle; causing minor damage to the Cadillac. Detective Haug noticed additional damage to the Cadillac which appeared to be bullet impact locations.

Detective Haug noticed a civilian vehicle (white colored Ford F150 / Cal Lic#7Y09215) parked facing westbound along the north curb line of Scherer Pl. had a bullet impact mark in the center windshield area.

Detective Haug noticed another civilian vehicle (silver colored Honda Civic / Cal Lic# 7AOX353) had a bullet impact hole in the right rear bumper area, under the right tail light. He was told the owner of the vehicle moved the vehicle prior to initial officer's responding on scene. It was originally parked in the south driveway of 14582 Carfax Drive when the incident occurred, however it was moved to the north driveway of the same location.

Detective Haug noticed tire marks in the grass that led from the south side of 1192 Scherer Place to the southwest corner of Carfax Drive and Scherer Place. The tire marks continued westbound Scherer Place; heading directly toward where Officer Gonzalez was believed to be standing when he fired his weapon.

After a search warrant was obtained, Detective Haug searched Vizcarra's vehicle. Upon opening the front right passenger door, Detective Haug noticed a black plastic box with the word "Ruger" printed on the top. This box was located on the front passenger floor board. Upon opening the box, he located a silver and black colored 40 caliber semi-automatic Ruger P94 model pistol. There was also a loaded magazine in the same box.

Upon inspecting the firearm, Detective Haug determined it was not loaded. Upon inspecting the magazine, he saw it was loaded with approximately ten (10) rounds of ammunition. The magazine was not unloaded at the scene; therefore the round count is only approximate and visually estimated by Detective Haug.

Detective Haug completed a supplemental report which is included in the original crime report.

PSO SUPERVISOR GROVER'S OBSERVATIONS

On 03/02/14 PSO Supervisor Grover responded to the scene and assisted with photography and evidence collection at the scene. He took numerous photographs of the entire scene, Vizcarra's vehicle and residence. I attached the relevant photographs to this investigation (attachment 14).

PSO Supervisor Grover completed a supplemental report which is included in the original crime report.

PSO CAMACHO

On 03/02/14 PSO Camacho responded to the scene and assisted with photography and evidence collection at the scene. She took numerous photographs of the entire scene. I attached the relevant photographs to this investigation (attachment 15)

INTERVIEW WITH OFFICER DELMERARI

On 03/10/14 at approximately 1453 hours, OCDA Investigator B. Hester and Detective N. Nguyen interviewed Officer DelMerari at TPD. Also present in the interview was [REDACTED] on behalf of Officer DelMerari. Detective N. Nguyen recorded Officer DelMerari's statements using her department-issued digital audio recorder and uploaded the audio file into the Tustin PD server as evidence (attachment 16). The following is a summary of Officer DelMerari's voluntary statements.

On the morning of 03/02/14, Officer DelMerari heard Tustin PD Communications dispatch officers to 1142 Scherer #A PI. regarding a male subject, identified as Nicolas Vizcarra, acting strangely, aggressive, and combative with family members. It was also noted that Vizcarra had been possibly making threats. When officers arrived at this call,

Vizcarra had already fled and officers did not locate him in the area. Officer DelMerari advised he did not respond to this original call for service.

Later the same day, at approximately 1630 hours, Officer DelMerari was dispatched to 1142 Scherer #A for a second response to a domestic violence/family disturbance call. Tustin PD Communications advised Vizcarra had returned to the residence, removed a handgun from a box, and fired the weapon within the residence while in the presence of other family members and children. While enroute to the residence, Tustin PD Communications Officers advised the responding officers Vizcarra left the residence. However, the reporting party did not know if Vizcarra left in a vehicle or by foot and did not advise whether or not the handgun was still in Vizcarra's possession.

Due to the nature of today's call for service, Officer Muro, Officer Gonzalez, and Sergeant Taylor also responded to the call.

When Officer DelMerari arrived on scene, he, Officer Muro, and Sergeant Taylor conducted a protective sweep of the residence and did not locate Vizcarra. Officer DelMerari spoke with the reporting party and identified her as Vizcarra's mother-in-law [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] appeared scared and told Officer DelMerari she was fearful Vizcarra would return to the residence and she did not know what he would do. The reporting party allowed Officer DelMerari and responding officers to search the residence for Vizcarra as well as the handgun. During the search, Officer DelMerari located a .40 caliber shell casing in the residence's rear patio area. The shell casing was found near a hole in the patio fence.

Fearing Vizcarra would return to the residence at any moment with a firearm, Officer DelMerari proceeded out to the front of the residence and returned to his vehicle to provide area security while Officer Gonzalez photographed and collected the shell casing from the rear patio. At approximately 1800 hours, Officer Gleason broadcasted Vizcarra returned to the area in a Cadillac Escalade. Officer Gleason advised the vehicle was northbound Carfax Drive from Sycamore Avenue and was headed toward the residence. Officer Del Merari started his patrol vehicle, pulled out of the residence's driveway onto Scherer Place and began driving eastbound toward Officer Gleason's last known location on Carfax Drive.

As Officer DelMerari was pulling his patrol vehicle out of the driveway, he saw Officer Gonzalez running eastbound along the south sidewalk of Scherer Place. After driving approximately 100 feet eastbound onto Scherer Place, Officer DelMerari saw headlights shining on the south sidewalk of Scherer Place. Approximately half a second later, Officer DelMerari heard the sound of gunshots, but did not know where the gun was being fired from or who was being fired at.

Approximately half a second later, an Escalade exited off the south sidewalk of Scherer Place onto the street and in front of Officer DelMerari's patrol vehicle. The vehicle had been traveling westbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer Place at a speed of

approximately 20-25 miles per hour. Officer DelMerari slammed on his brakes and came to a stop, blocking the Escalade from continuing westbound on Scherer Place. The Escalade also came to a stop and Officer DelMerari allowed his patrol vehicle to roll forward at an idle speed to make contact with the Escalade's driver's door. Officer DelMerari pinned the Escalade's driver's door shut with the front bumper of his patrol vehicle because he wanted to prevent the suspect from exiting through the door, it would give Officer DelMerari the opportunity to exit his own vehicle, create distance, and move to a position of cover.

Officer DelMerari drew his firearm and gave Vizcarra multiple verbal commands to show his hands. Vizcarra complied and showed his hands. Officer DelMerari, Officer Gleason, Officer D. Nguyen, Officer S. Wright, Officer Ramirez, and Officer Gonzalez all assisted in removing Vizcarra from the vehicle through the right front passenger door.

Officer DelMerari handcuffed Vizcarra and searched him for weapons. During the search, Officer DelMerari found a bloody bandana and a piece of plastic wrapped around Vizcarra's right shin. Officer DelMerari asked Vizcarra why he was bleeding and Vizcarra told Officer DelMerari he "got shot." Officer DelMerari asked Vizcarra when he got shot and Vizcarra answered, "Earlier." Vizcarra then told Officer DelMerari, "I got shot at twice today" but he didn't say who shot at him.

Officer DelMerari sat Vizcarra up and asked him if he was shot anywhere else and he said, "No." Officer DelMerari asked Vizcarra if he was hurt, if he could breathe, and checked Vizcarra again to see if there were any other visible injuries or gunshot wounds, none were found. Although no other visible injuries were noticed it did appear Vizcarra was unresponsive and "out of it." Officer DelMerari released Vizcarra to Officer D. Nguyen's custody and was transported to the Tustin Police Department.

OFFICER GONZALEZ' COMPELLED INTERVIEW

On 06/19/14 at approximately 1443 hours Lt. Wright and I interviewed Officer Gonzalez in the Chief's conference room at TPD. Also present during the interview was Officer Gonzalez' representative, [REDACTED]. I digitally recorded the interview and attached a recording of this interview to this report. The following is a synopsis of the interview (attachment 17).

Officer Gonzalez acknowledged he received the interrogation memorandum I provided him on 06/06/14. I read Officer Gonzalez the applicable AB301 rights verbatim from the Tustin Police Department Administrative Investigation Manual. I asked him if he understood and he said he did. I read him his rights per Miranda and he said he understood all of his rights. Officer Gonzalez did not waive his rights, therefore I read him the Lybarger admonishment directly from the same manual. He said he understood and spoke to me.

Officer Gonzalez said he has been a police officer for five years. He was a Deputy Sheriff assigned to patrol for the Riverside County Sheriff's Department for approximately three and a half years before coming to the Tustin Police Department. Officer Gonzalez said he was working as a Tustin Police Officer, in full uniform on 03/02/14 and was assigned to Squad 2. He began his shift at 0600 hours on that day. I asked Officer Gonzalez if he was assigned to drive a marked unit. He said he was, however he does not remember what unit he was assigned. I asked him if he had MAVS on at the time of the call and he said he did. He said his call sign was "220." I asked Officer Gonzalez if he was under the influence of alcohol or drug (prescription or non-prescription) that would have prevented him from safely performing his duties as a police officer when he reported to work on 03/02/14, he said he wasn't.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if he was dispatched to a family disturbance at 1142 Scherer Place #A on 03/02/14 at approximately 1624 hours; he said he was. I asked him if he was aware at the time he was dispatched that TPD had been at the same location earlier in the morning; he said he was. He said he was not involved in the call, however he knew it was a family disturbance where a male subject was in a verbal altercation with his wife and mother-in-law. He said he heard the male was possibly under the influence of drugs and was on probation with search and seizure. Officer Gonzalez said someone distributed an e-mail to the on-duty officers with the male subject's information and picture which he saw. Officer Gonzalez said the subject was never located at that time.

I asked Officer Gonzalez to relay the circumstances of the call in which he was dispatched to at 1624 hours. He said he was dispatched as a back-up officer to a family disturbance in which shots were fired inside the residence. Once he arrived, he spoke to Vizcarra's mother-in-law in Spanish. The mother-in-law told him Vizcarra entered the residence with a black box. Vizcarra put the black box on top of the kitchen counter, opened it and retrieved a handgun. Vizcarra told his eight-year old son he was going to be the "man of the house" and took him to the attached back patio and fired a round from the handgun. Officer Gonzalez said there were two small children in the residence at the time the gun was fired. Vizcarra then put the firearm back in the case and left the residence with the case containing the firearm. It was not known where he went after he left the residence. The mother-in-law said Vizcarra drives a black or gray Cadillac Escalade which was not located at the scene.

I asked Officer Gonzalez what Vizcarra's mother-in-law told him about Vizcarra's demeanor when he entered the residence. According to Officer Gonzalez, she told him Vizcarra appeared drunk. She said she was scared because he was talking loudly.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if there were other officers on a perimeter position in the area watching to see if Vizcarra returned while he was speaking to the mother-in-law. He said there were. I asked him why, and he said while he and other officers were there conducting an investigation, he did not want Vizcarra to show up and surprise them, especially since he was armed and a round had already been fired.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if he heard someone broadcast over the police radio that Vizcarra returned and was now driving northbound on Carfax toward Scherer Pl.; he said he did. I asked him who broadcasted that information; he said Officer Gleason. I asked him what he heard Officer Gleason say. Officer Gleason said he had the suspect vehicle and he had a "960X" at Carfax Dr. and Scherer Pl.

Officer Gonzalez told me he was outside, in front of 1142 Scherer Pl. talking to Vizcarra's wife when he heard Officer Gleason's broadcast. Officer Gonzalez' patrol car was parked too far away so he ran eastbound on the south side of Scherer Pl. toward the car stop. He said he would have had to maneuver his car and wait for his ride-along (TPD Communications Officer Alysia Cornell) to get in the vehicle, therefore he felt it would be quicker to run to the point of the car stop. I asked him if Communications Officer Cornell ran with him, and he said she did not.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if he was under the impression Vizcarra's vehicle was stopped on Carfax Dr. due to Officer Gleason's radio broadcast; he said he was. He said it was his intention to run to the point of the car stop to assist the officers.

I used a Google Earth photograph of the area to assist in determining where all the parties were during this event. I had Officer Gonzalez draw on the map to help with the illustration. I attached the map to this investigation (attachment 18)

I asked Officer Gonzalez when he first saw Vizcarra's vehicle. He said as he was running on the sidewalk, he saw Vizcarra drive onto the sidewalk on the southwest corner of Scherer Pl. west of Carfax Dr.. I asked him where he was when he first saw the vehicle. He pointed to the map and I had him write a "G1" on the map where he was. The area he depicted was on the south side of Scherer Pl near the third driveway west of Carfax Dr. He estimated he was approximately 80 yards away from Vizcarra's vehicle.

I asked Officer Gonzalez what concerned him when he saw Vizcarra drive onto the sidewalk. He said he (Officer Gonzalez) was on the sidewalk and Vizcarra was now driving toward him. He was also concerned with the other people in the area behind him, including Vizcarra's wife, mother-in-law, and Communications Officer Cornell. I asked him what his specific concern was. He said he was concerned he would get run over or the people behind him would get run over by Vizcarra's vehicle. He believed Vizcarra had a firearm and he didn't know if Vizcarra was going to do a "drive by" and shoot his wife or drive directly into their residence. I asked Officer Gonzalez if Vizcarra could have continued driving on the street instead of driving onto the sidewalk. He said he could have.

I asked Officer Gonzalez what he did when Vizcarra drove onto the sidewalk. He said Vizcarra continued driving toward him so he put his hand up in front of him and screamed, "Stop, stop, stop." I asked him if he yelled "police" and he said he didn't

remember. Officer Gonzalez said he was still running toward Vizcarra's vehicle on the sidewalk. He estimated Vizcarra was driving approximately 35 mph and believed he was still increasing his speed because he was trying to get away from the officers who were attempting to stop him. I asked him if Vizcarra was trying to evade the officers and could he have remained on the street instead of driving on the sidewalk? He said he could have remained on the street.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if he attempted to seek a position of cover at this point and he said there was nothing to use as cover. He said, "I'm afraid I am going to die. He's gonna just, just plow me." I asked him when he removed his handgun from his holster and he said as he was yelling for Vizcarra to stop. He said he slowed down and when Vizcarra's vehicle was approximately 40 – 50 yards away from him, he fired at Vizcarra's vehicle. I asked Officer Gonzalez how much time it would have taken Vizcarra to cover 40-50 yards at the speed he was going. He said at this point he believed Vizcarra was travelling approximately 40 mph hour and estimated Vizcarra could cover the distance in 2–3 seconds.

I asked Officer Gonzalez when he fired his handgun, if there was cover or concealment he could have gotten to have avoided being hit by Vizcarra's vehicle. He said there was no cover or concealment available. I asked him why he fired his weapon. He said Vizcarra kept driving toward him and he did not want to get hit by the vehicle. He said if he didn't do something quickly, he would have been "run over." Officer Gonzalez said he has a wife and children and wants to go home to them. Officer Gonzalez also said he knew if Vizcarra got past him, the other people mentioned before would have been in danger, especially since he believed Vizcarra had a firearm with him and a round had previously been fired.

I asked Officer Gonzalez why he didn't use any other force option to try and stop the vehicle. He said no other piece of equipment he carries would have been able to stop the vehicle. He said he felt using his handgun was the only option available to him at the time. I asked Officer Gonzalez if he believes Vizcarra saw him, he said he believes he did. The street lights were illuminated and Vizcarra had the vehicle's headlights on.

I asked Officer Gonzalez how many rounds he fired. He said, "I fired three rounds." He said he fired directly at the vehicle (easterly direction) in an attempt to hit Vizcarra. I asked him why, and he said in an attempt to disable him and the vehicle. I asked him what his backdrop was when he fired his rounds. He said the street with parked vehicles behind Vizcarra's vehicle. He said he did not see anyone in the area when he fired.

I asked Officer Gonzalez what Vizcarra did when he fired the rounds. He said Vizcarra's vehicle veered to the right into the eastbound of Scherer Pl. Officer Gonzalez marked an "X" and "V2" on the map indicating where Vizcarra's vehicle left the sidewalk. I asked him why he didn't just jump out of the way when Vizcarra was driving toward him. He said he was still concerned if he didn't stop Vizcarra, Communications Officer

Cornell and Vizcarra's family would be in danger as they were in Vizcarra's direct path. He also said Vizcarra could have veered directly into him.

I asked Officer Gonzalez what happened after Vizcarra left the sidewalk onto Scherer. He said he fired a fourth round at Vizcarra. I asked him why and he said he believed Vizcarra was still armed. He saw Vizcarra move his hands down toward his body, he didn't know if he was reaching for the handgun. He was in fear if he didn't stop Vizcarra, he would continue driving westbound on Scherer and shoot or drive into Vizcarra's family. He was also concerned Vizcarra would either injure the officer in the TPD unit by running into him or shooting him. He felt Officer DelMerari's life was in danger at the moment he fired his fourth round.

Officer Gonzalez said once he fired his fourth round, Vizcarra's vehicle came to a stop. Once Vizcarra's vehicle came to a stop, he put his hands up and Officer Gonzalez instructed him not to move his hands.

I asked Officer Gonzalez where his fourth round went and he said he didn't know. He said he aimed for Vizcarra who was still seated in his vehicle. I asked Officer Gonzalez how long after the third round he shot the fourth round. He estimated 1–2 seconds. I asked him where he was when he fired the round, he estimated approximately 10–15 yards away from Vizcarra's vehicle. He drew a "G3" on the map indicating where he believed he was when he fired his fourth round. The "V3" on the map indicates where he estimates Vizcarra's vehicle came to a stop.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if he knew at the time of the shooting if Vizcarra had been struck by any of his bullets. He said he didn't know. I asked him if he felt he had a good backdrop and it was safe to fire his fourth round, he said it was.

Officer Gonzalez said after he fired his fourth round and Vizcarra placed his hands up, he did not fire any other rounds. I asked if any other officers at the scene fired their weapons, he said they didn't.

Officer Gonzalez said he was carrying his department issued Glock 21 and all four rounds were fired from that handgun. He said he attended and qualified at all department range qualification days with the same handgun. He said he was carrying department issued ammunition at the time of the shooting. Officer Gonzalez didn't know how many rounds he had on him at the time, however he knows all three of his magazines were filled to capacity, and he had one round in the chamber of the weapon.

Officer Gonzalez said after Vizcarra was removed from the vehicle, he provided a public safety statement to Sgt. Taylor and was brought to TPD.

I asked Officer Gonzalez if he was ordered not to discuss this incident with anyone other than his representative; he said he was. I asked him if he violated that order; he said he didn't.

The interview concluded at approximately 1553 hours. I ordered Officer Gonzalez not to discuss this interview or investigation with anyone other than me or his representative to which he said he understood.

OFFICER GLEASON'S MAVS

Officer Gleason was driving TPD unit 817 on the day of this incident and had his MAVS video and remote audio activated. I attached a copy of the MAVS to this investigation (attachment 19).

18:00:50 – Officer Gleason's recording started. Officer Gleason is seen driving northbound on Carfax Dr. from Sycamore Av. behind Vizcarra's vehicle.

18:01:11 – Vizcarra stops in the road, south of Scherer Pl., turns on his left turn signal to pull into a driveway and waits for passing vehicles.

18:01:19 – Officer Gleason turns on his emergency lights.

18:01:22 – Vizcarra made a left hand turn into the driveway south of Scherer Pl. and immediately turned northbound. He then drove northbound on the west sidewalk of Carfax Dr. south of Scherer Pl.

Due to the camera angle of Officer Gleason's patrol car, I was not able to see where Vizcarra's vehicle went, however it appears to have turned westbound on the south sidewalk of Scherer Pl.

18:01:36 – Officer Gleason continued to drive northbound on Carfax Dr. and I heard three gunshots in succession.

18:01:40 – As Officer Gleason was preparing to turn westbound on Scherer Pl. I heard one more gunshot.

When Officer Gleason made his westbound turn, he parked his patrol car facing westbound. Several officers assisted Vizcarra out of the front passenger side of his vehicle and took him into custody.

While the officers were speaking to Vizcarra, he kept saying TPD officers shot him earlier. Officers Gleason, D. Nguyen and DelMerari assessed Vizcarra's injuries to make sure he didn't have any wounds they could not see. OCFA paramedics were called to the scene who ended up transporting Vizcarra to Western Medical Center in Santa Ana.

18:26:38 – The remote audio goes in and out of range as it appears Officer Gleason was too far away from his patrol car.

18:28:11 – The "M" indicator on his MAVS goes off. Officer Gleason was assigned to ride in the ambulance with Vizcarra.

Officer Gleason's vehicle remained at the scene with his MAVS running and the MAVS was shut off at 19:42:04

OFFICER DELMERARI'S MAVS

Officer DelMerari was driving TPD unit 823 on the day of this incident and had his MAVS activated. The audio I can hear at this point is from the microphone in the vehicle. The "M" is not displayed indicating it was not turned on or it was not functioning. It does activate later as indicated below. I attached a copy of Officer DelMerari's MAVS to this investigation (attachment 20).

17:59:46 – Officer DelMerari's recording started. His vehicle appears to be backed into a driveway on the southwest corner of Del Amo Av. and Scherer Pl. facing in a northeast direction.

18:01:27 – Officer DelMerari got into his police car and drove eastbound on Scherer Pl. towards Carfax Dr.

18:01:36 – The first gunshot is heard, quickly followed by two more gunshots. Vizcarra's vehicle is seen travelling in a northerly direction onto Scherer Pl. The vehicle came from the south side of the street. Due to the camera angle and it being blocked by other vehicles, I could not see Vizcarra's vehicle while it was on the sidewalk.

18:01:39 – Officer DelMerari's vehicle comes to a stop facing eastbound on Scherer Pl. west of Carfax. Vizcarra's vehicle comes to a stop on Scherer Pl. west of Carfax Dr. facing northbound directly in front of Officer DelMerari's vehicle. At this moment, one more gunshot is heard.

Officer Gonzalez is then heard yelling, "Don't move. Don't fucking move. Let me see your hands." Other Officers are also heard giving Vizcarra commands not to move. Vizcarra is then removed from the vehicle and out of view of the camera.

At approximately 18:06:41 the "M" is displayed and I can now hear audio from Officer DelMerari's remote microphone.

18:06:56 – I heard what appeared to be Officer Gleason's voice asking Vizcarra, "Hey buddy, is that an old wound right there or what?" Vizcarra responds by saying, "You guys shot me earlier."

18:09:38 – The audio from the remote microphone goes out.

18:09:44 – The "M" display on the MAVS disappears.

19:40:38 – The video ends.

The remote audio does not come back on indicating the remote remained turned off after it was shut off. There was nothing else of relevance to this incident contained on the MAVS recording.

I reviewed the following MAVS videos from employees who assisted at the scene at one point or another and did not find anything relevant to this investigation during my review:

I did not find a MAVS recording for Officer Gonzalez who was driving TPD unit 822. He was at the scene for a lengthy period of time before the incident occurred and the computer would have shut down before this occurred.

On 06/03/14 at approximately 0819 hours, Detective N. Nguyen received a toxicology report from the Orange County Crime Lab indicating Vizcarra's blood tested positive for methamphetamine.

The Orange County Sheriff's Department Crime Scene Investigators were called to the scene to conduct all of the CSI. On 10/29/14 Orange County District Attorney Supervising Investigator Gutierrez e-mailed me the Orange County Crime Lab reports he had relevant to this investigation.

On 03/02/14 Orange County Lead Forensic Scientist Fry assisted at the scene. He noticed there were four silver cartridge cases. Three were on the south sidewalk/edge of grass near 1182 Scherer Pl. One cartridge was in the gutter at the driveway entrance to 1182 Scherer Pl.

Fry noticed there was apparent bullet damage to the passenger side view mirror of TPD unit #823 (Officer DelMerari).

Fry noticed a white Ford F-150 truck on the north side of Scherer Pl., parked facing west, just east of Vizcarra's Escalade, had a bullet strike to the front windshield.

Fry noticed a silver Honda Civic parked partially in the driveway at 14582 Carfax Dr. had an apparent bullet hole in the right rear bumper. It appeared to penetrate the exterior bumper, the interior grey felt trunk liner and lodge into the interior right rear wheel well. The bullet was not recovered.

For complete details of Fry's observations, refer to the attached report (attachment 21).

On 03/02/14 Orange County Forensic Specialist Booth responded to TPD and examined Officers Gonzalez and DelMerari. Booth said Officer Gonzalez was carrying a Glock 21-45 Auto (serial #HNP519). He had a magazine with nine cartridges, one cartridge from the chamber and two extra magazines with 13 cartridges in each magazine (four missing).

Booth said Officer DelMerari was carrying a Glock 21-45 Auto (serial #HND551) which was loaded with 13 cartridges and a cartridge in the chamber. He also had two loaded magazines with 13 cartridges each.

For complete details of Booth's observations, refer to the attached report (attachment 22).

I reviewed TPD's current range roster and noticed the serial number and type of weapon Officer Gonzalez was carrying the day of the incident matched Officer Gonzalez' currently authorized duty weapon.

In reference to Officer DelMerari's weapon, there appears to be a typo in the serial number listed in Booth's report. TPD's range roster indicates Officer DelMerari's serial number is HNP551. With the exception of "P," every other number is correct. In looking at the range roster for other non-involved officers, all of the Glock's serial numbers starting with "HN" are always followed with "P." I did not see any starting with "HND."

Therefore, it is my belief the serial number and type of weapon Officer Gonzalez was carrying the day of the incident matched Officer DelMerari's currently authorized duty weapon.

On 03/05/14 Orange Country Senior Forensic Specialist Miller examined Vizcarra's vehicle at the Orange County Crime Lab. She noticed there was an apparent strike mark on the left front door toward the front of the vehicle. There was another apparent strike mark on the left rear door toward the front of the vehicle. She also said there was an apparent bullet entrance hole in the left rear window and an apparent bullet exit hole in the right rear window. Miller said the bullet path apparently entered the left rear window, travelled through the vehicle and exited the right rear window.

For complete details of Miller's observations, refer to the attached report (attachment 23).

On 03/05/14 Orange County Forensic Scientist III Robert Reckers examined Officer Gonzalez' duty weapon and based on his examination, determined the weapon fired without malfunction. He also determined all four shell casings found near the area where Officer Gonzalez fired his weapon, were fired from Officer Gonzalez' duty weapon.

Reckers determined all of the ammunition taken from Officer Gonzalez' weapon and magazines were Winchester brand .45 auto caliber SXT or T-Series jacketed hollow point bullets. I spoke to Detective Kirwan who told me this is the department issued and authorized ammunition. Per TPD policy #312.3 (authorized ammunition) I also confirmed Officer Gonzalez was carrying the authorized ammunition.

For complete details of Reckers observations, refer to the attached report (attachment 24).

DA Supervising Investigator Gutierrez provided me with a diagram of the incident which was prepared by Orange County Forensic Scientist Omar Lazo. I attached the diagram to this report as it gives a decent overhead view of how the scene was found (attachment 25).

According to Orange County DA Investigator Hester, the Orange County Crime Lab was not able to determine the trajectory of every round fired and which round hit the white pick-up truck, which round hit the silver Honda and which round hit Officer DelMerari's passenger side mirror.

Although trajectory of every round fired cannot be determined, it is obvious Officer Gonzalez did fire four rounds from his duty weapon during this incident. The first three rounds were fired while Officer Gonzalez was on the south sidewalk of Scherer Ln, west of Carfax Dr. Officer Gonzalez then moved positions and fired a fourth round. According to the MAVS, Vizcarra's vehicle was stopped for approximately 2-3 seconds before the fourth round was fired.

During my interview with Officer Gonzalez it was apparent he believed the fourth round was necessary as he believed Vizcarra's vehicle was still moving and he feared Officer DelMerari was still in immediate danger. In addition Officer Gonzalez said Vizcarra moved his hands down toward his body and believed he was still armed with a handgun.

It appears Vizcarra was not wounded as a result of Officer Gonzalez firing his weapon. There is no evidence to support Vizcarra's claim a TPD officer shot him earlier in the day.

Please accept this letter regarding the Orange County District Attorney's (OCDA) Office's investigation and legal conclusion in connection with the above-listed incident involving on-duty Tustin Police Department Officer Gustavo Gonzalez. Nicolas Barraza Vizcarra, age 30, survived his injuries. The incident occurred in the City of Tustin on March 2, 2014.

Based upon a review of all the evidence provided to and obtained by the OCDA, and pursuant to applicable legal principles, it is our legal opinion that the evidence does not support a finding of criminal culpability on the part of Officer Gonzalez. There is sufficient evidence showing that the officer's actions were reasonable and justified under the circumstances when he shot at Vizcarra on March 2, 2014. Since there is currently a pending criminal case against Vizcarra relating to the facts which arose out of the above described incident, the OCDA will not release the more detailed letter regarding this incident until after the criminal case against Vizcarra is resolved.

On March 5, 2014, at 0800 hours, I examined a Cadillac Escalade (CA license # 6EBS838) in the vehicle examination area of the Brad Gates Forensic Science Center. Orange County Crime Laboratory (OCCL) Senior Forensic Specialist Lazo took photographs. Also present were OCCL Forensic Specialist Sahagun; Orange County District Attorney (OCDA) Investigator Wood; and Tustin Police Department (TPD) Detective Haug and Officer Newton.

The vehicle was a four door sports utility vehicle with a silver exterior and gray interior. The doors were sealed. The right front window was in the down position, and the others were in the up position. The right and left rear windows were shattered. There was apparent collision damage on the left front and rear doors. There was an apparent strike mark [Evidence Marker (EM G)] on the left front door towards the front of the vehicle. There was another apparent strike mark (EM B) on the left rear door towards the front of the vehicle. A portion of the left rear window adjacent to EM B was missing. There was an apparent bullet entrance hole (EM C) in the left rear window and an apparent bullet exit hole (EM D) in the right rear window. The apparent bullet path enters EM C, travels through the vehicle and exits EM D.

Inside the vehicle, the front right area had clothing and miscellaneous items; the center console and glove box had three \$100 bills, a cell phone, and miscellaneous items; the front left area had miscellaneous papers and a wrench; the rear area had clothing, a folding knife, photos, a micro SD card, and miscellaneous items; and the cargo area had clothing, a radio, and light bar. TPD Detective Haug collected photos, three \$100 bills, and the micro SD card.






SKETCH NOT TO SCALE

I have reviewed the administrative investigation by Sergeant Birozy regarding the Use of Force incident which occurred on March 2, 2014.

CONCLUSION AND REASONING

Based on my review of the information contained in the administrative investigation related to **Officer Gustavo Gonzalez**, including all attachments, my findings regarding the alleged violations to the Tustin Police Department Policy Manual are as follows:

Violation of Tustin Police Department General Orders, Section 340 Disciplinary Policy:

“340.3.5 PERFORMANCE

u) Exceeding lawful peace officer powers by unreasonable, unlawful or excessive conduct.”

Finding: **Exonerated**

After reviewing the report and included attachments prepared by Sergeant Birozy, I find that Officer Gonzalez' actions were reasonable and within policy.

On March 2, 2014, at approximately 1800 hours, Officer Gonzalez was investigating a felony child-endangerment incident where the suspect, Nicolas Barraza-Vizcarra assisted his eight-year old son in firing off a handgun at their residence. Vizcarra fled the residence with the handgun prior to Officer Gonzalez arriving. Vizcarra was believed to be in a Cadillac Escalade SUV.

While Officer Gonzalez was outside the residence at 1142 Scherer #A interviewing a witness, he heard Officer Andrew Gleason broadcast that he was behind the Cadillac and was going to conduct a felony car stop at the intersection of Del Amo and Scherer. Since that was in the immediate vicinity and his police unit was too far away, Officer Gonzalez ran to assist with the stop. Instead of seeing a felony car stop in progress, Officer Gonzalez saw the Cadillac driving westbound at approximately 35 mph on the sidewalk directly at him.

Officer Gonzalez stated he feared Vizcarra was going to run him over with the vehicle or possibly run over the witnesses who were standing behind him. Additionally, Officer

Gonzalez believed Vizcarra was armed with a handgun (later determined he did in fact, have a handgun in the vehicle) and he was possibly going to commit a drive-by shooting. Officer Gonzalez verbally identified himself as a police officer and ordered Vizcarra to stop, but Vizcarra continued driving toward him and was increasing his speed. Officer Gonzalez stated he had no cover to hide behind and he was afraid he was going to die. When Vizcarra drove the vehicle within 40-50 yards of Officer Gonzalez, Officer Gonzalez fired his duty weapon at Vizcarra. Officer Gonzalez said at the speed Vizcarra was traveling, it would have taken him only 2-3 seconds to cover that distance and run him over. Officer Gonzalez fired three rounds in a rapid fire sequence followed by a fourth round one to two seconds later. After the shots were fired, Vizcarra brought his vehicle to a stop, and by this time the vehicle was only 10-15 yards away from Officer Gonzalez.

The Orange County District Attorney's Office investigated this incident and determined, "there is sufficient evidence showing the officer's actions were reasonable and justified under the circumstances..."

Although the Critical Incident Review Board did find some training issues that needed to be addressed, the board unanimously felt the use of force by Officer Gonzalez was objectively reasonable under the guidelines of *Graham v. Connor*.

I concur with the findings of both the Orange County District Attorney's Office and that of the Critical Incident Review Board and I am finding Officer Gonzalez **exonerated** in this use of force application.

PRIOR ACTIONS

None.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend all involved officers attend a debriefing where the training issues identified by the Critical Incident Review Board be addressed.

TUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT

USE OF DEADLY FORCE REVIEW BOARD'S RECOMMENDATIONS

SUMMARY: While working patrol in a marked police unit, Officer Gustavo Gonzalez responded to a report of a subject (Nicholas Vizcarra) giving a gun to his eight-year-old son, telling him he was the man of the house and assisted him in firing the weapon. Vizcarra left the house in a vehicle but returned a short time later. He was confronted by officers, which resulted in an Officer Involved Shooting with Officer Gonzalez.

The Critical Incident Review Board (CIRB) met on Tuesday, December 23, 2014, at 1600 hours in the Chief's conference room. The mission of CIRB is to review employees' actions in regards to training, policies, and tactical considerations. Recommendations will be made via a written report regarding the involved employee's actions to the Chief of Police.

Synopsis: On March 2, 2014, at approximately 0749 hours, TPD received a radio call from Vizcarra's wife [REDACTED] of a disturbance at 1142 Scherer Place #A. [REDACTED] said Vizcarra was in her child's room and believed he was smoking something; she asked the Police Department to hurry. Officers arrived, determined Vizcarra had left, and no crime had been committed.

At approximately 1624 hours TPD received a 911 call of a disturbance at the same location. The caller [REDACTED] stated Vizcarra gave his eight-year-old son a loaded handgun, told him he was the man of the house and had the child shoot

the gun. ██████ stated no one was injured. Per ██████, Vizcarra left the house with the gun; however, she did not know where he went.

Officer Gonzalez arrived at the address on Scherer Place and spoke to ██████. He established Vizcarra had possession of a loaded handgun, had fired it in the backyard with his son, appeared drunk and was now gone. ██████ said Vizcarra drives a Grey or Black Cadillac Escalade. While Gonzalez was speaking with ██████, other TPD officers had set up perimeter locations in case Vizcarra returned.

While Officer Gonzalez was speaking to Vizcarra's wife, he overheard someone broadcast on the radio Vizcarra had returned and was now driving northbound on Carfax toward Scherer. He then heard Officer Gleason say he had the vehicle and a felony car stop was in progress at Carfax Dr. and Scherer Pl. Officer Gonzalez chose to run to the car stop instead of driving due to the close proximity of the stop, his car being too far away and he would have had to wait for his ride-along.

While running on the sidewalk toward the location of the car stop, Officer Gonzalez saw Vizcarra driving on the sidewalk and the grass. He estimated he was approximately 80 feet from Vizcarra. Officer Gonzalez continued running toward Vizcarra's vehicle putting his hand out and screaming at him to stop. Vizcarra continued driving toward Officer Gonzalez at what he (Gonzalez) estimated to be 35mph while still accelerating. Officer Gonzalez was extremely concerned for his safety, the safety of those family members behind him, and for his ride-along. He felt Vizcarra might run him over, Vizcarra's own family members, or possibly engage in some sort of drive-by shooting as he had already fired one round from his gun while inside the residence.

Due to fearing for his life and those behind him, he drew his weapon and fired three times. Officer Gonzalez estimated Vizcarra was approximately 40-50 yards away and traveling at approximately 40mph. He stated there was no cover for him. Vizcarra then veered onto Scherer where Officer Gonzalez fired one more round at him. When asked why he fired again, Officer Gonzalez said he still believed Vizcarra was armed, he saw Vizcarra move his hands down toward his body and he feared he might be reaching for a weapon. He was also in fear of the other officers' lives and the family members present because he believed Vizcarra's vehicle was still moving forward. None of the rounds fired struck Vizcarra or anyone else.

The board unanimously felt the force used by Officer Gonzalez was objectively reasonable under the guidelines of *Graham v. Connor*. Officer Gonzalez stated he feared for not only his life, but the lives of Vizcarra's family members, other Police Officers and a citizen ride-along. Although there was a delay by Officer Gonzalez in firing his fourth and final round, the board found his reasoning for firing the fourth round met the standards of *Graham*.

Please accept this letter detailing the Orange County District Attorney's (OCDA) Office investigation and legal conclusion in connection with the above-listed incident involving on-duty Tustin Police Department (TPD) Officer Gustavo Gonzalez. Nicolas Barraza Vizcarra, age 30, survived his injuries. The incident occurred in the City of Tustin on March 2, 2014.

OVERVIEW

This letter contains a description of the scope and the legal conclusions resulting from the OCDA's investigation of the March 2, 2014, non-fatal, officer-involved shooting of Vizcarra. The letter includes an overview of the OCDA's investigative methodology and procedures employed, as well as a description of the relevant evidence examined, witnesses interviewed, factual findings, and legal principles applied in analyzing the incident and determining whether there was criminal culpability on the part of the TPD officer involved in the shooting. The format of this document was developed by the OCDA, at the request of many Orange County police agencies, to foster greater accountability and transparency in law enforcement.

On March 2, 2014, Investigators from the OCDA Special Assignment Unit (OCDASAU) responded to this incident. During the course of this investigation, 13 interviews were conducted, and 24 additional witnesses were contacted during the supplemental canvass interviews. OCDASAU Investigators also obtained and reviewed the following: TPD reports, audio dispatch and radio traffic recordings; Orange County Crime Laboratory (OCCL) reports, including toxicology, forensic alcohol examination, officer processing and firearms examination reports; crime scene investigation photographs; medical records and photographs related to the injuries sustained by Vizcarra; criminal history records related to Vizcarra; and other relevant reports and materials including audio recordings of the conducted neighborhood canvass.

The OCDA conducted an independent and thorough investigation of the facts and circumstances of this incident and has reviewed all evidence and legal standards impartially. The scope and findings of this review are expressly limited to determining whether any criminal conduct occurred on the part of TPD officers or personnel, specifically Officer Gonzalez. The OCDA will not be addressing issues of policy, training, tactics, or civil liability.

INVESTIGATIVE METHODOLOGY

Among other duties, the OCDASAU is responsible for investigating officer-involved shootings within Orange County when someone has been injured as a result of police gunfire. An OCDASAU Investigator is assigned as a case agent and is supported by other OCDASAU Investigators, as well as Investigators from other OCDA units. Six Investigators are assigned to the OCDASAU on a full-time basis. There are additional OCDA Investigators assigned to other units in the Office trained to assist when needed. On average, eight Investigators respond to an incident within an hour of being called. The Investigators assigned to respond to an incident perform a variety of investigative functions that include witness interviews, neighborhood canvass, crime scene processing and evidence collection, vehicle processing, and hospital investigative responsibilities as needed. The OCDASAU audio records all interviews, and the OCCL processes all physical evidence related to the investigation.

When the OCDASAU Investigator has concluded the investigation, the file is turned over to a veteran Deputy District Attorney for legal review. Deputy District Attorneys from the Homicide or Gang Units review fatal, officer-involved shootings and custodial death cases and determine whether criminal charges are appropriate. Deputy District Attorneys assigned to the Special Prosecutions Unit review the non-fatal officer-involved shooting cases for possible criminal filings. Throughout the review process, the assigned prosecutor will be in consultation with his or her supervisor, and this Assistant District Attorney will eventually review and approve any legal conclusions and resulting memos. The case may often be reviewed by multiple veteran prosecutors, their supervisors, the Chief of Staff, and the District Attorney. If necessary, the reviewing prosecutor may send the case back for further investigation.

An important part of the investigation of an incident such as this is attempting to obtain a statement from the involved officers. Officer Gonzalez gave a voluntary statement on July 29, 2014, to the Orange County Grand Jury.

FACTUAL SUMMARY

On March 2, 2014, at approximately 0749 hours, Tustin Police Department Officers Scott Wright, David Nguyen and Andrew Gleason were dispatched to a family disturbance call at 1142 Scherer Place #A, in the city of Tustin. Upon arrival, Officer Wright contacted the reporting party, Jane Doe. Doe told the officers she resided at the address with her husband, Nicolas Vizcarra, and their three children, and also with her mother and her aunt. Jane Doe told the officers that her husband was smoking marijuana in their bedroom and that she felt Vizcarra's behavior was inappropriate.

Jane Doe told the officers that Vizcarra was in the master bedroom of the home. When officers entered the master bedroom to contact Vizcarra, the room was empty and officers saw the rear sliding door was open. The officers also noticed a video surveillance system in the master bedroom that monitored the front porch of the house. The officers concluded that Vizcarra had seen them approach the house and fled the scene. Vizcarra's daughter later confirmed that Vizcarra saw the police officers, changed into shorts, told her he had to go, and left through the sliding glass door. Officers Wright, Nguyen and Gleason searched the neighborhood, but could not locate Vizcarra.

Around noon, Vizcarra returned home with his mother, Jane Doe 2, to gather his belongings to stay with her temporarily at her home in Riverside. Vizcarra's wife, Jane Doe, was not home. While there, Vizcarra's mother, Jane Doe 2, saw a bandage on Vizcarra's leg, and Vizcarra told her that police had shot him earlier in the day. When they left the residence, Vizcarra drove a separate vehicle and was supposed to follow his mother to her home in Riverside, but he never made it to her residence. At approximately 1430 hours, Vizcarra returned to the 1142 Scherer Place location and parked in front of his house. Vizcarra did not enter the house, but spoke to his daughter outside of the residence. Vizcarra gave his daughter money and told her he was going to stay at a hotel because he got shot. Vizcarra showed his daughter a nickel sized injury to his right knee.

At approximately 1600 hours, Vizcarra returned to his home and was in possession of a small black box. Vizcarra's mother-in-law, Jane Doe 3, was home at the time with Vizcarra's 8-year-old son, John Doe. Vizcarra placed the box on the kitchen counter and removed a dark colored pistol. John Doe was playing with toy cars and Vizcarra told his son to "Come, shoot the gun." Vizcarra showed the pistol to his son and walked him over to the back door of the residence that looked out towards the rear patio. Vizcarra then placed the grip of the pistol in his son's hands and placed his own hands around the child's hands. Vizcarra pulled the trigger and fired one round into the rear yard, striking a lemon tree and the base of a fence. Vizcarra then put the pistol back in the box, said he was going to Riverside, and left. Jane Doe 3 called 911 to report the incident to the Tustin Police Department.

At approximately 1631 hours, TPD Officer Gustavo Gonzalez arrived at the residence and contacted the reporting party, Jane Doe 3. TPD Sergeant Jeff Taylor, Officers Royce Delmerari, Jason Muro, and Andrew Gleason also arrived at the residence to assist in the investigation. Jane Doe 3 informed the officers that Vizcarra had walked into the house acting aggressive and speaking loudly, and told his son "Now you're the man of the house," before putting the pistol into his son's hands and firing it into the ground in the back yard. Jane Doe 3 informed Officer Gonzalez that Vizcarra had driven away in a Cadillac Escalade.

Officers Delmerari, Taylor, and Gleason searched the residence for officer safety reasons. During their search, Officer Delmerari located an expended .40 caliber cartridge casing between the kitchen and the living room. Officers also located an apparent bullet hole in the wood fence near the rear of the patio, approximately five feet away from the expended cartridge casing. According to Officer Delmerari, Vizcarra's 8-year-old son was so frightened by the incident that he was too scared to speak. Sergeant Taylor, Officer Muro, and Officer Gleason left the residence to conduct a search for Vizcarra, while Officer Gonzalez and Officer Delmerari stayed at the residence to take photographs, collect evidence, and process the scene.

Officer Gleason parked his patrol car northbound on Carfax Drive, south of Sycamore Avenue, to intercept Vizcarra if he drove back into the neighborhood. Officer Gleason was aware from the previous morning call at 1142 Scherer Place that Vizcarra was acting strangely and possibly under the influence of marijuana and/or other drugs. Dispatch informed officers of prior domestic violence incidents at the residence, and that Vizcarra was on probation with search and seizure terms. Officer Gleason also received information that Vizcarra was driving a Cadillac Escalade with a license plate number of 6EBS838.

At approximately 1801 hours, Officer Gleason saw a silver Cadillac Escalade travel northbound onto Carfax Drive from Sycamore Avenue. After the Escalade completed its turn, Gleason noticed that its license plate number, 6EBS838, matched Vizcarra's vehicle. Officer Gleason followed the Escalade and observed Vizcarra's reflection in the driver's side rear-view mirror. Officer Gleason used his police radio to advise dispatch and surrounding police units that he was following Vizcarra's vehicle on Carfax Drive and was approaching Scherer Place. Gleason then advised dispatch that he was going to conduct a "960 x-ray" (high risk traffic stop) on Vizcarra's vehicle near the corner of Carfax Drive and Scherer Place.

Prior to Officer Gleason initiating a traffic stop, Vizcarra stopped his vehicle on the street, just south of the driveway to 14609 Carfax Drive, and activated his left turn signal. Officer Gleason then turned on his vehicle's overhead emergency lights and immediately got out of his patrol car. As Gleason was getting out of his vehicle, Vizcarra turned left into the driveway of 14609 Carfax Drive, and Gleason briefly lost sight of the vehicle due to his view being blocked by cross traffic and cars parked on the side of the street. At the same time, Officer Gonzalez was outside of the residence on Scherer Place talking to Jane Doe 1 and Jane Doe 3. Officer Gonzalez heard Officer Gleason broadcast Vizcarra's location. Officer Gonzalez was very familiar with the neighborhood and realized Officer Gleason was extremely close to his location. Officer Gonzalez immediately ran east along the south sidewalk of Scherer Place to assist Officer Gleason apprehend Vizcarra.

Officer Delmerari also heard Officer Gleason's radio broadcast, and immediately drove east on Scherer Place to assist Officer Gleason. While driving to Officer Gleason's location, Officer Delmerari saw Officer Gonzalez running on the

sidewalk and drove past him. Officer Delmerari did not see Officer Gonzalez with his handgun out while he was running toward Officer Gleason's location. According to Officer Gonzalez, as he reached the mid-block area of Scherer Place, he saw the headlights and front grill of what he recognized to be a Cadillac Escalade. Officer Gonzalez was aware that Vizcarra was reportedly driving a Cadillac Escalade. Officer Gonzalez then observed the Escalade jump the curb up onto the sidewalk and accelerate on the sidewalk of Scherer Place straight towards Officer Gonzalez.

Officer Gonzalez became extremely concerned for the safety of Vizcarra's family at 1142 Scherer Place, because Vizcarra was now driving up on the sidewalk towards their house. Officer Gonzalez believed Vizcarra was a danger because he was possibly under the influence of drugs, was extremely upset with his family, had fired a handgun earlier in the day at his home, and was likely still in possession of the handgun. Officer Gonzalez was also concerned for the safety of his citizen observer ride-a-long and Officer Delmerari, because he believed them both to be at Vizcarra's home. Officer Gonzalez indicated that he was convinced he was the only person at that time able to stop Vizcarra from ramming his vehicle into 1142 Scherer Place, attempting to use his vehicle and run over the people still standing outside of the home, and/or doing a drive-by shooting with the handgun in his possession.

Officer Gonzalez estimated that Vizcarra's vehicle was approximately 60 yards east of his location and traveling at 25-35 miles per hour on the sidewalk as it approached him. According to Officer Gonzalez, he could hear the Escalade's engine accelerate as it drove east on the sidewalk toward him, and he estimated it would have taken approximately 2-3 seconds for the vehicle to reach his location. Officer Gonzalez raised his hand up and yelled, "Stop, stop, stop, stop," but the vehicle did not slow down or change course. According to Officer Gonzalez, he was near the south sidewalk in front of 1162 Scherer Place when he drew his gun and fired three rounds in immediate succession toward the driver's compartment of the vehicle. Vizcarra abruptly turned his vehicle off of the sidewalk and onto Scherer Place. Officer Delmerari was east on Scherer Place and had to stop his patrol vehicle quickly to avoid a collision with Vizcarra's vehicle as it re-entered the street from the sidewalk. Delmerari stopped his patrol vehicle within inches of the driver's door of Vizcarra's vehicle.

Officer Gonzalez saw Officer Delmerari's vehicle was in the direct path of Vizcarra's vehicle. According to Officer Gonzalez, he was afraid Vizcarra was going to use his vehicle to ram Officer Delmerari's vehicle in an attempt to flee from police. Acting on this belief, Officer Gonzalez fired one additional round at Vizcarra's vehicle. Officer Gonzalez believed all of his shots hit Vizcarra's vehicle. Vizcarra then stopped his vehicle and put his hands in the air. Vizcarra was escorted out of the vehicle at gunpoint and placed under arrest. While administering first aid, an officer asked about the wound on Vizcarra's leg. Vizcarra said, "You shot me earlier." Later, Vizcarra stated, "I got shot twice today."

Officer Gonzalez fired four shots. None of the bullets struck Vizcarra's body but Vizcarra's vehicle was hit by Officer Gonzalez's shots.

At approximately 1811 hours, Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) personnel arrived on scene. OCFA paramedics contacted and assessed Vizcarra for injuries. Vizcarra had injuries to his right lower leg, but was uncooperative with paramedics and vague as to how he sustained the apparent gunshot wound to his right leg earlier in the day. Vizcarra admitted he smoked marijuana earlier in the day to relieve the pain from his leg injury. The paramedics dressed and treated Vizcarra's lower right leg and transported him to Western Medical Center – Santa Ana (WMC-SA). During transport to WMC-SA, Vizcarra stated he was shot with a 9mm gun earlier in the day by an officer from the Tustin Police Department.

Upon arrival at WMC-SA, Vizcarra was treated by hospital staff, who observed a possible gunshot wound to Vizcarra's right lower leg. An x-ray revealed that there was no bullet, fragments, fractures, or foreign bodies in Vizcarra's leg. Vizcarra refused any further tests for injury. During the examination and treatment, Vizcarra told hospital staff he had been shot earlier in the day at approximately 0800 hours with a 9mm bullet, but did not state who had shot him. Vizcarra further stated he removed the bullet himself at a friend's house using a butter knife and alcohol as an antiseptic. Vizcarra was medically cleared that evening and released from WMC-SA to the custody of the Tustin Police Department.

Post-Shooting, Voluntary Interview with Civilian Ride-Along Observer Jane Doe 4

Tustin Police Dispatcher Jane Doe 4 gave a voluntary, consensual statement to the OCDA on March 2, 2014. On that date, Jane Doe 4 was a Communications Trainee at Tustin Police Department. She was working at the time of the officer involved shooting incident, and was assigned to a ride-along with Officer Gonzalez on patrol as a civilian observer.

According to Jane Doe 4, Officer Gonzalez was dispatched on a call regarding a domestic disturbance, and was interviewing two females, later identified as Vizcarra's mother-in-law and Vizcarra's wife, outside of the residence on Scherer Place. While interviewing the women, Officer Gonzalez stopped suddenly and appeared to respond to a radio call. Jane Doe 4 stated that Gonzalez stopped the interview, said, "I have to go," and ran towards the street and continued to run on the sidewalk towards Carfax Drive.

As Officer Gonzalez ran on the sidewalk of Scherer Place towards Carfax Drive, Jane Doe 4 saw a large SUV turn onto Scherer Place from Carfax and drive onto the sidewalk. The SUV was driving between the homes and parked cars. Jane Doe 4 said the SUV was driving straight at Officer Gonzalez at a "fast" speed. Jane Doe 4 was farther away from Officer Gonzalez than the SUV, but it was clear to her that Officer Gonzalez was a police officer.

The SUV continued to approach Officer Gonzalez and was one property length away from Officer Gonzalez when it turned towards the street. Jane Doe 4 heard two or three gunshots after the SUV had turned back onto the street from the sidewalk. Jane Doe 4 stated her view of the scene was partially obstructed by the vehicles parked along Scherer Place.

Nicolas Vizcarra's, Voluntary, Post-Miranda Interview

Vizcarra gave a voluntary, consensual statement to the OCDA on March 2, 2014. Before the interview, Vizcarra was read his *Miranda* rights, verbally acknowledged he understood his rights, and spoke with investigators from TPD and the OCDA.

According to Vizcarra, on March 2, 2014 at approximately 0745 hours he returned home from work as a street sweeper. When he got to his bedroom, he looked at a video monitor set up in the bedroom to feed video surveillance footage from a camera on his front porch. Vizcarra saw police officers park down the street from his house and begin to walk up to his front porch. Vizcarra left the residence because he was on probation and did not want to talk to the police.

Vizcarra claimed he was shot around 8 a.m. by a Tustin Police Department officer in the Tustin Hospital parking lot, when he jumped the wall from his property into the hospital parking lot. A subsequent investigation by OCDA investigators into this claim proved that this claim is unsubstantiated by any evidence (see discussion below).

At approximately 1800-1900 hours, Vizcarra was driving back home and was northbound on Carfax Drive in Tustin, when he noticed a police car following him. As he was going to turn to park in a friend's driveway Carfax Drive, the police car activated its emergency lights. Vizcarra stated that he did not know why the officer would stop him. He became confused and drove onto his friend's property and parked on the lawn.

According to Vizcarra, he parked on the grass, and the officer said, "Freeze," and drew his gun. Vizcarra felt the police officer used too much force for a traffic stop, so he drove away on the sidewalk because the police vehicle was blocking his exit. Vizcarra stated that at that point the police shot at him "three or four times for no reason".

During the interview, Vizcarra denied firing the handgun at his house earlier in the day and said he did not possess a gun. Vizcarra later said he had guns in a safety deposit box in the bank. Vizcarra denied shooting himself in the leg earlier that day.

When confronted with specific questions regarding his actions before the police shooting, Vizcarra refused to answer additional questions and requested to speak to his attorney. At that point the interview was terminated.

Vizcarra's Claim That He Was Shot Earlier In the Morning of March 2, 2014 by an Unknown TPD Officer

Vizcarra claimed an unidentified Tustin Police Department officer shot him in the leg the morning of March 2, 2014, at approximately 0800 hours. OCDA investigators conducted a separate investigation to determine if Vizcarra was shot by a TPD officer earlier that day.

Vizcarra alleged he was shot at approximately 0800 hours on March 2, 2014. According to Vizcarra, he climbed the concrete wall behind his residence to avoid contact with the police responding to his wife's 911 call. Immediately after he climbed over the wall and into the adjacent parking lot of Tustin Hospital, Vizcarra claimed he saw a uniformed TPD officer and a TPD patrol unit in the hospital parking lot. Vizcarra claimed that an officer yelled at him to "Freeze!," then shot him once in the leg. Vizcarra claimed he limped away to a friend's garage, where he did an operation with a butter knife and alcohol to remove a 9mm bullet from a Beretta handgun.

On March 4, 2014, TPD Detective Natalie Nguyen and OCDA Investigator Billy Hester walked through the area behind Vizcarra's residence. At the base of the wall were two metal chairs stacked on top of each other, used to climb over the wall and into the parking lot of Tustin Hospital directly on the other side. Detective Nguyen and Investigator Hester did not see any signs of blood, mud, dirt, fresh footprints, or any other evidence to indicate that Vizcarra had been shot at the location. They searched the perimeter of the wall and the parking lot of the Tustin Hospital and did not locate any evidence of a shooting. There were no surveillance cameras on the hospital or in the parking lot that could have captured this alleged encounter.

On March 3, 2014, OCDA Investigator Brett Andersen and TPD Detective Colton Kirwan contacted the individual who shared the garage where Vizcarra claimed he removed the 9mm bullet from his leg. According to Vizcarra, he left a butter knife, the bullet he pulled from his leg, and bloody paper towels in the garage. The resident at the apartment unlocked the garage and allowed the investigators to search for evidence. After searching the garage for approximately 30 minutes, the investigators were unable to find any of the items Vizcarra described.

All TPD vehicles have GPS devices which allow police dispatchers to monitor patrol vehicles' locations at any time. OCDA Investigators obtained these GPS location records for every on-duty TPD patrol unit on March 2, 2014, from 0745-0830 hours. After reviewing the results, OCDA Investigators did not find any TPD patrol units parked in the Tustin Hospital parking lot as claimed by Vizcarra.

Vizcarra claimed he was shot by a 9mm bullet, specifically from a Beretta handgun. He claimed to have removed the bullet from his leg himself with a butter knife. According to TPD Range Master, Detective Colton Kirwan, seven TPD officers carry Beretta 9mm handguns on duty and two TPD officers carried Glock 9mm handguns on duty. Out of these 9 officers, none of them were working on March 2, 2014.

During Vizcarra's initial contact with police at the scene and during his arrest, he told TPD Officer Wright and Officer Ramirez that he had shot himself in the leg earlier. Vizcarra later changed his statement and said an unknown officer from TPD shot him earlier that day.

After investigating Vizcarra's allegations, OCDA investigators determined that Vizcarra's claim that an officer from TPD shot him in the leg earlier that day was unsubstantiated and unsupported by any evidence.

EVIDENCE COLLECTED

The following items were collected from Officer Gonzalez:

- Glock, Model 21, .45 caliber, semi-automatic pistol, with a Surefire x200 flashlight mounted beneath the barrel
- (1) .45 caliber cartridge of "Winchester 45 auto" from the pistol chamber
- (9) .45 caliber cartridges of "Winchester 45 auto" from the (13) cartridge capacity magazine in Officer Gonzalez's handgun
- (2) Magazines from Officer Gonzalez's duty belt, each containing (13) cartridges of "Winchester 45 auto"

During the processing of the scene, the following four items of evidence were located, photographed and collected. The items were assigned evidence marked (EM) numbers 1 through 4. The following items were collected from the scene:

- EM-1 - One .45 caliber cartridge casing, from sidewalk (Winchester .45 Auto caliber)
- EM-2 - One .45 caliber cartridge casing, from sidewalk (Winchester .45 Auto caliber)
- EM-3 - One .45 caliber cartridge casing, from sidewalk (Winchester .45 Auto caliber)
- EM-4 - One .45 caliber cartridge casing, from sidewalk (Winchester .45 Auto caliber)

The following items were collected during a cursory examination of the interior of Vizcarra's Cadillac Escalade, license plate 6EBS838, from the front passenger-side floorboard:

- Ruger pistol, model P94, .40 caliber, stainless steel, black grips, s/n 340-49608 in a hard black plastic case with a loaded magazine seated in the pistol, containing approximately 9 rounds of .40 caliber ball ammunition.

The following seven evidence markers were located and photographed as apparent bullet holes/bullet strikes on vehicles from within the scene:

- EM-A – Apparent bullet strike, into passenger side mirror, Tustin Police unit # 23,
- EM-B – Apparent bullet strike, into left rear door frame, forward most edge, Cadillac Escalade, California license number 6EBS838,
- EM-C – Apparent bullet hole, through left rear window, exits right rear window, Cadillac Escalade, California license number 6EBS838,
- EM-D – Apparent bullet hole exit. On right rear window, lower rear most, Cadillac Escalade, California license number 6EBS838
- EM-E – Apparent bullet skip/strike, on front windshield 2005 Ford F-150 truck,
- EM-F – Apparent bullet hole into rear bumper, 2013 Honda Civic,
- EM-G – Apparent bullet strike on "A" pillar, Cadillac Escalade, California license number 6EBS838.

EVIDENCE ANALYSIS

Firearms Examination

The Ruger P94 pistol, .40 caliber, serial number 340-49608, was recovered from Vizcarra's vehicle. The Ruger was examined and test fired by a forensic scientist at the Orange County Crime Lab (OCCL). The .40 caliber cartridge casing from the test fired Ruger pistol was microscopically examined and compared to the expended .40 caliber cartridge casing recovered from Vizcarra's home. The OCCL forensic scientist concluded the expended cartridge casing found at Vizcarra's home was fired from the Ruger P94 pistol, serial number 340-49608 found in Vizcarra's Cadillac.

Toxicological Examination

A sample of Vizcarra's blood was drawn at WMC-SA and submitted to the Orange County Crime Lab to test for the presence of drugs and alcohol. The results showed that Vizcarra's blood was positive for Methamphetamine, THC, a chemical found in Marijuana, and its metabolite, THCA.

Scene Reconstruction

To assist in this investigation, the Orange County Crime Lab (OCCL) forensic specialists measured the distance between the three expended shell casings at the scene (the approximate location of Officer Gonzalez when he fired his weapon), to the middle of the driveway of 1192 Scherer Place (the approximate location of Vizcarra's vehicle when it turned off the sidewalk). These general locations of the involved parties when the shooting first occurred were measured to be a distance of approximately 120 feet.

According to Officer Delmerari and Officer Gonzalez, Vizcarra's vehicle was estimated to be traveling at approximately 25-35 mph as it drove on the sidewalk towards Gonzalez.

OCDA Investigator Wesley Vandiver was consulted to determine how long it would take Vizcarra's vehicle to reach Officer Gonzalez at a steady rate of 35mph, covering 120 feet. Investigator Vandiver is an expert in traffic accident reconstruction and has testified as such multiple times in the Orange County Superior Court. With Investigator Vandiver's assistance, it was determined that it would have taken approximately 2.3 seconds for Vizcarra's vehicle to reach Officer Gonzalez's general location.

NICOLAS VIZCARRA'S PRIOR CRIMINAL HISTORY

Vizcarra's criminal history was reviewed and considered. Vizcarra's criminal history includes driving in willful disregard for safety of others while fleeing from police; driving opposite traffic while fleeing from police; felon with a firearm; brandishing a replica firearm; corporal injury to a spouse; spousal battery; sexual battery; speed contest; drug possession; possession of drug paraphernalia; resisting arrest; grand theft; vehicle tampering; damaging a wireless device; driving on a suspended license; and violations of probation.

VIZCARRA'S POST-INCIDENT CONVICTION

On March 4, 2014, the OCDA filed criminal charges against Vizcarra in Orange County Superior Court case 14CF0790, accusing him of felony Child Abuse, a violation of California Penal Code section 273(a); felony Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, in violation of California Penal Code section 29800(a)(1); felony Personal Discharge of a Firearm with Gross Negligence, in violation of California Penal Code section 246.3(a); and Possession of Marijuana, an infraction, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 11357(b). Vizcarra plead guilty to all counts, except the infraction Possession of Marijuana, which was dismissed pursuant to a negotiated disposition. Vizcarra was sentenced to four years in custody, followed by an additional three years and four months of mandatory supervision.

Pursuant to his plea agreement, Vizcarra admitted the following:

"In Orange County, California, on 3/2/14, under circumstances likely to produce great bodily harm, I did willfully and unlawfully permit a child to suffer unjustifiable mental suffering. I also unlawfully possessed a firearm having been previously convicted of a felony. I also willfully and unlawfully personally discharged a firearm in a grossly negligent manner which could have resulted in injury or death to another person."

STANDARD LEGAL PRINCIPLES IN OFFICER-INVOLVED SHOOTING CASES

Possible criminal charges against an officer involved in a non-fatal shooting include attempted murder [Penal Code Section 664/187]; assault with a deadly weapon [Penal Code Section 245]; and assault by a police officer [Penal Code Section 149]. In order to convict an officer of any of these charges, however, it would be necessary to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that no legal justifications existed for the officers' actions. (*People v. Adrian* (1982) 135 Cal.App.3d 335, 340-342.) Several such justifications may apply in any given case and they are set forth in Penal Code Sections 196, 197 and 835a.

California Penal Code Section 196 provides that use of deadly force by a public officer is justifiable when necessarily used in arresting persons who are "charged with a felony" and who are fleeing from justice or resisting such arrest. Section 196 applies both where the suspect in question is "charged with a felony" and where the officer has "reasonable cause" to believe that the person has committed a felony. (*Kortum v. Alkire* (1977) 69 Cal.App.3d 325, 332.) The felony must involve violence or the threat of violence. (*Id.* at 333.)

California Penal Code Section 197 provides that the use of deadly force by any person is justifiable when used in self-defense or in defense of others.

California Penal Code Section 835a allows any police officer who has reasonable cause to believe that a person to be arrested has committed a felony [public offense] to use reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape, or to overcome resistance. The section further provides that a police officer "who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his efforts by reason of the resistance or threatened resistance of the person being arrested; nor shall such officer be deemed an aggressor or lose his right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect

the arrest or to prevent escape or to overcome resistance." The Court appeal in *Kortum* further held that deadly force against a fleeing felony suspect is justifiable only when the felony "is of the violent variety, i.e., a forcible and atrocious one which threatens death or serious bodily harm, or there are other circumstances which reasonably create a fear of death or serious bodily harm to the officer or to another." (*Kortum v. Alkire, supra*, 69 Cal.App.3d at p. 333.)

In addition, Penal Code section 834a requires that if a person has knowledge, or by the exercise of reasonable care, should have knowledge, that he is being arrested by a peace officer, that person must refrain from using force or any weapon to resist such arrest.

Similarly, the relevant Criminal Jury Instruction as written by the Judicial Council of California and set forth in CALCRIM 3470 permits a person being assaulted to defend himself from attack if, as a reasonable person, he had grounds for believing and did believe that bodily injury was about to be inflicted upon him or upon another person. In doing so, such person may immediately use all force and means which he believes to be reasonably necessary and which would appear to a reasonable person, in the same or similar circumstances, to be necessary to defend against that danger and to prevent the injury which appears to be imminent.

The law as detailed in CALCRIM 3470 and in well-settled case law therefore permits a person, if confronted by the appearance of danger which arouses in his/her mind, as a reasonable person, an honest fear and conviction that he/she or another person is about to suffer bodily injury, to act in self-defense or defense of others upon such appearances, and from such fear and honest convictions. The person's right of self-defense is the same whether the danger is real or merely apparent. (*People v. Jackson* (1965) 233 Cal.App.2d 639, 641-642.)

Nevertheless, the above justifications must be interpreted in light of United States Supreme Court precedent that limits the right of a police officer to use deadly force. (*People v. Martin* (1985) 168 Cal.App.3d 1111, 1124.) Thus, in *Tennessee v. Garner* (1985) 471 U.S. 1, 3, the United States Supreme Court ruled that a police officer is entitled to use deadly force only when "the officer has probable cause to believe that the suspect poses a significant threat of death or serious physical injury to the officer or others."

This limitation was, however, clarified subsequently by the United States Supreme Court in the seminal case of *Graham v. Connor* (1989) 490 U.S. 386, wherein the Supreme Court explained that an officer's right to use force [i.e., his/her weapon] is to be analyzed under the Fourth Amendment's "objective reasonableness" standard. The Supreme Court further stated that the determination of the reasonableness of an officer's use of force "must embody allowance for the fact that police officers are often forced to make split-second judgments—in circumstances that are tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving." (*Id.* at 396-397.) Thus, the Court cautioned that the "reasonableness of a particular use of force must be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene, rather than with the 20/20 vision of hindsight." (*Id.* at 396.)

The United States Supreme Court's analysis and teachings in *Graham, supra*, are very much applicable to the circumstances surrounding the interaction of Officer Gonzalez with Vizcarra.

LEGAL ANALYSIS

At the time of the incident, Officer Gonzalez and his fellow TPD officers knew Vizcarra fired a weapon in his backyard in the presence of his 8 year old son, and Vizcarra was likely to be in possession of that firearm. Officer Gonzalez was aware of the earlier 911 call, previous domestic violence between Vizcarra and his wife, Vizcarra's criminal history and probation status. Additionally, Officer Gonzalez was aware that Vizcarra was possibly under the influence of a controlled substance.

While running on Scherer Place to assist Officer Gleason with the traffic stop of Vizcarra's vehicle, Officer Gonzalez was surprised and caught off-guard when he saw the Escalade turn onto the sidewalk and accelerates in his direction. Officer Gonzalez yelled at Vizcarra to stop several times. The Escalade continued to accelerate towards him. The distance between Officer Gonzalez and Vizcarra's vehicle was approximately 120 feet. If the Escalade continued on

the sidewalk, it would have reached Officer Gonzalez in 2-3 seconds. It would defy logic for anybody to conclude that at that moment Officer Gonzalez did not have the legal right to use deadly force to try to stop Vizcarra.

Officer Gonzalez was extremely concerned for the people whom he believed to be in front of Vizcarra's house, including Vizcarra's wife, Vizcarra's mother-in-law, Officer Gonzalez's ride-along civilian observer, and his fellow TPD officer. According to Officer Gonzalez, he believed Vizcarra was either going to do a drive-by shooting or attempt to ram the Escalade into the home or the people standing outside in the driveway. Officer Gonzalez, based on the totality of the circumstances, was certainly reasonable in so believing.

Vizcarra refused to comply with Officer Gleason's commands when Gleason initiated the traffic stop. Instead, Vizcarra tried to flee from police by driving his vehicle up onto the sidewalk in a densely populated residential neighborhood. Vizcarra accelerated his vehicle directly towards Officer Gonzalez, who was running on the same sidewalk toward Vizcarra. Officer Gonzalez reasonably believed that Vizcarra posed an imminent threat to the life and safety of himself and others. According to Officer Gonzalez, it was at that point that he felt the only way to defend himself, his fellow officers, and the people still at Vizcarra's house from this threat was to fire his weapon at the Escalade in an attempt to disable its driver.

After Officer Gonzalez fired three shots at Vizcarra's vehicle, the Escalade abruptly turned back onto the street. According to Officer Gonzalez, it appeared to him that Vizcarra was going to ram Officer Delmerari's police unit, which was now positioned directly in front of Vizcarra's Escalade. Fearing Vizcarra was going to ram his partner's vehicle, Officer Gonzalez fired an additional round at the Escalade. Vizcarra was not struck by any of the four bullets fired.

Based on the totality of the circumstances, as a reasonable person, Officer Gonzalez had grounds for believing and did believe that bodily injury was about to be inflicted upon him or upon another person. Vizcarra refused to comply with multiple commands to stop, fled from Officer Gleason, drove on the sidewalk and accelerated towards Officer Gonzalez. Vizcarra presented a clear danger, which reasonably aroused in the mind of Officer Gonzalez an honest fear that Vizcarra posed an imminent threat to himself, other officers, and the individuals standing in front of Vizcarra's home only a few hundred feet away.

In order for Officer Gonzalez to be justly and lawfully charged and convicted with a crime in this incident, it is the OCDA's burden to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that Officer Gonzalez did not act in reasonable and justifiable self-defense or defense of another when he shot at Vizcarra. As should be apparent from the above-described analysis, the prosecution would be unable to carry this burden in this case. A jury analyzing these facts would justly conclude that it was reasonable for Officer Gonzalez to use the force he did in this circumstance. There is significant evidence showing that Officer Gonzalez acted reasonably under the circumstances and was justified in using the force he believed to be reasonable to defend against that danger and to prevent the injury which appeared to be imminent. Officer Gonzalez did not commit a crime.

CONCLUSION

Based upon a review of all of the evidence provided to and obtained by the OCDA, and based on the entirety of the facts contained in all the available reports and interviews reviewed, and pursuant to the applicable legal principles, it is our legal opinion that there is no evidence of criminal culpability on the part of Officer Gonzalez. Rather, there is overwhelming evidence that Officer Gonzalez's actions were reasonable and justified under the circumstances when he shot at Nicolas Vizcarra on March 2, 2014.

Accordingly, the OCDA is closing its inquiry into this incident.
