SYNOPSIS: Male subject is arrested for MISAPPROPRIATION OF PROPERTY. While taking the subject into custody a fight occurs and three police officers were injured during the struggle with the subject. The subject was believed to be UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: I am assigned to the Tustin Police Department's North Area Patrol. Prior to my patrol assignment, I was a member of the Tustin Police Special Enforcement Detail (SED Team) which is a specialized unit assigned to southwest Tustin, as part of the area command to provide saturation patrol resources in high crime areas. Southwest Tustin is a high-crime area prone to murders, robberies, sexual assaults, assaults with deadly weapons, burglaries, stolen vehicles, gang activity, and drug activity.

I have been a Police Officer for fifteen years. I completed a six-month POST certified police academy which gives instruction in the identification of illegal drugs. I completed approximately four months of the Tustin Police Department Field Training Program. During the Field Training Program, I received specific training regarding the identification and packaging of illegal drugs. I also received training during this program in regards to the common indicators of possession and possession for sale of illegal drugs. The most common indicators of possession for sale being, drug quantity, individual packaging, method of packaging, scales, additional drug baggies, low denomination currency, pay/owe sheets and multiple communication devices.

I also spent five years as a detective assigned to the Property Crimes Team, and three years as a Field Training Officer. My duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to, traffic enforcement, city code enforcement, responding to and investigating homicides, robberies, sex crimes, crimes against children, assaults, property crimes, crimes involving fraud, parole and probation searches and warrant services in addition to addressing quality of life issues within the community of Tustin.

I have completed the (24) hour POST certified Drug Abuse Recognition program (DAR). The DAR program provides extensive training on the identification of illegal drugs along with the signs and symptoms of people under the influence of controlled substances.

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I have successfully completed an (8) hour training class hosted by Serrato and Associates on the identification and packaging methods of street drugs (Street Drugs ID and Packaging). This class detailed the methods of ingestion, the differences between possession and possession for sale, the identification of known street drugs including methamphetamine, cocaine, heroin, the methods of manufacturing for each of the drugs and common methods of packaging for each of the drugs.

I have seen methamphetamine, heroin and cocaine over 200 times. I have tested methamphetamine, heroin and cocaine numerous times. I have participated in numerous drug investigations involving methamphetamine, heroin and cocaine.

NARRATIVE: On 080917 at approximately 1430 hours I was working uniformed patrol, in unit #818, for the city of Tustin, County of Orange. At that time and date, I was dispatched to the Citi Bank, located at 18232 Irvine Blvd, reference a WELFARE CHECK. It was reported a male subject, later identified as Maninder Singh, entered the Citi Bank and appeared disoriented. Banking personnel later reported they thought Singh may attempt to rob the bank.

Officers Wagner, Valencia, Hense and Turner arrived before me and located Singh in the parking lot outside of the bank. When I arrived I saw Singh was seated on the sidewalk in front of the bank and was leaning against the building.

While I spoke with Singh, Officer Hense located a 2003 Acura, CA license [REDACTED] belonging to Singh in the parking lot of the Citi Bank. Singh was in possession of keys to the Acura and gave Officer Hense permission to enter the Acura and get his California Driver's License from the vehicle.

OBSERVATIONS OF SINGH: I noticed Singh was very fidgety and his speech was very rapid. I saw he was sweating heavily and could not stop moving. Singh was crying and told me his girlfriend just broke up with him and he just wanted to go home. Singh said he lives in Baldwin Park with his girlfriend. Singh was breathing heavily and sweating profusely. I saw he showed signs of bruxism (grinding his teeth) and had retracted eyelids. He also showed signs of extreme paranoia. Additionally, Singh appeared disoriented and could not keep his focus. Based on my observations of Singh I believe he was under the influence of a CNS stimulant. I took his pulse rate at the scene and it was approximately 125 beats per minute. I also saw Singh had a thin white coating on his tongue.

I asked Singh if he had been using any drugs which he denied. He later stated he had a history with methamphetamine use but no longer uses.

Singh gave me permission to search his vehicle. During the search of his Acura I located two credit cards:

Wells Fargo Debit/Visa
Pilot/Flying J Gas card

[REDACTED]
Garry Express Transportation

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Singh told me he did not know [REDACTED] and he found the debit card at a gas station. He said the card was left in the card reader at the pump. Singh admitted he used the card to put \$10 of gasoline in his car since he didn't have any money.

Singh told me he found the Pilot/Flying J gas card.

A record check of both cards showed neither had been reported as stolen. Both card numbers were later entered into Stolen Property System as evidence.

Based on Singh's admission he used the credit card he found he committed the crime of MISSAPPROPRIATION OF PROPERTY-PC 485.

I placed Singh under arrest for the violation and attempted to put handcuffs on his wrists and as I did so, his body immediately became tense and he held his arms and hands tight against his body. I placed one side of the handcuffs onto his left wrist and attempted to get his hand behind his back and tried to adjust the handcuff. Singh then stood up and knocked me to the ground and tried to flee the scene while Officer's Hense and Wagner attempted to control him. Both Officer Hense and Wagner fell to the ground with Singh and were attempting to gain control of his hands. I grabbed Singh's legs and attempted to keep him from kicking. The struggle continued for approximately 30 seconds and additional police units were requested to respond Code-3 (full lights and sirens) to assist. At some point during the continuation of the struggle, I was shoved to the ground by Singh.

Singh, who is medium sized in stature (5'11 and 199 lbs.) had extreme strength and was unable to be subdued by three officers.

While the three of us were fighting with Singh on the pavement I saw Singh place his hand on Officer Hense's firearm and attempt to remove it from the holster. I verbally told Hense that Singh was trying to get his gun from his holster. Officer Hense grabbed Singh's hand to stop him from taking his gun. I removed my TASER from the holster, removed the tip and placed the tip on Singh's thigh and engaged the trigger, with no reaction from Singh. I gave Singh approximately three to four contact shots with the TASER in his thigh and buttocks area, with no response from him. Singh continued to fight until additional officers responded to assist. Once Singh was handcuffed he still continued to resist by tensing his body and kicking. A hobble restraint was placed on his legs to restrain him from kicking.

Due to Singh's agitated state, Orange County Fire paramedics were requested to respond to evaluate him. He was transported to Orange County Global Medical Center for evaluation. He was later admitted.

I contacted the two employees from Citi Bank that called the police. They told me the following:

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Statement by [REDACTED] (Reporting Party-Citi Bank [REDACTED])

[REDACTED] told me Singh entered the bank and appeared "disoriented" and "distracted". He stated he was "lost" and wanted to go home. [REDACTED] escorted Singh out of the bank and called police for a WELFARE CHECK. [REDACTED] said Singh re-entered the bank and started to get something from his pocket. [REDACTED] feared Singh was reaching for a note and was possibly going to rob the bank. [REDACTED] told Singh all of the banking systems were down and no banking could be conducted. She escorted Singh out of the bank a second time and locked all of the doors. Singh attempted to get back in but the doors were locked.

Statement by [REDACTED] (Reporting Party 2-Citi [REDACTED])

[REDACTED] told me the same story as [REDACTED] and added at one point it looked as if Singh had a bow and arrow, but later saw it was a plastic toy.

Officer Hedges obtained witness statements. See his Supplemental Report for details of their statements.

Officer Injuries

Officer Hense was taken to US HealthWorks/Urgent Care for a medical evaluation. See his supplemental report for details of his injuries.

Officer Wagner was taken to Orange County Global Medical Center for evaluation. See his supplemental report for details of his injuries.

I was taken to Orange County Global Medical Center for evaluation for back, groin and hamstring pain. A CT scan showed no fractures. I also sustained abrasions and bruising to knees and elbows.

PSO Giddings photographed the scene and injuries to both officers and Singh. See his supplemental report for details.

Singh's Acura was towed per CVC 22361(h)-DRIVER ARRESTED. Officer Villarreal conducted an inventory search of the Acura and located a methamphetamine pipe in the center console glove box. See Officer Villarreal's supplemental report for details of his findings. I later booked the meth pipe into TPD Property as evidence.

CONCLUSION: Singh was arrested for the following charges:

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Based on Singh's extreme agitated state I was unable to conduct a Drug Influence Evaluation and unable to get a response from him regarding his understanding of his rights.

At Orange County Global Medical Center Blood Technician Vega withdrew a blood sample from Singh and retained it as evidence.

At the time this report was written Singh was still waiting to be medically cleared for booking. Once cleared he will be transported to Orange County Jail where he will be booked on the following charges:

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148(d) P.C. ATTEMPT TO REMOVE A POLICE OFFICER'S GUN

On Wednesday, August 10, 2017 at 1430 hours I received a radio call to assist Officer Breeze with a suspicious man at Citibank, 18232 Irvine Boulevard. The male, later identified as Singh was crying inside the bank and acting very strangely possibly under the influence of drugs. Upon arrival I saw Officers Hense, Wagner, and Breeze were out with Singh in front of the bank. Singh was sitting on the ground. Singh was extremely sweaty, talking very fast and seemed agitated. These are all symptoms of being under the influence and I believed that he was. Officers at the scene had it stabilized, so I left.

At 1457 hours Officer Breeze transmitted over her police radio that the suspect was fighting and they need officers Code 3 (lights and sirens) to respond. I drove Code 3 from First Street and B Street and was the first unit to arrive to assist them.

When I arrived I saw all three officers on the ground fighting Singh in the middle of the parking lot approximately 20 yards from where I had last seen them. Singh was laying on his stomach. Officer Hense was on his knees on the right side of Singh striking Singh in the back with his collapsible baton. Officer Wagner and Breeze were around Singh's lower body. I ran up and saw Singh had both arms under his body and no one had control of them. Singh was attempting to push up off the ground and get back on his feet. Officer Hense and Wagner were drenched in sweat and I could hear one of them breathing heavily. I could hear the Taser being deployed and it was not having any effect of Singh. I struck Singh with my right knee in his lower back to keep in on the ground so I could better control his movements and prevent him from standing back up and gaining a position of advantage. This strike had no effect on Singh.

I laid down on top of Singh upper back and put my right arm under his chin. I attempted to use a carotid restraint hold on Singh. Singh was screaming and at

one time hit my chin with the back of his head, head-butting me. I started to apply the hold and Singh began to choke. I realized I did not have my arm in the right position so I repositioned it and applied it again. Singh momentarily stopped fighting, so I figured the restraint had worked. I knew I had a short window in which to gain control of his right arm and pull it out from underneath his body. I released Singh's neck and started to reach for his right arm. Singh immediately pulled his right hand out and I saw there was a hand cuff already on it. Singh had not lost consciousness and I had misjudged the effectiveness of the carotid restraint hold. Singh pushed himself off the ground. I weigh approximately 230 pound with all my equipment on and Officer Wagner and Hense weigh about the same for a combined weight of over 600 pounds. Singh lifted himself up with us on his back approximately 4 inches. Singh was exhibiting extraordinary strength which I believed was caused by the drugs he had used. Both of Singh's hands were free and the one I had seen had a handcuff on it that could be used as a weapon. I saw there was an extended collapsible baton on the ground to the side of me. There was a hand cuff key on the ground next to the baton. My sunglasses had been knocked off my face and were broken on the ground on the left side of Singh's head.

I knew Officers Hense, Wagner and Breeze had been fighting Singh for several minutes and were exhausted. I did not have time to try and reapply the carotid restraint and I had not been able to use it effectively to this point, so I controlled Singh's head with my left arm and struck him approximately three times in the face with my right closed fist. Singh fell back down to the ground and I grabbed his right wrist to prevent him from using it. Other officers arrived and combined we were able to gain control of Singh. I moved over to Singh's left side and helped secure his left hand. I saw Singh already had two sets of handcuffs on his left wrist. We successfully hand cuffed Singh and I had other officers stand by with him while I checked on Officer Wagner who was injured in the fight.

I had small scrapes on my right middle finger, ring finger and pinky which were bleeding. I had a small scrape on my left cheek that was bleeding, my left pinky had a small scrape and my right knee had a silver dollar size scrape on it. P.S.O. Giddings took photographs of my injuries and I treated them at the scene.

I drove Officer Wagner to O.C. Global hospital to have his left knee treated.

At the hospital I had to assist officers and hospital staff in restraining Singh who continued to resist us and fight even though he had been restrained to the hospital gurney. I left the hospital at 1820 hours.

SUSPECT: SINGH, MANINDER [REDACTED]

NARRATIVE:

On 08/09/17, I was on uniformed patrol driving a marked TPD Dodge Charger (unit 807). As a patrol officer in a marked car, I was wearing a navy blue short sleeve uniform. On the left side of my chest was a silver badge bearing the words, "Police Officer" over the words "Tustin Police" around the City of Tustin seal. On the right side of my chest was my silver and black name tag with the name, "C. Hense." On each shoulder was a black and silver patch with the word "Tustin" across the top, and "Police" across the bottom. I was wearing a standard issue Sam Browne style duty belt with a firearm, Taser X26 (EMDT), radio, and a collapsible baton.

At approximately 1432 hours I was dispatched to the Citi Bank at 18232 Irvine Blvd, for a call of service regarding a suspicious person possibly under the influence of drugs. Upon arrival, I observed Officer Wagner with Singh, Maninder (DOB: [REDACTED]), who verbally identified himself. Singh was sitting on his butt with both arms excited out to his side.

Upon contacting Singh, I observed that he was emotionally distraught and he stated he was "scared." Singh stated he was lost and was unsure where he was, indicating he was from [REDACTED]. I asked Singh if Officer Wagner could search him and he gave him consent. During the search, I observed Singh displayed several objective symptoms of being under the influence of a controlled substance. Singh had difficulty sitting still, his speech was rapid, and he made random unrecognizable comments. As Officer Wagner searched Singh, I observed his muscle tone was rigid. His fingers and hands were twitching regularly and involuntarily. Singh's mouth was dry, and his lips were chapped. Singh continually had trouble focusing and could not follow simple directions.

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Officer Wagner and I questioned Singh and became emotionally distraught, crying about his girlfriend breaking up with him. Singh would then refocus and ask officers for life advice. While we spoke to Singh, Officer Breeze conducted a consent search of Singh's vehicle, which was parked in the Citi Banks south end parking lot.

Officer Breeze returned from searching the vehicle and began question Singh about credit cards she located in his vehicle. Singh admitted to using an unknown person credit card to purchase gas for his vehicle. Officer Breeze advised Singh that this was a crime and to place his hands behind his back. Singh placed his hands behind his back and Officer Breeze handcuffed his right wrist. After hand cuffing his right wrist, Officer Breeze advised Officer Wagner and I, she would be readjusting the handcuff.

At this time, I felt Singh begin to tense up and I grabbed his left wrist and placed it into a control hold behind his back. Officer Wagner stood in front of Singh holding the back of his head and neck. Singh repeatedly said, "I didn't do anything, please let me go." As Officer Breeze adjusted the right handcuff Singh stood up quickly. I took control of his left arm, and Officer Wagner took control of his right arm. When Singh stood he backed into Officer Breeze knocking her to the ground in front of the entrance to Citi Bank. At this time, Officer Breeze requested Code 3 (Lights and Sirens) back up to our location.

Officer Wagner and I directed Singh to get on the ground and stop resisting, and he did not comply. Officer Wagner and I failed to gain control of Singh. Officer Wagner grabbed Singh at the waist and took him to the ground. I repositioned myself on the right side of Singh and attempted to gain control of his right wrist and arm, which still had a handcuff on it.

While Officer Wagner was on his back lower back, I repositioned myself to be on Singh's upper torso and placed all of my weight on top of him. Officer Wagner and

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I weigh approximately 230 pounds. With our full weight on Singh, he stood up and began to walk to the parking lot east of Citi Bank. I advised dispatch that Singh was still fighting.

I attempted numerous control holds, which failed to work on Singh. At some point in the physical altercation, I ended up on top of Singh as Officer Wagner was underneath him. I began to strike Singh in his left ribcage area. Singh rolled to the left side of his body, and reached for my gun using his right hand. I observed the hood of my gun holster was in the forward position, exposing my firearm. Singh was grabbing the handle of my firearm attempting to pull it from the holster. I advised Officers that Singh was attempting to gain access to my firearm by saying "He's going for my gun!" I grabbed Singh's right hand pushed it off of my gun. I began to punch Singh in the ribcage area, approximately 4-7 times, which continued to still be ineffective. Officer Breeze attempted to dry stun Singh using her Taser X26, and it was immediately ineffective.

Singh was now on his left side, and I accessed my collapsible baton. I gave approximately 2-3 strikes to the back and rib cage of Singh. Officer Turner and Officer Valencia arrived on scene and with gaining control of Singh. I continued to control Singh's right arm and lower body. Officer Laurich took my position and controlled Singh's right wrist. I continued to place all my body weight on to Singh and hold his body down on the ground. During this time, I attempted to dry stun Singh in the lower back using my Taser X26, which was ineffective. Several officers arrived and assisted me using a hobble restraint to restrain Singh's feet. After approximately 5-7 minutes and 7-10 officers, Singh was taken into custody.

Based on my training and experience, I believe Singh was under the influence of controlled substance do to his abnormal strength and not feeling pain. During the incident, I felt like I was in a fight for my life. I believed this was a situation where I was going to use lethal force to survive; due to the proximity of Officers Breeze and Wagner, I did not use lethal force.

NARRATIVE: On 08/09/17, I was on uniformed patrol driving a marked TPD Dodge Charger (unit 822). At approximately 1432 hours I was dispatched to the Citi Bank at 18232 Irvine Blvd, for a call of service regarding a suspicious person possibly under the influence of drugs.

Upon arrival I saw the suspect standing in front of the south doors of the Citi bank. I was the first officer on scene, so I made contact with the suspect (later identified as Maninder Singh). I had Singh have a seat on the sidewalk against the wall, next to the doors. Singh had a hard time understanding simple directions to sit down flat on the concrete sidewalk. Singh told me that he was lost and did not know how he got to where he was at. Singh told me he is from [REDACTED] and was inside the bank because he needed change for his money. Once Officer Hense arrived I asked Singh if I could search him and he gave me consent to do so. I had Singh sit down on the sidewalk against the wall of the bank. Again Singh had a hard time understanding simple directions to sit flat on the concrete sidewalk.

While asking Singh questions regarding why he was in Tustin Singh appeared emotionally disturbed and began crying about his girlfriend breaking up with him. Singh stated he was lost and did not know how to get back to [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. I continued to talk to Singh while Officer Breeze went to Singh's vehicle which was parked in the Citi Banks south end parking lot.

Officer Breeze came back to where we were on the sidewalk to question Singh regarding credit cards she found that were not in Singh's name. Officer Breeze told Singh she was placing him under arrest. Officer Breeze attempted to place handcuffs on Singh, starting with his right wrist. Singh began to get agitated at which time Officer Hense held Singh's left arm while I stood in front of Singh gently holding the back of his head and neck. Singh repeatedly said "I didn't doing anything, please let me go."

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At some point when Officer Breeze was attempting to place the handcuffs on Singh he tensed up and quickly stood up onto his feet. I saw Officer Breeze fall backwards onto her back towards the Citi Banks South doors. Singh would not get on the ground and stop resisting after several commands by myself and Officer Hense. After struggling to gain control of Singh I reached around Singh's hips and his lower body in an attempt to take him down to the ground. At some point when we went off the concrete sidewalk onto the asphalt parking lot I felt and heard a pop in my left knee.

Singh continued to fight and had the strength to pick Officer Hense and me up off the ground where we struggled and ended up again fighting in the east parking lot of the Citi Bank. During the struggle in the parking lot I again saw Officer Breeze get thrown back towards parked vehicles in the parking lot. I attempted numerous control holds on Singh in attempt to gain control of him. At some point in the physical altercation I ended up on my back with Singh on top of me. I struck Singh several times in order to get out from under him. I heard Officer Hense say "He's going for my gun!" At this point I felt I was now fighting for mine and my partner's lives. Using my right hand I struck Singh numerous times in his left rib cage area and thigh area. Singh Continued to fight and attempt to stand up.

Officer Turner and Officer Valencia arrived on scene and assisted Officer Hense and I with gaining control of Singh. Singh had the strength to push up off the ground with four officers trying to gain control of him. I sat over Singh's lower body where I handcuffed Singh's left wrist and continued to hold Singh's body down, while officers behind me used a hobble restraint to restrain Singh's feet in his attempt to use his legs to kick or stand up.

Singh was taken into custody without further incident.

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With my training and experience I believe Singh was under the influence of methamphetamines do to his strength and ability to not feel pain.

Singh was evaluated and treated at the scene by Orange County Fire Authority and transported to OC Global Hospital for further evaluation.

Supplemental Narrative

On Wednesday, 8/9/17, Officer Casiello and I were working a two man unit. At approximately 1458 hours, while at a traffic stop, dispatch advised officers were in a fight with a suspect, later identified as, Maninder Singh, located at 18232 Irvine Blvd. (Citi Bank).

Upon arrival, Officer Casiello and I assisted officers in handcuffing Singh. While attempting to place my handcuff on Singh, he was tightening his muscles to prevent me from placing handcuffs on him. After a couple of minutes, I was able to place him in handcuffs while other officers held his feet and arms. Singh was placed in a hobble and was subsequently placed on his side with his left shoulders on the ground while waiting for Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) to arrive on scene and treat him for his injuries.

At approximately 1503 hours, OCFA arrived on scene and Singh was subsequently transported to Orange County Global (OCG) hospital to be treated for his injuries. Due to Singh's aggressive behavior, I sat in the back of the ambulance to monitor Singh. Singh was successfully strapped to the hospital bed at OCG. Officer Valencia arrived on scene and remained with Singh at OCG.

Narrative

On Wednesday (08-09-17) at approximately 1430 hours I was working uniformed patrol in a marked police unit (#800). Officer Breeze, Officer Wagner and Officer Hense responded to a welfare check at Citibank, 18232 Irvine Boulevard.

For details of the original investigation, refer to Officer Breeze's report.

At approximately 1458 hours I heard via radio that the suspect was fighting with the officers. Other Police Officers responded with emergency lights and sirens (code-3) to assist. I also began driving in that direction. While I was in route, I heard via radio that the suspect was still fighting with the officers. I then activated the emergency lights and siren to assist.

When I arrived I located a group of officers who were actively struggling to get control of a male suspect, later identified as being MANINDER SINGH. I noted SINGH was not cooperating and the officers seemed to be having a difficult time restraining him in handcuffs.

I ran over to the group to assist. I saw a TASER was lying on the ground, near the group. I saw Officer Breeze was lying on top of SINGH's legs, trying to apply a department issued leg restraint. Officer Breeze had a cut on her right elbow and it was bleeding. Officer Breeze's radio had apparently come loose in the struggle and the wires were also wrapped around SINGH's legs.

I helped remove Officer Breeze's radio wires and I took over securing the hobble to SINGH's legs. I then moved SINGH's feet toward his buttocks and I secured the end of the hobble to some handcuffs that had been applied.

After SINGH's legs and hands were secured, the officers rolled him over onto his side so that he could maintain an open airway. I began talking with SINGH, trying to gain his cooperation and calm him down. SINGH was making random statements and he continued trying to get free from the handcuffs and the leg restraints.

Paramedics from the Orange County Fire Authority arrived at the scene. They evaluated and treated SINGH's injuries, along with injuries to various Police Officers.

Narrative

Throughout the course of this investigation, I was wearing my Tustin PD Body Worn Camera (BWC). This report is based on my independent recollection, without review of the BWC footage associated with this incident. The following interviews are summaries of statements given to me by the parties and/or witnesses involved in this incident. They are not intended to be verbatim unless otherwise indicated by quotation marks. Statements made that are not pertinent to this report have been omitted.

On 080917 at approximately 1430 hours, I was working uniformed patrol on a marked black and white police motorcycle when I responded from the Tustin Police Department to Citi Bank (18232 Irvine Boulevard) reference an officer needs assistance radio transmission. Officers who were already on scene radioed they needed assistance with a subject they were out with.

Upon my arrival, I saw numerous officers were already on scene assisting. I saw two (2) male subjects standing in the parking lot to the west of Citi Bank watching. I approached the subjects and saw one of the unknown subjects appeared to be filming the incident on his cell phone. I asked them if either of them witnessed the incident and the other subject later identified as ██████████ said he did. While talking with ██████████ the other subject walked away and didn't appear to want to speak with me.

██████████ told me the following:

██████████ said he exited Kohl's and was walking towards his vehicle (A black Mercedes sedan) which was parked near Citi Bank when he heard general screaming. ██████████ saw two marked police cars near Citi Bank. He also saw two (2) male police officers and a female police officer with a subject, who he later positively identified to me as the suspect who was handcuffed in the parking lot south of Citi Bank with other officers near him. ██████████ said he could clearly see the officers had a uniform and belt on and were indeed police officers. ██████████ said he walked towards his vehicle and saw the officers trying to control the suspect with their hands and they appeared they were trying to arrest him all while near the tree on the southwest corner of Citi Bank. The suspect was "aggressive" while pushing the officers hard and he told them to "Fuck off." ██████████ said the suspect fought them near the tree for approximately three (3) minutes and then they went into the parking lot south of Citi Bank. While in the parking lot the suspect fell to the ground and the officers stayed with him. ██████████ said another vehicle pulled in front of him and parked blocking his view of the officers and suspect. Then additional police cars arrived on scene and parked in front of him. ██████████ said he didn't see what took place after his view was blocked but he could still hear screaming and sirens.

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During the incident [REDACTED] heard the officers tell the suspect to "Stop it," "Don't do it," and "Stay here." He said the officers were trying to control the suspect all while the suspect was using a lot of force.

[REDACTED] said he didn't see an officer hit, punch, or kick the suspect or use impact weapons, a Taser or their guns on the suspect nor did they use any foul language. He said the officers were just using their hands and were trying to gain control of the suspect.

I request this report be included with Officer Breeze's Original Report.

Inside the pipe I was able to see a white milky substance that lined the interior of the pipe, and i formed the opinion the pipe had been used to smoke meth.

I collected the meth pipe and later gave it to Officer Breeze, where she later booked it into TPD property as evidence.

NARRATIVE

On 08-10-17 at approximately 0700 hours, Sgt. J. CARTWRIGHT #718 requested I process evidence for this case. I made contact with Officer C. HENSE #1309 who told me the following:





CASE SUMMARY:

On 08/09/2017, Officers were involved in a physical fight with a suspect who resisted arrest and attempted to disarm officers. The fight lead to three officers being taken to medical facilities for treatment. I contacted all three officers two days after the altercation.

VICTIM FOLLOW UP:

I contacted Officer Breeze over the phone on 08/11/2017. Officer Breeze has been off work since this incident occurred on 08/09/2017. She was transported to Orange County Global Hospital in Santa Ana. She sustained contusions all over her body from the fight with the suspect. She has a pulled groin muscle, neck pain, and an aggravated acute bulged disk. She can't kneel down to the pain in both knees. Her knees make popping noises when bent. She has been unable to enjoy her normal lifestyle on her regular days off due to the pain caused by this incident. On 08/14/2017, she will reassess her injuries and return to the doctor if necessary.

On 08/11/2017 I contacted Officer Wagner over the phone. Officer Wagner was transported to Orange County Global Hospital after the altercation with the suspect. He sustained several injuries as a result of the suspect's actions. During the fight, he heard a loud popping noise in his

left knee and felt extreme pain. He sustained several cuts all over his body, which have since turned to bruising. His uniform was also destroyed during the incident, and he received burns from the hot pavement. He received an x-ray which didn't show the source of the injury. He is currently awaiting an MRI. Officer Wagner is currently off work, and does not have a return date. He is unable to work because he needs crutches to walk, and he is wearing a brace on his left knee. The injuries he sustained have severally affected his regular days off, normal activities and routine.

On 08/11/2017 I contacted Officer Hense over the phone. Officer Hense was transported to US HealthWorks/Urgent Care for medical evaluation on 08/09/2017, as a direct result of the altercation with the suspect. After the altercations, his left hand was very swollen and numb. He had a tingling sensation in his fingers. He received a cut on his right temple and the inside of his lip. Both his knees have abrasions and burns from the hot pavement. His knuckles are cut and bruised, and he has continued back, hip and hamstring pain. The injuries sustained have prevented him from enjoying the activities he would normally partake in on his off duty time and caused him to change his routine.

On August 11, 2017, I spoke to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who told me she was a victim of a theft when she lost her Wells Fargo Debit Card [REDACTED] on Sunday August 11, 2017. She told me she called Wells Fargo to report the card lost or stolen and was told by Wells Fargo that her card had been used in California for the amount of \$10 Dollars. She had not used her card for this transaction and did not give anyone permission to use it. [REDACTED] is desirous of prosecution if a case is filed. It should be noted that she resides in [REDACTED] and was in [REDACTED] visiting and seemed a little unsure as to when her card was last used but she believed it was still in California not far from Santa Maria.

I contacted Wells Fargo and sent them an email via their Law Enforcement Liaison Unit and request the documentation of this transaction. This will have the location of the Gas Station where the card was used, time and date and I will then obtain any video surveillance they may have.

I spoke to a representative of PILOT FLYING J TRAVEL. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who requested I email him a formal request for information regarding the card found in the possession of MANINDER SINGH. He told me he would then research and forward me any documentation they had regarding this card and if it was lost or stolen and if it was used.

I sent [REDACTED] an email via my official Tustin Police email as requested.

I am a Detective with the Tustin Police Department and assigned to the Special Operations Division / General Investigations Unit. I have been assigned to review this case for the filing of possible criminal charges.

Case Summary:

Several officers contacted a subject at Citibank in Tustin. The contact led to a use of force against the subject and a subsequent arrest.

Follow up:

On 08-11-17, at approximately 1145 hours, I conducted follow up on this case. I drove to Citibank located at 18232 Irvine Blvd. in Tustin and inquired about their surveillance video. I spoke with the manager and she told me they do not have any surveillance video outside the bank. I looked at each camera angle from the cameras operating inside to see if they may have caught footage through a window. The cameras inside are not in a position to capture any footage through windows. The manager stated the male subject, identified as Maninder Singh, previously entered the business prior to the incident. I was told only the security team could access that footage and it would take a few days to contact someone to come in and secure the footage. I left a business card for them to contact me when the footage was ready. There were no other witnesses at the bank.

I next traveled across the parking to Kohl's, located at 18182 Irvine Blvd. in Tustin. Kohl's shares a common parking lot with Citibank and is approximately 100 yards to the east. I spoke with a Loss Prevention agent and she accessed the footage from the date and time of the incident. They did not have any cameras which captured any footage of the incident.

I returned to TPD and Detective Newton asked me to follow up with a female subject who called several hours after the incident to complain. Tustin PSO Kenan stated she received a call from an unknown female subject on 08-09-17, at approximately 1800 hours, at the front desk of TPD. PSO Kenan stated the female called only to express her concerns. The female refused to identify herself and did not wish to speak to anyone else. The Caller ID at the front desk shows the phone number was blocked.

I request this report be forwarded to the Orange County District Attorney's Office for further review.

An Administrative Review has been completed concerning the use of force that you were involved in on August 9, 2017. After a preliminary review of this incident, it is the opinion of this Department that your actions were **within policy**; however, there will be a mandatory debrief scheduled at a later date.

Officers Wagner, Breeze and Hense responded to a call of a male subject acting unusual inside the Citibank at 18232 Irvine Blvd. During the contact Officer Breeze developed probable cause to arrest the subject. While the suspect remained seated Officer Breeze placed a handcuff on his right hand and while attempting to adjust it the suspect became combative. He threw Officer Breeze to the ground and violently resisted both Officers Wagner and Hense. The suspect attempted to remove Officer Hense's service firearm from his holster. Officer Breeze applied her Taser in drive stun mode without a cartridge multiple times to the suspect with no effect.

Officer Hense was thrown off the suspect and deployed his baton and struck the suspect in the back. However, the strikes were ineffective. Both Officers Breeze and Hense attempted to subdue the suspect again using their Tasers in drive stun mode (without cartridges), however, these attempts were also ineffective. Officer Turner arrived on scene and applied the carotid restraint to the suspect. Officer Turner felt the suspect relax and assumed the suspect had been rendered temporarily unconscious. Once Officer Turner released the carotid restraint, the suspect immediately began to resume his assaultive behavior.

All the force options used on the suspect to this point were ineffective, so officers Wagner, Turner and Hense then began striking the suspect in the head and body in an attempt to gain his compliance. Ultimately, the suspect was taken into custody restrained by both handcuffs and hobble. The suspect received burns from the hot asphalt during the altercation which required hospitalization. These burns were unavoidable since the officers involved had no control of the suspect and were unable to relocate him to a safer area during the altercation.

The suspect in this case was attempting to harm or kill officers as was exhibited by his vicious assault and attempt to access Officer Hense's firearm. The officers involved in this arrest were in an extended altercation which could have clearly resulted in deadly force. The use of control holds, strikes and the CEW were necessary to effect the arrest and were within the scope of TPD arrest and control training. Furthermore, this specific use of force incident highlights the need for further emphasis in the PEP capture technique to prevent a suspect from standing up while attempting to effect the arrest and could reduce the amount of force needed to gain compliance.

Training points:

In this incident Officer Breeze and Hense both removed the Taser tips to apply drive stun pain compliance to the suspect. Pain compliance in this situation was ineffective and clearly no longer a viable option. Drive stun mode without a Taser tip is not taught currently in Taser training, as it does not incapacitate suspects. The proper technique is to leave the Taser tip on and deploy the barbs into the resistive suspect and then complete the circuit by moving the Taser, applying the tip to a portion of the body a distance from where the barbs are imbedded to effectively restrict a large muscle group.

The handcuffing technique used in this situation put the officer at a disadvantage. The

officer had to lean over the suspect to access his hands which were in the small of his back, causing her to be off balance. A better technique which is trained in arrest and control would be to have the suspect place his hands on his head and cuff from this position which would have allowed for a more stable platform.

SUMMARY

On 08/09/2017, at approximately 1430 hours, Officers Wagner and Breeze responded to a male subject (Singh) crying inside the Citibank branch, located at 18232 Irvine Blvd. Singh was seen by employees carrying a bow and arrow. Officer Wagner contacted Singh and he was initially cooperative. During Officer Breeze's investigation, Officer Hense arrived. Officer Breeze determined Singh was in possession of credit cards that did not belong to him. When Officer Breeze attempted to handcuff Singh, he stood up and resisted arrest. As Singh was actively resisting and struggling with the officers, he reached for Officer Hense's gun and was able to open the hood on top of Officer Hense's holster. Officers Hense and Breeze deployed their Taser EMDT devices in drive stun mode. Officer Hense struck Singh with his collapsible baton and his fist, but the strikes were ineffective. Officer Turner arrived and struck Singh in the face with a closed fist. Upon the arrival of Officers Laurich and Valencia, Singh was handcuffed and taken into custody.

INVESTIGATION

Officers Wagner and Breeze were dispatched to the Citibank, located at 18232 Irvine Blvd., regarding a subject (Singh) crying inside the bank branch. The initial call indicated employees of the bank believed the subject was either under the influence of a controlled substance or he was suffering from some type of mental health issue. Singh was seen by employees carrying something resembling a bow and arrow.

Officer Wagner located Singh near the west entrance to the Citibank. Singh was initially cooperative with Officer Wagner and sat down on the concrete sidewalk in front of the business. When Officer Wagner asked Singh to sit down, Singh was holding a small flashlight and several credit cards. Officer Wagner asked Singh to set those items down on a nearby pillar. During his contact, Officer Wagner verbally obtained Singh's identifying information. During the contact, Officers Turner and Valencia arrived.

Officer Breeze arrived and began an investigation into Singh's behavior and activities at the bank. During her investigation, Officer Breeze determined the credit cards in Singh's possession were not in his name. During continued questioning by Officer Breeze, Singh admitted to finding one of the credit cards at a gas station. Singh said he did not have money for gas and admitted to charging \$10.00 in gasoline to one of the credit cards. Singh admitted he did not know the owner of the card, nor did he have permission to use it.

At that time, Officer Breeze told Singh to lean forward and place his hands behind his back. Singh complied and as Officer Breeze placed the first handcuff on his right wrist. Singh was still in a seated position at that time. At the time she was placing the handcuffs on Singh, Officer Breeze told him that possession of the credit card was a violation of the

law. Singh began getting emotional, saying, "Please, don't do to me like that." As Singh became increasingly emotional and tensed up his arms, Officer Breeze admonished Singh not to fight. Before cuffing Singh's left wrist, Officer Breeze attempted to adjust the right cuff. However, Singh did not comply and while Officer Breeze was adjusting the cuff, he stood up, pulling his arms out from behind his back. When Singh stood up, Officer Breeze was thrown backwards, causing pain to her right knee.

As Singh continued fighting and attempted to flee towards the asphalt paved parking lot, Officer Hense yelled at Singh to "Get on the ground." However, Singh still did not comply and continued walking towards the parking lot, dragging the full weight of Officers Wagner and Hense with him. Officer Wagner had grabbed Singh around the waist with both arms, but was unable to force him to the ground. As Officers Wagner and Hense got Singh to the ground in the parking lot, Officer Breeze was again knocked backwards by Singh and onto her back in the parking lot.

Officer Breeze recovered and deployed her Taser device in the drive-stun mode. As Singh continued fighting, he still had Officer Breeze's handcuff on his right wrist with the second handcuff loose, with the single strand exposed and dangling. Officer Breeze's attempts to deploy the Taser in the drive stun mode were not successful in incapacitating Singh.

At about the same time Officer Breeze was attempting to use her Taser, Officer Hense, who had also fallen to the ground, expanded his collapsible baton and struck Singh across the back. Singh continued to fight with the officers despite several orders from Officers Hense and Breeze to stop fighting and put his hands behind his back. Singh continued to struggle and at one point grabbed Officer Hense's holstered pistol. Officer Breeze and Officer Hense both attempted several more drive-stuns with their Tasers, but the deployments were not effective.

Officer Turner arrived approximately three minutes into the fight and attempted to use the carotid restraint on Singh. Officer Turner heard Singh begin to choke. Realizing he had not correctly applied the carotid restraint, Officer Turner disengaged, adjusted his arm position, and reapplied the carotid restraint. When Officer Turner felt Singh relax for a moment, he believed he carotid restraint had been effective. Officer Turner released the carotid restraint, but Singh began fighting again. At this point in the fight, the officers were winded and having difficulty finding a force method to overcome Singh's strength and continued resistance.

Following Officer Turner's application of the carotid restraint and Singh's continued resistance, Officer Breeze again attempted to use the Taser drive-stun to force Singh to comply. This was still not effective. Officer Breeze, who was holding Singh's legs, was able to use a RIPP hobble to restrain Singh's legs. After the collapsible baton, Taser drive-stun, and carotid restraint had been ineffective, Officers Hense, Wagner, and Turner

resorted to head and body punches to attempt to gain compliance. Within approximately one minute, Officers Valencia and Laurich arrived at about this same time to assist. At that time, officers were able to handcuff Singh and get him into custody. Singh was arrested for the following charges:

- PC 148(d) – ATTEMPTED REMOVAL OF A PEACE OFFICER’S FIREARM
- PC 69 – RESIST A PEACE OFFICER BY FORCE OR VIOLENCE
- PC 241(c) – ASSAULT ON A PEACE OFFICER
- PC 241(b) – BATTERY ON A PEACE OFFICER
- PC 148(a)(1) – RESIST, OBSTRUCT, OR DELAY A PEACE OFFICER
- PC 485 – MISAPPROPRIATION OF FOUND PROPERTY
- HS 11550(a) – UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE

When I arrived at the scene, Singh was still fighting with officers and his right hand was not controlled. I saw the loose handcuff on Singh’s right uncontrolled wrist. Identifying that as an immediate threat, I assisted in getting Singh’s hand behind his back and handcuffing his wrists. After Singh was handcuffed, he was placed in the recovery position and treated by OCFA Paramedics. Additional officers were arriving at the scene and took custody of Singh.

After being successfully arrested, Singh was evaluated by Orange County Fire Authority Paramedics and transported to Orange County Global Medical Center for treatment. Prior to Singh’s transport to the hospital, I noted he did not appear to have any marks to his body from the drive-stun Taser deployments. He had bruising and swelling to his face, consistent with the punches administered by the involved officers. I instructed PSO Giddings to photograph the injuries to the suspect and any injured officer (See attachments 19 – 23).

I noticed Officer Breeze was bleeding from her right elbow and Officer Wagner was limping and holding his left knee. Officer Wagner’s uniform was also torn and his name tag was missing. I noticed two male subjects were approximately 50 yards west of the location of the fight. One of the subjects appeared to be using a cell phone camera to videotape the incident. Officer Hedges had arrived at the scene to assist. I asked Officer Hedges to obtain the information of both witnesses. However, as Officer Hedges approached the witnesses, the subject who had been holding his cell phone turned and walked away. After ensuring all of the injured officers were assisted by OCFA, I walked to where Officer Hedges was speaking with the remaining witness.

I spoke with the witness, [REDACTED]. My conversation with [REDACTED] was recorded on my body worn camera (see attachment #9). [REDACTED] said he exited the Kohl’s store in the parking lot west of the Citibank. [REDACTED] heard someone screaming and saw what appeared to be police officers trying to handcuff someone. He said it was clear the subject was trying to get away because he was pushing the officers. [REDACTED] said the female officer

(Breeze) was pushed to the ground by the subject. ██████ said he did not see the officers punch the subject, but it appeared the subject was kicking the officers and still fleeing. ██████ told me he works as a security guard in his regular job. He said normally he sees officers come to detain someone and they cooperate. ██████ said he typically sees a subject flee from officers if they do not comply. However, in this case the subject did not appear to be fleeing, but was actually fighting with the officers. When I asked, ██████ said he did not see officers use any “tools” or other force options against the subject. He said when the additional officers arrived in police cars, they blocked his view of the incident. I asked ██████ if he could hear anything the subject or officers were saying, but he said he could not. When I asked, ██████ told me that from all the way across the parking lot, it was clear the people fighting with the subject were police officers. ██████ said this was clear because they were wearing uniforms with gun belts and badges. Also, all of the cars parked in the immediate area were black and white police cars.

Following the incident, Sergeant Cartwright attempted to obtain a statement from Singh. Singh was clearly under the influence of a controlled substance and was not responsive to Sergeant Cartwright’s questions. The day after the incident, on 08/10/2017, Sergeant Cartwright and I responded to Orange County Global Medical Center. The nursing staff said Singh had been responsive to questions throughout the day and he appeared to be coherent. I attempted to interview Singh on my body worn camera. When I identified myself and asked Singh if he wanted to talk to me, he made a grumbling noise. I asked him several times to open his eyes and talk to me, but he refused. I then asked Singh if he remembered when the officers came and talked to him the day before, at the Citibank building. Singh did not respond verbally, but shook his head back and forth to the left and right. I then asked Singh if he remembered going to the Citibank the day prior. Singh still shook his head left and right. I determined Singh either was refusing to speak with me or did not recall the incident. At that time, I discontinued my attempts to interview him regarding the incident.

I reviewed the in-car video and body worn camera footage from all of the officers at the scene. None of the in-car video captured the incident. However, body worn camera footage was obtained from Officers Wagner, Breeze, and Hense. The body worn camera footage is consistent with the officers’ written reports of the incident.

I reviewed Officer Valencia’s in-car video, but there was no body worn camera recording of the incident. In speaking with Officer Valencia, he said he activated his lights and siren while responding to the call. Officer Valencia believed his body worn camera would activate in conjunction with his in-car video, as it did during his MAVS test at the beginning of the shift and on calls throughout the day. At the conclusion of the incident, Officer Valencia examined his cameras and found the in-car video had activated properly, but the body worn camera had not activated. I reviewed Officer Valencia’s MAVS recordings from earlier in the day, including his MAVS test at the beginning of the shift, and found his statements to be consistent.

I reviewed Officer Hense's in-car video and body worn camera recordings. During the incident, Officer Hense's camera shows him arriving on-scene and making contact with the subject and other officers. At the time of the recording, Officer Hense's body worn camera was running and Singh was still cooperative. Approximately 21 minutes into the recording, Officer Hense's hand can be seen reaching down and shutting the camera off. When I asked Officer Hense about this, he told me he thought his camera was off, and as the subject began to appear increasingly less cooperative, Officer Hense reached down to ensure his camera was turned on. Officer Hense said when he reviewed his camera footage later, in fact the opposite was true. He had mistakenly turned his body worn camera off, when it was already on.

During the initial inquiry and after review of the body worn camera recordings, I spoke with Officer Wagner regarding the force options he used on the subject. In reviewing Officer Wagner's report and speaking with him in-person, he said he could tell himself and all of the officers were becoming increasingly fatigued fighting Singh. Officer Wagner said he struck Singh in the abdomen and rib cage areas with a closed fist an unknown number of times. Based on Officer Wagner's statement, I made indications of the approximate impact points on the attached anatomical drawing.

I then spoke with Officer Hense, who told me he had removed the Taser cartridge from his Taser and attempted two drive stuns to the legs. Officer Hense said that had not worked, so he used his collapsible baton and struck Singh twice across the abdomen (this was confirmed by Officer Wagner's body worn camera footage, see attachment #3). When the baton strikes did not work, Officer Hense said he struck Singh with a closed fist approximately three times in the abdomen.

I then reviewed Officer Turner's report, along with his in-car and body worn camera videos. Officer Turner's in-car video was recording, but did not capture the incident. Officer Turner did not have a corresponding body worn camera video that uploaded to the Watchguard system. In speaking with Officer Turner, he stated the battery on his body worn camera had died just before the incident. Officer Turner was not driving a Watchguard equipped patrol car the day of the incident and he said he did not have an opportunity to return to the station to charge his body worn camera.

Sergeant Havourd downloaded the printouts for the Tasers issued to Officers Hense and Breeze (see attachments #1 and #2). Officer Breeze's Taser printout showed she activated the Taser by pulling the trigger at 15:47:43, 15:48:12, 15:48:21, and 15:48:31 hours. Each of the four Taser activations lasted five seconds. Officer Hense's Taser printout showed he activated the Taser by pulling the trigger at 15:44:14 and 15:44:22 hours. Each of the two Taser activations lasted five seconds. The Taser printouts were consistent with the reports and statements provided by Officers Hense and Breeze.

Copies of the relevant in-car and body worn camera videos were burned to DVD by Records Supervisor Mendez. The original recordings were linked to this review and the DVD's were forwarded to PSD to be associated with this review.
